 The working of the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903, and of the Regulations under them;

- The law and practice in relation to motor cars in the principal Foreign Countries;
- What an endments, if any, should be made in the Motor Car Acts, and the Regulations under them;
- 4. The injury to the roads alleged to be caused by motor cars; and
- 5. Whether any, and, if so, what, additional charges should be imposed in respect of motor cars, and how any money thus raised should be applied:

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these Presents authorize and appoint you, the said William Court, Viscount Selby; Henry William Montagu, Marquess of Winchester; Sir David Harrel; Sir William Bower Forwood; Edward Richard Henry; William John Mure; and Horace Cecil Monro to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said inquiry.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever:

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid.

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted

for your consideration.

And for the purpose of aiding you in your inquiries We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved Charles Clive Bigham, Esquire, Companion of our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Captain in Our Reserve of Officers, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

WILD BIRD PROTECTION. The Wild Birds Protection (County of Carnarvon) Order, 1905. Dated 2nd September, 1905.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904. and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Carnarvon, I hereby make the following Order:-

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Carnarvon) Order, 1905."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended throughout the county of Carnarvon, so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of October in each year:—

American Quail, Auk, Avocet, Bee Eater, Bittern, Bonxie, Colin, Cornish Chough, Coulterneb, Cuckoo, Datterel, Dunlin, Fern Owl, Fulmar, Gannet, Goatsucker, Godwit, Goldfinch, Grebe, Greenshank. Guillemot, Gull (except Blackbacked Gull), Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kittiwake, Loon, Marrot, Merganser, Murre, Nighthawk, Nightingale, Nightjar, Oriole, Owl, Oxbird, Oyster Catcher, Petrel, Phalarope, Ploverspage, Puffin, Purre, Razorbill, Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling, Sandpiper, Scout, Sealark, Samew Sea, Parrot Sea, Swallow, Shearwater Seamew, Sea Parrot, Sea Swallow, Shearwater, Sheldrake, Skua, Smew, Solan Goose, Spoonbill, Stint, Stone Curlew, Stonehatch, Summer Snipe, Tarrock, Tern, Thick Knee, Tystey, Whaup, Whimbrel, Willock, Woodpecker.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880. III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the county of Carnarvon to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manuer as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:

Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Tree Creeper, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Hedge Sparrow, Linnet, Raven, Redstart, Robin, Redbacked Shrike, Starling, Thrush, Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Wheatear, Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren.

The Goldfinch, Kingfisher and Owl protected during

the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 30th day of September in any year and the 1st day of March following the killing or taking of the Goldfinch, the Kingfisher and the Owl (all species) is prohibited throughout the County of Carnarvon.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County. V. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the county of Carnarvon:

Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Tree Creeper, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Hedge Sparrow, Kingfisher, Linnet, Owl (all species), Raven, Redstart, Robin, Redbacked Skrike, Starling, Thrush, Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Wheatear, Common Wren, Fire-rested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, and (after April 30th in each year) Lapwing, Peewit or Green Plover.

Repeal of Former Order.

VI. The Order of the 22nd day of August, 1905, is hereby repealed.

Under the power and authority vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," His Excellency the High Commissioner orders that the

quarantine against direct arrivals from Adalia be removed.

The Board of Trade have received a copy of the following Quarantine Notice, dated August 30, issued by the Governor of Malta:—

Government Notice. No. 192.

His Honour the Deputy Governor, acting on the advice of the Council of Health, has been pleased to repeal Government Notice No. 164 of the 3rd August, 1905, and to direct that the following regulations be observed as regards vessels and passengers:—

Infected Places.

- 1. The following countries and ports are declared to be infected:—
  - (a.) Arabia (excepting Perim and Aden);
  - (b.) India;
  - (c.) Alexandria (Egypt).

# Infected Vessels.

2. Infected vessels are vessels which have, on have had, on board, during the voyage or the preceding 10 days, cases of cholera, yellow fever, plague, or any disease with symptoms which, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, resemble the symptoms of the said diseases.

Vessels which are not allowed to enter the Harbour, but are allowed to communicate with the Quarantine Establishment at Comino.

3. Infected vessels actually having on board cases of any of the diseases mentioned in clause 2.

4. Vessels with pilgrims from the East, which do not carry a recognized Medical Officer.

Vessels allowed to load or coal in Quarantine.

- 5. Infected vessels not actually having on board cases of any of the diseases mentioned in clause 2.
- clause 2.
  6. Vessels with pilgrims from the East which carry a recognized Medical Officer.
- 7. Vessels arriving from infected places within 10 days from date of departure, but not having on board an actual case of any of the diseases mentioned in clause 2.
- 8. Vessels arriving at Malta without a clean bill of health.
- 9. The vessels indicated in clauses 5, 6, and 7 shall coal in the Marsamuscetto Harbour. Those indicated in clause 8 may, with the permission of the Collector of Customs, coal in quarantine in the Grand Harbour.

# Vessels from Infected Places admitted to Pratique.

10. Vessels without a clean bill of health, or from infected places, will be admitted to pratique after 10 days from date of departure.

Pilots allowed to board Vessels.

11. Pilots will be allowed to board the vessels referred to in clauses 5, 6, 7, and 8 for the purpose of taking them into harbour in quarantine, subject to the following conditions:—

(a.) The pilot shall go direct from his boat to the bridge, without holding communication with any person except the Officers and crew of the vessel, and after the vessel is moored, shall be taken in one of her boats to the Lazaretto, where his clothes and person shall be disinfected.

(b.) To prevent communication or contact with passengers, the Master of the vessel shall cause the portion of the deck over which the pilot has to pass to be roped off, and shall exclude from such space and from the bridge all persons except the Officers and crew of the vessel so long as the pilot is on board.

# Medical Inspection.

12. All vessels and passengers are subject to medical inspection on arrival.

### Passengers.

- 13. Passengers who, according to the declaration of the captain of the vessel by which they arrive, embarked at Ports beyond Suez, or at Mediterranean Ports, east of Malta, or at Sicily, Tripoli (Barbary States) or Tunis, shall, before landing; declare on oath before a Marine Police Officer that they have not been in, or have not communicated with, an infected place within the last 10 days. Otherwise they shall remain in quarantine till the expiration of 10 days from the date of departure.
- 14. Passengers arriving on board vessels without a clean bill of health, and the Officers of such vessels, will be permitted to land after medical inspection, but will not be permitted to land any of their luggage or effects until the same shall have been thoroughly disinfected. This clause does not apply to deck passengers.
- 15. Passengers not otherwise provided for are subjected to the restrictions applicable to the vessels on which they arrive.
- 16. After the expiration of 20 days from the date on which the last case of disease occurred in any country or place which has been declared to be infected, a notice shall be issued by the Collector of Customs to the effect that the place or port is no longer to be dealt with as infected.

The word "passengers," as used in this notice, except in clause 14, includes the officers and crew of vessels.



The operation of the provisions of Part II (Regulation of Exposure and Movement of Sheep in Compulsory Dipping Areas) of the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1905 shall be suspended in their application to the Compulsory Dipping Area described in the schedule to this Order from and after the seventh day of September, nineteen hundred and five, until the fifteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and six.
