The following Address was presented to His Majesty on the occasion of the opening by Their Majesties, on Saturday, the 15th July, of the Homes for Officers' Widows and Daughters, at Queen Alexandra's Court, Wimbledon:—

To the King's and Queen's Most Excellent Majesties.

May it please Your Majesties,

I am deputed by the Committee especially appointed for this work to express our humble and grateful thanks to Your Majesties for Your gracious presence here this afternoon, to open these Homes for the Widows and Daughters of Your Majesty's Naval and Military Forces, who have been left with but scanty provision for their maintenance.

The great need for such Homes was little known or realized, when, five years ago, twelve ladies were temporarily provided for in apartments, rent free, in Chelsea, by a member of the Soldiers' and Sailors' Families Association and his friends.

The extension of the scheme, its present location, and the buildings now erected for sixty ladies and their families, is largely due to Your Majesties' never-failing sympathy and personal

support in everything connected with the well-being of all ranks of the Services.

Her Majesty—knowing the benefits already derived by the twelve ladies referred to, of their testimony to the relief to their very small incomes, from the payment of rent, rates, and taxes—most graciously devoted the Coronation Gift of ten thousand pounds, presented to Her Majesty by Mr. Lucas Tooth, to the extension of the scheme; as also, subsequently, making a grant of five thousand pounds from the balance of Her Majesty's private War Fund.

Further, through Her Majesty's interest, a sum of ten thousand pounds was obtained from the part balance of a Fund specially subscribed during the late War for the families of Officers.

With Her Majesty's support, and that of other contributors, we are glad to be able to inform Your Majesties that the buildings now erected, and the freehold property of three acres and a half on which they stand, have all been paid for, and that we start these Homes clear of any debt or liability, the upkeep being provided for by Annual Subscriptions, chiefly of Officers on the active and retired lists.

If evidence were wanted as to the necessity for such provision and the benefits conferred, it is found in the number of further applications (now over one hundred and daily increasing) for admission to the Homes, and Your Majesties' presence here this afternoon is not only a gracious recognition and approval of what, so far, we have been permitted, by God's help, to accomplish; but will also, we trust, be an incentive to others to come forward, either with laud, donations or subscriptions, to extend the scheme for the benefit to so many more, most of whom will otherwise pass the remainder of their years in surroundings of peculiar hardship for ladies of their position.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Bishopricks Act, 1878, and the Bishopricks of Southwark and Birmingham Act, 1904, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twentieth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Bishopricks Act, 1878, and the Bishopricks of Southwark and Birmingham Act, 1904, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the bishoprick of Southwark and for the re-arrangement of the boundaries of the contiguous dioceses of Canterbury and Rochester, and of the patronage belonging to the Sees of Canterbury and Rochester.

"Whereas by the seventh section of the said Bishopricks Act, 1878, it is enacted that whenever the certificate therein referred to shall have been given to Your Majesty by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England with respect to the endowment fund of any new bishoprick mentioned in the schedule to the said Act, we shall lay before Your Majesty in Council a scheme for all or any of the matters in relation to such new bishoprick which in the same section are mentioned.

"And whereas by the first section of the said Bishopricks of Southwark and Birmingham Act, 1904, it is enacted that, subject to the modifications set forth in the first schedule to the same Act the said Bishopricks Act, 1878, including the repealed portions thereof shall have effect for the purpose of the foundation of the new bishopricks of Southwark and Birmingham as if the second schedule to the said Bishopricks of Southwark and Birmingham Act, 1904, were substituted for the schedule to the said Bishopricks Act, 1878, and as if the last-mentioned Act had been passed at the date of the passing of the said Bishopricks of Southwark and Birmingham Act, 1904.

"And whereas the bishoprick of Southwark is one of the bishopricks mentioned in the said second schedule to the said Bishopricks of Southwark and Birmingham Act, 1904, and the said certificate was given by us with respect to the endowment fund of the said bishoprick of Southwark on the second day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five and thereupon by an Order of Your Majesty in Council of the twentieth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five, made in pursuance of the said Acts and reciting that such certificate had been so given as aforesaid which Order was published in the London Gazette on the twenty-first day of the same month of March and came into operation on the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and five (1) the bishoprick of Southwark was founded (2) the diocese of the said bishoprick was declared to consist of the rural deaneries of Greenwich, Lewisham, Woolwich, Battersea, Camberwell, Clapham, Dulwich (except the parishes within the urban district of Penge), Kennington, Lambeth, Newington, Southwark, Barnes, Beddington, Caterham, Godstone, Kingston, Reigate, Richmond, Streatham and Wandsworth, and of such other parishes as should be transferred to the diocese in pursuance of the said Bishopricks of Southwark and Birmingham Act 1904 (3) the parish church of Saint Saviour, Southwark (subject to the rights of the patron

and Incumbent thereof) was declared to be the cathedral church of the said bishoprick and (4) the Bishop of Southwark was constituted a body corporate and was invested with all such rights, privileges and jurisdictions as are possessed by any other Bishop in England and was subjected to the metropolitan jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Canterbury.

"And whereas (so far as their respective consents are necessary) the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Reverend John Reginald Bishop of Rochester, the Right Reverend Edward Stuart Bishop of Southwark, and the Right Reverend Huyshe Wolcott Bishop of Worcester do consent to this scheme and the several recommendations hereinafter contained in testimony whereof the Archbishop has hereto set his hand and archiepiscopal seal, and the said Bishops have respectively hereto set their hands and episcopal seals.

"Now therefore we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose as follows namely:—

"1. The diocese of Southwark shall consist of the rural deaneries of Greenwich Lewisham Woolwich Battersea Camberwell Clapham Dulwich (except the parishes within the urban district of Penge) Kennington Lambeth Newington Southwark Barnes Beddington Caterham Godstone Kingston Reigate Richmond Streatham and Wandsworth without the addition of any other parish or place.

"2. The boundaries of the dioceses of Canterbury and Rochester shall be re-arranged as follows that is to say:—

"The rural deaneries of East Dartford West Dartford North Malling South Malling Shoreham and Tonbridge and the parish of Allington (all now in the archdeaconry of Maidstone) shall be severed from the diocese of Canterbury and shall be included in and form part of the diocese of Rochester.

"3. The Bishop of Southwark for the time being shall, subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, have all such courts and officers and all such jurisdiction as were immediately before the said first day of May one thousand nine hundred and five possessed by the Bishop of Rochester within the area of the diocese of Southwark.

"4. All parishes ecclesiastical districts and other cures and places churches and chapels and all the clergy and others Your Majesty's subjects within the territories which by virtue of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council of the twentieth day of March one thousand nine hundred and five or of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this scheme have been or shall be severed from the diocese of Rochester or the diocese of Canterbury and respectively now constitute the diocese of Southwark or shall be included in the diocese of Rochester as aforesaid shall be exempted and released from all episcopal jurisdiction authority and control of the Bishop of the diocese in which the same were situate immediately before such severance and shall be under and subject to the episcopal jurisdiction authority and control of the Bishop of the diocese in which such territories now are or shall be so included as aforesaid and of the successors of such Bishop.

"5. Until a Dean and Chapter of and for the cathedral church of the bishoprick of Southwark shall have been created, the Bishop of Southwark may as to any and every matter with respect to which the confirmation or other agency of a Dean and Chapter is by law required for rendering effectual the action of a Bishop,

take action in such matter without such confirmation or agency, and his action so taken shall not for want of such confirmation or agency be ineffectual or invalid.

"6. During any and every vacancy in the See of Southwark, whether such vacancy shall happen before or after the creation of a Dean and Chapter of and for the cathedral church of the bishoprick of Southwark, the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being shall have the custody and be guardian of the spiritualities of the See of Southwark.

"7. The archidiaconal supervision of all the parishes ecclesiastical districts and other cures and places comprised within the diocese of Southwark and the archdeaconries respectively of Southwark and Kingston-on-Thames shall remain vested in and be with and in and be exercised by the Archdeacons of those archdeaconries respectively and the said Archdeacons shall be officers of the diocese of Southwark and shall not be subject to the episcopal jurisdiction of the Bishop of Rochester but shall be exclusively subject to the episcopal jurisdiction of the Bishop of Southwark and the archidiaconal dignities of the said Archdeacons shall be transferred from the cathedral church of Rochester to the cathedral church of the bishoprick of Southwark and all the endowments belonging to the said archdeaconries respectively shall continue to belong to the same notwithstanding the transfer of the said archdeaconries from the diocese of Rochester to the diocese of Southwark.

"8. The archidiaconal supervision of all the parishes ecclesiastical districts and other cures and places comprised within the diocese of Southwark other than those within the said archdeaconries of Southwark and Kingston-on-Thames shall become vested in and be with and in and be exercised by the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Southwark.

"9. The archidiaconal supervision of the six rural deaneries of East Dartford, West Dartford, North Malling, South Malling, Shoreham, and Tonbridge, and of all the parishes, ecclesiastical districts and other cures or places comprised within the said six rural deaneries and of the said parish of Allington (all hereinbefore recommended to be included in the diocese of Rochester) and of the four parishes of Saint John the Evangelist, Penge, Saint Paul, Penge, Holy Trinity, Penge, and Christ Church, Penge (being the parishes within the urban district of Penge) which remain in the diocese of Rochester, shall become vested in and be with and in and be exercised by the Archdeacon of the archdeaconry of Rochester, and the said four parishes of Saint John the Evangelist, Penge, Saint Paul, Penge, Holy Trinity, Penge, and Christ Church, Penge, shall be detached from the rural deanery of Dulwich and shall be included in and form part of the rural deanery of West Dartford and the said parish of Allington shall be detached from the rural deanery of Sutton and shall be included in and form part of the rural deanery of North Malling.

"10. The whole estate and interest now vested in the Bishop of Rochester in right of his see of and in all ecclesiastical dignities and benefices situate in the diocese of Southwark shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same be forthwith transferred from the said Bishop of Rochester to and shall become and be vested in the Bishop of Southwark and his successors Bishops of the same bishoprick.

"11. The whole right (now vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury in right of his see) of

patronage of each of the twelve benefices of the vicarages of Crocken Hill, Christ Church, Erith, Saint John the Evangelist, Bromley, Saint Luke, Bromley Common, Saint Mary Cray, Saint Mary, Plaistow, Saint Mary, Platt Woodland, Dunton Green, and Four Elms, and the rectories of Stansted and Plaxtol all situate within the territory hereinbefore recommended to be severed from the diocese of Canterbury and to be included in the diocese of Rochester shall forthwith and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Rochester to hold to him the said Bishop of Rochester and his successors Bishops of the same bishoprick.

"12. The whole right now vested in the Bishop of Worcester in right of his see of patronage of each of the three benefices of Bromley (a vicarage) Chislehurst (a rectory) and Dartford (a vicarage) all situate within that part of the diocese of Canterbury hereinbefore recommended to be severed therefrom and to be included in the diocese of Rochester, shall forthwith and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Rochester to hold to him the said Bishop of Rochester and his successors Bishops of the same Bishoprick.

"13. The portion of the endowment or income of the bishoprick of Rochester which is mentioned in the fourth section of Part I of the second schedule to the said Bishopricks of Southwark and Birmingham Act, 1904 (being such portion of the endowment or income of the said bishoprick of Rochester as will reduce that endowment or income from the annual sum of four thousand five hundred pounds to the annual sum of four thousand pounds irrespective of tenths or first fruits, that is to say, the annual sum of five hundred pounds of such endowment or income) shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, be transferred as from the date of the vacation of the See of Rochester next after the date of the passing of the said Bishopricks of Southwark and Birmingham Act, 1904, from the Bishop and bishoprick of Rochester to and shall become and for ever thereafter be and form part of the Southwark Bishoprick Endowment Fund so as to become part of the annual income of the Bishop of Southwark for the time being but the first fruits and tenths or the annual sum payable in lieu of such first fruits and tenths in respect of the said annual sum of five hundred pounds shall be payable by the Bishop of Southwark for the time being to the exoneration of the Bishop and bishoprick of Rochester.

"14. The laud at Kennington in the parish of Saint Mary Newington in the county of Surrey which by deed dated the twenty-fifth day of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three was conveyed unto and to the use of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in fee simple as and for a site for the residence of the Bishop of Rochester for the time being. Together with the house since erected and now standing thereon and the fittings and fixtures forming part and parcel of the freehold thereof which said house is known as Bishop's House Kennington aforesaid being the existing residence of the Bishop of Rochester shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your

Majesty in Council confirming the same become and shall henceforth be held as and for the residence of the Bishop of Southwark and his successors Bishops of the same bishoprick but any pictures books or other goods and chattels contained in the said house of residence and being in the nature of heirlooms of the see of Rochester shall be removed to such new residence as may hereafter be provided for the Bishop of Rochester and his successors and in the meantime shall be disposed of as we the Ecclesiastical Commissioners may from time to time direct and the liability for the payment by annual instalments with interest of the residue now remaining payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty of a sum of two hundred pounds advanced by the Governors for the purpose of improvements to the said residence house and secured by a mortgage to the Governors for a term of twelve years of the endowments and revenues of the bishoprick of Rochester by a deed dated the eighth day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine shall be transferred to the Bishop of Southwark and his successors and shall be a charge upon the endowments and revenues of the bishoprick of Southwark to the exoneration of the Bishop and bishoprick of Rochester.

"15. As from the first day of May one thousand nine hundred and five out of the surplus fund in the hands of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners arising from the sale under the authority of an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council of the seventh day of March one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight of the residence house and appurtenances thereto of the see of Canterbury known as Addington Park there shall be set aside by us a sum of fifteen thousand pounds which shall be applicable by us to the provision and (as to so much thereof as in the opinion of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall not be required for the provision) to the maintenance of a suitable and convenient residence for the Bishop of Rochester and his successors in such place as may be approved by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and to the house of residence so provided for the Bishop of Rochester the provisions of the tenth section of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her said late Majesty chapter twenty-six shall apply and upon any direction being given by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as to the amount for which the same residence shall be insured and the office in which such insurance shall be effected all the provisions of the eleventh section of the last-mentioned Act in respect to such insurance the delivery of receipts for premiums and the disposal of the money received under such insurance in case of loss or damage by fire shall apply as if the said sum of fifteen thousand pounds or the portion thereof applied to the provision of such residence house had been derived from the sale under that Act of a former episcopal residence of the Bishop of Rochester and as if such direction as to insurance had been given by the authority mentioned in the said eleventh section of the said Act.

"16. As from the same first day of May one thousand nine hundred and five the residue of the surplus fund mentioned in the last preceding section of this scheme (such residue then consisting of or being represented by the sum of one thousand two hundred pounds Great Northern Railway four pounds per cent. preference stock the sum of two thousand four hundred pounds London Brighton and South Coast Railway five pounds per cent. preference stock and the sum of two hundred and thirty one pounds twelve shillings and

seven pence cash) shall be paid or transferred by us to the Southwark Bishoprick Endowment Fund.

"17. Any existing Archdeacon whose archdeaconry is affected by the foundation of the new bishoprick of Southwark may reside in any place in which he would have been entitled to reside had the said new bishoprick not been founded.

"18. The Registrar, Apparitor-General, Sealer, and Record Keeper of the diocese or bishoprick of Southwark shall respectively on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year so long as any present Registrar, Apparitor-General, Sealer or Record Keeper of the diocese of Rochester who was appointed to his office before the fifteenth day of August one thousand nine hundred and four shall continue to hold such office pay to such last-mentioned Registrar, Apparitor-General, Sealer or Record Keeper of the diocese of Rochester one half of the net fees received by such accounting officer during the six months preceding the said first day of January or the first day of July as the case may be for work which shall have been done by such accounting officer in the exercise of his office (or by any other officer who may by usage or otherwise perform the duties of such officer) and which but for the foundation of the diocese of Southwark one of such officers of the diocese of Rochester would have been entitled to perform such fees to be calculated upon the scale of fees which shall be established for or shall be in force within the diocese of Southwark and in computing such net fees these shall be deducted from the gross fees so received as aforesaid the out of pocket expenses incurred in relation to the matters in respect of which the fees have been received.

"19. The Registrar, Apparitor-General, Sealer and Record Keeper of the diocese or bishoprick of Rochester and the Registrar and any other officer of the archdeaconry in which shall be included any church, parish, place or benefice which by this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same shall be transferred from the diocese of Canterbury to the diocese of Rochester shall respectively on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year so long as any present Registrar of the province of Canterbury, Registrar, Apparitor-General, Sealer or Record Keeper of the diocese of Canterbury or Registrar or other officer of the archdeaconry of Maidstone who was appointed to his office before the fifteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and four shall continue to hold such office pay to such last mentioned Registrar of the province of Canterbury, Registrar, Apparitor-General, Sealer or Record Keeper of the diocese of Canterbury or Registrar or other officer of the archdeaconry of Maidstone one half of the net fees received by such accounting officer during the six months preceding the said first day of January or first day of July (as the case may be) for work which shall have been done by such accounting officer in the exercise of his office (or by any other officer who may by usage or otherwise perform the duties of such officer) in or in relation to any church, parish, place or benefice so transferred and which but for such transference one of such officers of the province or diocese of Canterbury or of the archdeaconry of Maidstone would have been entitled to perform such fees to be calculated upon the scale of fees which shall be established for or shall be in force within the diocese of Rochester or the archdeaconry (as the case may be) of such

accounting officer and in computing such net fees there shall be deducted from the gross fees so received as aforesaid the out of pocket expenses incurred in relation to the matters in respect of which the fees have been received.

"20. The Chancellor of the diocese of Rochester (the present Chancellor having consented to the provisions contained in this clause) shall on the first day of January and on the first day of July in every year so long as the present Commissary-General of the city and diocese of Canterbury shall continue to hold that office pay to such Commissary-General the fees received by such Chancellor during the six months preceding the said first day of January or first day of July as the case may be for work which shall have been done by such Chancellor in the exercise of his office (or by any lawfully appointed deputy) in or in relation to any portion of the diocese of Rochester transferred thereto from the diocese of Canterbury and which but for such transference such Commissary-General of the diocese of Canterbury would have been entitled to perform.

"21. Every officer (other than the Vicar-General of the province of Canterbury and the Chancellor of the diocese of Rochester and those to whom the three preceding clauses of this scheme relate) who by virtue of an appointment bearing date prior to the fifteenth day of August one thousand nine hundred and four now holds any office of emolument under the Bishop of any diocese or the Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of any diocese or otherwise in and for any diocese affected by the formation of the diocese of Southwark or by an Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this scheme and who derived or might have derived any portion of the emoluments of his office from sources arising within parishes or places which by the formation of the diocese of Southwark or by virtue of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this scheme have been or shall be transferred from one diocese to another shall for the term for which he was so appointed to his office as aforesaid or until his resignation or other avoidance thereof continue within such transferred parishes or places to perform such duties in the same manner (that is to say either in person or by deputy as may be authorized by the terms of such his appointment) and to receive accordingly such emoluments (upon the scale which may be established or be in force in relation to such his office in such transferred parishes or places) as an officer of or within the diocese to which such parishes or places have been transferred as he has hitherto performed and received as an officer of or within the diocese wherein such parishes or places were formerly situate and (if an officer of the Bishop) shall as regards parishes or places transferred to the diocese of Southwark during his tenure of such his office be one of the officers mentioned in the third clause of this scheme.

"22. Twenty-four honorary canonries shall be founded in the said cathedral church of the bishoprick of Southwark and it shall be lawful for the Bishop of Southwark to appoint to such honorary canonries spiritual persons to whom the provisions of the twenty-third section of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and thirteen in relation to the holders of honorary canonries founded thereunder shall be applicable save that so long as there shall be no Dean and Chapter of the said cathedral church it shall be lawful for the Bishop of Southwark of his own sole authority and without the consent of any Dean and Chapter to make regulations respecting the honorary canonries so appointed

provided always that any honorary canonries in the cathedral church of Rochester who upon the foundation of the bishoprick of Southwark were holding benefices in that part of the diocese of Rochester which has now become the diocese of Southwark and who by writing under their respective hands duly registered or recorded as the Bishop of Southwark shall direct shall consent to such transfer shall (notwithstanding anything in the last-mentioned Act and section contained) be transferred to and become honorary canonries in the said cathedral church of the bishoprick of Southwark and shall thereupon that is to say as to each of them upon his appointment as such honorary canon in the said cathedral church of the bishoprick of Southwark cease ipso facto to be an honorary canon in the cathedral church of Rochester. Provided also that in the first year after the passing of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this scheme eight spiritual persons and no more (exclusive of any honorary canonries who may be transferred from the cathedral church of Rochester) may be appointed to honorary canonries in the said cathedral church of the bishoprick of Southwark.

"23. All tithes and other documents relating exclusively to any parish or parishes ecclesiastical districts or other cures or places situate within the diocese of Southwark or otherwise relating exclusively to the said diocese or relating exclusively to any part or parts of the diocese of Canterbury hereinbefore recommended to be included in the diocese of Rochester shall subject to the provisions hereinbefore contained be transferred from the custody of the registrar or other officer of the diocese or of the Bishop of the diocese wherein the said parish or parishes ecclesiastical districts or other cures or places were situate immediately before the foundation of the said diocese of Southwark as aforesaid or (as the case may be) are now situate and shall become and be in the custody of such registrar or other officer or officers of the diocese or of the Bishop of the diocese of Southwark or other the diocese in which such places are hereinbefore recommended to be included as the Bishop of such diocese shall appoint in that behalf. And as to all documents which may remain in their present custody although relating to or affecting the bishoprick of Southwark or any parish ecclesiastical district cure or place now situate in the diocese of Southwark or by this scheme and any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same transferred from one diocese to another diocese the registrar or other officer of the diocese of Southwark or other the diocese to which such parish ecclesiastical district cure or place shall be so transferred as aforesaid shall be at liberty at all convenient times to inspect such documents and take copies therefrom as freely as the registrar or other officer in whose custody such documents may so remain."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the said dioceses of Canterbury, Rochester, and Southwark and by the Registrar of the diocese of Worcester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-seventh day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty chapter sixty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the Rural Deaneries or some of them within the Archdeaconry of Birmingham, in the diocese of Birmingham.

"Whereas there is within the said diocese of Birmingham one Archdeaconry, to wit, the said Archdeaconry of Birmingham, and such Archdeaconry comprises eight Rural Deaneries, namely, the Rural Deaneries of Aston-juxta-Birmingham, Birmingham, Coleshill, Handsworth, Northfield, Polesworth, Solihull, and Sutton Coldfield, and eight cures which are not included in any of the said Rural Deaneries, namely, the cures of Langley, Lapworth, The Lickey, Oldbury, Christ Church at the Quinton, Rowley Regis, Saint James, Round's Green, and Saint Mary, Temple Balsal.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Birmingham, has represented to us that it is desirable to make certain new arrangements (being the arrangements hereinafter recommended and proposed) with respect to the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconry of Birmingham.

"And whereas we are of opinion that the new arrangements now proposed by the said Charles, Bishop of Birmingham, may properly be carried into effect.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Charles, Bishop of Birmingham (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and his episcopal seal to this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the said Rural Deaneries of Birmingham, Coleshill, and Northfield shall be abolished, and six new Rural Deaneries to be named the Rural Deaneries of Bordesley, Central Birmingham, East Birmingham, Edgbaston, Harborne, and King's Norton, shall be constituted, and that the said Archdeaconry of Birmingham shall comprise and consist of those Rural Deaneries, the names of which are set down in order and are numbered consecutively in the schedule to this scheme annexed, and that every parish or cure or church the name of

which is set down in numbered order under the name of any rural deanery in the first column of the said schedule shall belong to and be a part of the Rural Deanery under the name of which it so appears as aforesaid, and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean and Archdeacon thereof respectively, and shall not any longer belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery or any other Archdeaconry, or be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other Rural Dean or of any other Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them under or by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford, in the county of Stafford, and in the diocese of Lichfield.

“Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the eighteenth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy and published in the London Gazette upon the twentieth day of the same month, a consolidated chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church Saint Peter, situate at Hednesford, in the parish of Cannock, in the said county of Stafford and diocese of Lichfield, and the said consolidated chapelry was named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Peter, Hednesford.’

“And whereas the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Peter, Hednesford, has, under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four.

“And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford, shall be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Honourable and Right Reverend Augustus, Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford, shall be altered so that (firstly) all those portions of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford, which are described in the first schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be restored to and shall in future form part of the said parish of Cannock, and that (secondly) all that portion of the said parish of Cannock which is described in the second schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford.

“And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

“The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford, in the county of Stafford and in the diocese of Lichfield, and to be restored to the parish of Cannock, in the said county and diocese being:—

“I. All that portion of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford, which is bounded upon the south-west by the said parish of Cannock, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at Five Ways where the boundaries of the said parish of Cannock, of the parish or parochial chapelry of Norton Canes otherwise Norton under Cannock, in the said county and diocese, and of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford, all meet, at the junction of Hednesford-road with Wimblebury-road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Wimblebury-road for a distance of fifty-four chains or thereabouts to the point where Wimblebury-road is crossed by the footpath or roadway leading from Pit Number 8 to Pit Number 9 of Cannock Chase Colliery, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said footpath or roadway for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading to the house called Heathy Hayes, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the lastly-mentioned footpath for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hednesford-road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Hednesford-road for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to the point opposite to the middle of the stream or watercourse which flows along the north-western side of the fields on the north-western side of the said house called Heathy Hayes, and extending thence south-westward to and along the middle of the said stream or watercourse for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford, from the said parish of Cannock.

“II. And also all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford, which is bounded upon the south-west and upon the north-west by the said parish of Cannock and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Cannock from the said new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford, at the junction of Cannock-road with Stafford-lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Stafford-lane for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Stafford-lane over the Cannock Branch Line of the London and North Western Railway, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said branch line of railway for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford, from the said parish of Cannock.

"THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the said new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford, being:—

"All that portion of the said parish of Cannock which is bounded upon the north-east and upon the south-east by the said new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west, upon the west and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford, from the said parish of Cannock, at the centre of the bridge which carries Cannock-road over the tramway which leads past the pits numbered 3, 1, and 4, of West Cannock Colliery, and extending thence first north-westward and then generally northward along the middle of the said tramway for a distance of sixty-two chains or thereabouts to its present northern end and extending thence eastward and in a straight line for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to the junction of Ebenezer-street with Green Heath-road, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Cannock from the said new parish of Saint Peter, Hednesford."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lichfield.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fourth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now

humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Augustine, Plymouth, situate within the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint Matthias, Plymouth, in the county of Devon, and in the diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Matthias, Plymouth, of the parish of Charles, Plymouth, of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Jude, Plymouth, and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, all in the county and diocese aforesaid, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes and parish.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint Matthias, Plymouth, of the said parish of Charles, Plymouth, of the said new parish of Saint Jude, Plymouth, and of the said new parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same shall be assigned to the said Church of Saint Augustine, Plymouth, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Archibald, Bishop of Exeter, as Diocesan, with the consent of the Reverend Thomas Alfred Chapman, Vicar of the said parish of Charles, Plymouth, as patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, as one of the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Jude, Plymouth, and as one of the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Matthias, Plymouth, with the consents of the Reverend William Edward Burroughs, Vicar of Saint Andrew, Plymouth, and of the Reverend William Howard Coates, Vicar of Christ Church, Plymouth, as the remaining patrons of the said vicarage of the new parish of Saint Matthias, Plymouth, with the consents of Jonathan James Marshall, of Yelverton, Plymouth, one of Your Majesty's Justices of the Peace, of David Banks, of Number 4, Beaumont-road, Plymouth, Ship-builder, and of Thomas Greek Wills, of Manna-mead, Plymouth, one of Your Majesty's Justices of the Peace, as the remaining patrons of the said vicarage of the new parish of Saint Jude, Plymouth, and with the consents of the Reverend Sir John Robert Laurie Emilius Laurie, Baronet, Clerk in Holy Orders, of the Very Reverend William Hagger Barlow, Doctor in Divinity, Dean of the Cathedral Church of Peterborough, of the Reverend Henry Elliott Fox, a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, of Francis Augustus Bevan, of Number 54, Lombard-street, in the city of London, Esquire, and of John Francis William Deacon, of Number 20, Birchin-lane, in the city of London, Esquire, as the patrons of the vicarage of the said parish of Charles, Plymouth (in testimony whereof, they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Matthias, Plymouth, of the said parish of Charles, Plymouth, of the said new parish of Saint Jude, Plymouth, and of the said new parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and

set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said Church of Saint Augustine, Plymouth, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Plymouth.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Plymouth, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint Matthias, Plymouth, in the parish of Charles, Plymouth, of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Jude, Plymouth, and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, all in the county of Devon, and in the diocese of Exeter, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Jude, Plymouth, from the said parish of Charles, Plymouth, at the junction of Lipson-road with Queen's-road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Queen's-road for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Southern Terrace-road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Southern Terrace-road for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Furze Hill-road, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Charles, Plymouth, from the said new parish of Saint Matthias, Plymouth, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Furze Hill-road for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts (thereby following the boundary which divides the said parish of Charles, Plymouth, from the said new parish of Saint Matthias, Plymouth), to the junction of Furze Hill-road with Greenbank-road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Greenbank-road for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with the high road leading from Plymouth to Tavistock which is here known as Mutley Plain, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said high road for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts (thereby in part following the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Matthias, Plymouth, from the said new parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford), to its junction with Belgrave-road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Belgrave-road for a distance of fifteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Pearson-road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Pearson-road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Pearson-avenue, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Pearson-avenue for a distance of four chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Ivydale-road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Ivydale-road for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Elm-road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Elm-road for a distance of six chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to its junction with Bradley-road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Bradley-road for a distance of three chains and a half or thereabouts to the wall or fence at its present northern end which divides it from the close

numbered 143 upon the ordnance map of the civil parish of Compton Gifford, published in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, upon the scale of twenty-five inches to one mile, and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this representation, and extending thence south-eastward along the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the said close numbered 143 (thereby passing the northern ends of Rutland-road and Bute-road) for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the northern end of the lane running along the backs of the houses situate on the eastern side of Bute-road, and extending thence southward along the middle of such lane for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with Elm-road, and continuing thence southward in the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of five yards or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, from the said parish of Charles, Plymouth, and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary meets the fence which divides the close numbered 14 upon the said maps from the close numbered 13 upon the said maps, and extending thence north-eastward and in a straight line across the said close numbered 13 for a distance of three chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to the western end of the fence which divides the close numbered 18 upon the said maps from the close numbered 12 upon the said maps, and extending thence eastward along the last-mentioned fence for a distance of five chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 19 upon the said maps, and extending thence eastward in a straight line across the said close numbered 19 for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to the south-western corner of the close numbered 20 upon the said maps, and extending thence eastward along the fence which divides the said close numbered 20 from the said close numbered 19, the houses known as Somerford-terrace, and the close numbered 10 upon the said maps, for a distance of five chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where such fence meets the north-western side of Efford-lane, and extending thence first eastward to the middle of Efford-lane and then north-eastward along the middle of such lane for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, from the parish of Egg Buckland, in the said county and diocese, and extending thence southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Egg Buckland from the said new parish of Saint Jude, Plymouth, and extending thence first eastward, then north-eastward, and then again eastward, along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of fifty-seven chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundary of the said new parish of Saint Jude, Plymouth, turns south-westward along the high-water mark on the right bank of the river Plym, and extending thence south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following the said high-water mark and intersecting the line of the Great Western Railway) for a distance of thirty-four chains or thereabouts to a point distant precisely seven chains north-east of the houses at Arnold's Point, and extending thence north-westward and in a straight line (thereby crossing the Sutton Harbour branch line of the Great Western Railway) for a distance of

Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Saint Saviour, Ringley, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Saviour, Ringley, is vested in the rectors or Incumbents for the time being of the three benefices of Middleton, Prestwich, and Bury, in the said county of Lancaster and in the said diocese of Manchester.

"And whereas the Reverend Thomas Ebenezer Cleworth, Honorary Canon of Manchester, now Rector of the said benefice of Middleton, the Reverend Frederic Wilson Cooper, now Rector of the said benefice of Prestwich, and the Venerable Foster Grey Blackburne, Archdeacon of Manchester, now Rector of the said benefice of Bury, are desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Saviour, Ringley, now vested in them as aforesaid as such rectors or Incumbents, should be transferred to and be vested in the rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Bury.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edmund Arbutnot, now Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester, has executed this scheme as herein-after mentioned in token that the said transfer has that consent of the Bishop which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary.

"And whereas a sum of money has been paid over to us in favour of the said benefice of Saint Saviour, Ringley, but upon the understanding that the patronage of the same benefice shall be transferred as is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas in these circumstances it appears to us that the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Saint Saviour, Ringley, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the new parish of Saint Saviour, Ringley.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Thomas Ebenezer Cleworth, of the said Frederic Wilson Cooper, and of the said Foster Grey Blackburne (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Edmund Arbutnot, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Saviour, Ringley, now

vested in them, the said Thomas Ebenezer Cleworth, Frederic Wilson Cooper, and Foster Grey Blackburne as such rectors or Incumbents as aforesaid, shall be transferred from them and from their successors, rectors or Incumbents of their respective benefices, to the said Foster Grey Blackburne, as rector or Incumbent of the said benefice of Bury and his successors, rectors or Incumbents of the same benefice, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Foster Grey Blackburne as rector or Incumbent of the said benefice of Bury, and by his successors, rectors or Incumbents of the same benefice, for ever.

WHEREAS by Treaty, capitulation, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the dominions of the Ottoman Porte;

And whereas it is expedient to amend "The Ottoman Order in Council, 1899" (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order"):

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. Article 49 of the Principal Order is hereby repealed, and the following provisions are substituted in lieu thereof, that is to say:

"Subject to Rules of Court made under this Order, the Court may, out of any moneys in its hands arising from fees of Court or other fees, or moneys received under the Principal Order, or this Order, order payment of allowances in respect of their reasonable expenses to any complainant or witnesses attending before the Court, on the trial of any criminal case with a jury or assessors (including the preliminary examination of the accused antecedent thereto), and also fees and costs to legal practitioners and allowances to jurors, assessors, interpreters, medical practitioners, and other persons in respect of services rendered in criminal cases.

"Subject as aforesaid, where on the conclusion of a preliminary examination the accused is discharged, the Court may, for special reasons to be

recorded in the Minutes, order payment of the like allowances as are above mentioned to any complainant or witnesses attending before the Court at the preliminary examination."

2. Article 136 of the Principal Order shall extend to authorize the Supreme Court by Rules of Court to prescribe a scale of allowances for the purposes of Article 1 of this Order.

3. Article 136 of the Principal Order shall further extend to authorize the Supreme Court by Rules of Court to prescribe the fees to be taken in respect of proceedings in or by any Consular Court in relation to cases in Ottoman Tribunals to which any British subject may be a party.

4. The powers of the Ambassador under Article 163 of the Principal Order shall with respect to King's Regulations, in so far as they extend to Egypt, be exercised by the Agent for Egypt.

5. The Secretary of State may from time to time appoint a competent person to act as Crown Prosecutor in Egypt, on such terms of remuneration as may be approved by the Treasury.

6.—(i.) The Crown Prosecutor shall have such powers and shall perform such duties with respect to the commencement and prosecution of criminal proceedings, including preliminary examinations and trials, and also the framing and alteration (before trial) of charges, as may be prescribed by Rules of Court.

(ii.) Except so far as the Crown Prosecutor, under Rules of Court, may be required to intervene, or may exercise any discretionary power of intervention, in any criminal proceedings this Article shall not affect the duties or powers of a private prosecutor.

(iii.) Subject to Rules of Court, the Crown Prosecutor shall act in accordance with any instructions of the Secretary of State.

7. Article 115 of the Principal Order is hereby repealed, and the following provisions are substituted in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

"If any person named executor in a will takes possession of, and administers or otherwise deals with any part of the property of the deceased, and does not obtain probate within one month after the death or after the termination of any proceedings respecting probate or administration, he shall be liable to pay double the amount of any fees chargeable on obtaining probate, and he shall also be liable to a fine not exceeding £100."

8. This Order may be cited as "The Ottoman Order in Council, 1905."

Government Notice. No. 164.

His Honour the Deputy Governor, acting on the advice of the Council of Health, has been pleased to repeal Government Notice No. 142 of the 11th July, 1905, and to direct that the following regulations be observed as regards vessels and passengers:—

Infected Places.

1. The following countries and ports are declared to be infected:—

- (a.) Arabia (excepting Perim and Aden);
- (b.) India;
- (c.) Alexandria (Egypt).

Infected Vessels.

2. Infected vessels are vessels which have, or have had, on board, during the voyage or the preceding 20 days, cases of cholera, yellow fever, plague, or any disease with symptoms which, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, resemble the symptoms of the said diseases.

Vessels which are not allowed to enter the Harbour, but are allowed to communicate with Quarantine Establishments.

3. Infected vessels.

4. Vessels with pilgrims from the East, which do not carry a recognized Medical Officer.

Vessels allowed to load in Quarantine.

5. Infected vessels carrying a recognized Medical Officer, and not having on board an actual case of any of the diseases mentioned in clause 2 on board.

6. Vessels with pilgrims from the East which carry a recognized Medical Officer.

7. Vessels arriving from infected places within 10 days from date of departure, but not having on board an actual case of any of the diseases mentioned in clause 2.

8. Vessels arriving at Malta without a clean bill of health.

9. The vessels indicated in clauses 5, 6, and 7 shall coal in the Marsamuscetto Harbour. Those indicated in clause 8 may, with the permission of the Collector of Customs, coal in quarantine in the Grand Harbour.

Vessels from Infected Places admitted to Pratique.

10. Vessels without a clean bill of health, or from infected places, will be admitted to pratique after 10 days from date of departure.

Pilots allowed to board Vessels.

11. Pilots will be allowed to board the vessels referred to in clauses 5, 6, 7, and 8 for the

purpose of taking them into harbour in quarantine, subject to the following conditions:—

(a.) The pilot shall go direct from his boat to the bridge, without holding communication with any person except the Officers and crew of the vessel, and after the vessel is moored, shall be taken in one of her boats to the Lazaretto, where his clothes and person shall be disinfected.

(b.) To prevent communication or contact with passengers, the Master of the vessel shall cause the portion of the deck over which the pilot has to pass to be roped off, and shall exclude from such space and from the bridge all persons except the Officers and crew of the vessel so long as the pilot is on board.

Medical Inspection.

12. All vessels and passengers are subject to medical inspection on arrival.

Passengers.

13. Passengers who, according to the declaration of the captain of the vessel by which they arrive, embarked at Ports beyond Suez, or at Mediterranean Ports, east of Malta, or at Sicily, Tripoli (Barhary States) or Tunis, shall, before landing, declare on oath before a Marine Police Officer that they have not been in, or have not communicated with, an infected place within the last 10 days. Otherwise they shall remain in quarantine till the expiration of 10 days from the date of departure.

14. Passengers arriving on board vessels without a clean bill of health, and the Officers of such vessels, will be permitted to land after medical inspection, but will not be permitted to land any of their luggage or effects until the same shall have been thoroughly disinfected. This clause does not apply to deck passengers.

15. Passengers not otherwise provided for are subjected to the restrictions applicable to the vessels on which they arrive.

16. When 20 days have elapsed from the last case of plague, cholera, or other disease against which restrictions have been in force with regard to a country or place declared to be an infected place, a notice will be issued by the Collector of Customs to the effect that the place or port is no longer to be dealt with as infected.

The word "passengers," as used in this notice, except in clause 14, includes the officers and crew of vessels.

(SHEEP-SCAB COMPULSORY DIPPING AREA.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1905 in its application to the Compulsory Dipping Area described in the First Schedule hereto shall be modified as follows:—

- (a) Sheep may be moved from any premises in the Compulsory Dipping Area to one of the dipping-places specified in the Second Schedule to this Order if accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District from which they are moved.
- (b) The sheep shall after being dipped at the dipping-place be moved as soon as practicable back to the premises from which they were moved for dipping.
- (c) The movement to and from the dipping-place shall be supervised by an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority.
- (d) Sheep moved under a licence under this Order shall during the movement and detention at the dipping-place be as far as practicable kept separate from all other sheep.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Existing Orders.

1. Article 2 (*Compulsory Dipping of all Sheep in Compulsory Dipping Area*) of the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1905, hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order," shall not as regards the Area described in the Schedule hereto apply to the undermentioned sheep:—

(1.) Sheep for which an exemption has been obtained from the Local Authority of the District, which exemption shall only be granted for sheep which for the purposes of sale, exhibition or movement shall have been dipped under and in accordance with the provisions of the principal Order on or since the fourth day of September in the current year, and have since such dipping been kept separate from sheep not dipped in the manner prescribed by the principal Order. The sheep thus exempted shall until the expiration of the prescribed dipping period be kept separate from sheep which have not been dipped in the manner prescribed by the principal Order. Every exemption shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority and shall be subject to any conditions specified in the exemption. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Sheep moved out of the Compulsory Dipping Area under and in accordance with the provisions of Article 5 of the principal Order, or slaughtered within the Area during the dipping period; or

(3.) Sheep moved through the Area by railway from a place outside the Area to another place outside the Area without unnecessary delay or being untrucked within the Area.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of August, nineteen hundred and five.
