The making of the following Order under the Wild Birds Protection Acts should have been notified in the London Gazette for the year 1903:—

WILD BIRD, ENGLAND.

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Monmouth) Order, 1903.

Dated 10th June, 1903.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1902, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Monmouth, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Monmouth) Order, 1903."

BIRDS.

The Goldfinch and Kingfisher protected during the whole of the Year.

II. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the Goldfinch and the Kingfisher is prohibited throughout the County of Monmouth.

EGGS.

The Eggs of the Goldfinch and Kingfisher protected.

III. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the Goldfinch and the Kingfisher is prohibited

throughout the County of Monmouth for two years from the date hereof.

**THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.
LEIGHTON BUZZARD FAIRS.**

Whereas a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Leighton Buzzard Urban District Council, that Fairs known as St. Paul's Fair, Cherry Fair, and Runaway Fair, have been held annually at Leighton Buzzard, on the 5th February, the 26th July, and the 24th October, respectively, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fairs should in future be held annually on the Tuesday following the 5th February, the Tuesday following the 26th July, and the Tuesday following the 24th October, respectively:

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when I would take the same into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1873":

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fairs should in future be held annually on the Tuesday following the 5th February, the Tuesday following the 26th July, and the Tuesday following the 24th October, respectively:

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1873," do hereby order that the Fairs known as St. Paul's Fair, Cherry Fair, and Runaway Fair, which have been held annually at Leighton Buzzard, on the 5th February, the 26th July, and the 24th October, respectively, shall in future be held annually on the Tuesday following the 5th February, the Tuesday following the 26th July, and the Tuesday following the 24th October, respectively.
