Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or of any Order by which such provisions are applied to any scheduled area, swine may be moved from the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any place of destination in Great Britain situate in any scheduled area, if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place to which the swine are proposed to be moved.

The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and while being so moved shall not be subject to Regulations made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board relating to Swine-Fever.

## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 26TH AUGUST 1905.)

SHEEP-DIPPING (SCOTLAND) ORDER OF 1905 (No. 3).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Principal Order to an Area constituted a separate Dipping Area.

1.—(1.) The Area described in the First Schedule hereto shall cease to form part of the Dipping Area to which the Sheep-Dipping (Scotland) Order of 1905 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") as amended by the Sheep-Dipping (Scotland) Order of 1905 (No. 2) applies, and shall become a separate Dipping Area.

(2.) In the Dipping Area described in the First Schedule hereto the prescribed dipping period under Article 4 of the principal Order shall be extended from the first day of September to the first day of November next, and the termination of the period during which Article 8 (Restrictions on Markets, &c., and of Movement out of Dipping Area) is in operation, shall be deferred from the first day of October next to the first day of December next.

#### Amendment of Principal Order.

### Restriction on Movement of Sheep not Dipped within Dipping Period.

2. Where in any Dipping Area to which the principal Order or this Order applies any sheep shall not have been dipped within the dipping period an Inspector of the Local Authority may, without prejudice to any proceedings for the offence, serve the owner or person in charge of the sheep and the owner or person in charge of any sheep then in contact with the undipped sheep with a Notice, in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect, and

thereupon it shall be unlawful to move the sheep referred to in the Notice from the farm, holding, or other place where they are at the time the Notice is served unless and until all the sheep shall have been dipped after the service of the Notice by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab, or purporting to be so approved, in the presence of an Inspector of the Local Authority.

#### Commencement and Construction.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of September, nineteen hundred and five, and shall be read as one with the principal Order, and the principal Order as hereby modified shall be construed in relation to each Dipping Area as if it were the Dipping Area referred to in the principal Order.

#### Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP-DIPPING (SCOTLAND) ORDER OF 1905 (No. 3).

Pollock Rip.—Wreck Burys Eastward of Withdrawn.
