The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Sheep-Scab (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1905 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order), or any Order modifying the same, and the Order of the Board dated the 15th day of March, 1905, whereby such provisions are applied to the scheduled area defined by such last-mentioned Order, sheep exposed at the Sale specified in the schedule hereto may be moved therefrom to any place outside the said scheduled area, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of this Order, and, if so moved, shall so far as regards such movement be exempt from the provisions of the Principal Order with respect to detention and isolation after arrival at destination.
- 2. The sheep shall be accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority for the county of Monmouth, which licence shall only be granted upon production of (a) the certificate of an Inspector of the said Local Authority to the effect that the sheep have been dipped in the sale-yard in his presence and to his satisfaction in a sheep-dip approved by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved, and that the sheep have since such dipping been kept separate from sheep which have not been so dipped, and (b) the certificate of a Veterinary Inspector of the said Local Authority, appointed by them for the purpose, to the effect that to the best of his knowledge and belief all

the sheep exposed at the said Sale are free from sheep-scab.

- 3. The said Veterinary Inspector shall be in attendance at the said Sale throughout its continuance.
- 4. The following Articles of the Principal Order shall apply to the movement of sheep under this Order (that is to say): Article 6 (Provisions as to Movement Licences); Article 9 (General Provisions as to Movement); Article 12 (Production of Licences; Names and Addresses); and Article 13 (Local Authority to enforce Order).

Grande River-Shoal Reported Northward of.

Information, dated 29th June, 1905, has been received from Messrs. Scrutton and Co. that Mr. G. Norris, Master of that Company's steamship "Salybia," reports that his vessel grounded on a shoal at a distance of about 20 miles to the northward of Grande River, and about 6 miles from the Mosquito Coast, in approximately lat. 13° 13' N., long. 83° 27' W. The least depth obtained on the shoal in passing over it was 4½ fathoms, but it is probable that there is considerably less water over it.

The Lens-Shoal In.
