The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The operation of the provisions of Part II (*Regulation of Exposure and Movement of Sheep in Compulsory Dipping Areas*) of the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1905 shall be suspended in their application to the Compulsory Dipping Area described in the schedule to this Order from and after the eighth day of September, nineteen hundred and five, until the fifteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and six.

An Area comprising the parishes of Traian-Glâs, Glyntawe, Ystradfellte, Ystradgynlais Higher, and Ystradgynlais Lower, in the administrative county of Brecknock; the parishes of Quarter Bach, Llangadock, Llanddeusant, Myddfai, Llanfair-ar-y-bryn, and that part of the parish of Llandinog Without which lies to the east of the River Towy, in the administrative county of Carmarthen; the parishes of Cilybebyll, Dylais Higher, and Dylais Lower, and those parts of the parishes of Neath Higher, and Neath Lower which lie to the north-west of the Neath and Ystradfellte Road, in the administrative county of Glamorgan.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 6TH SEPTEMBER 1905.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Sheep-Scab (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1905 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order), or any Order modifying the same, and the Order of the Board dated the 15th day of March, 1905, whereby such provisions are applied to the scheduled area defined by such last-mentioned Order, sheep exposed at the Sale specified in the schedule hereto may be moved therefrom to any place outside the said scheduled area, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of this Order, and, if so moved, shall so far as regards such movement be exempt from the provisions of the Principal Order with respect to detention and isolation after arrival at destination.

2. The sheep shall be accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority for the county of Monmouth, which licence shall only be granted upon production of (a) the certificate of an Inspector of the said Local Authority to the effect that the sheep have been dipped in the sale-yard in his presence and to his satisfaction in a sheep-dip approved by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved, and that the sheep have since such dipping been kept separate from sheep which have not been so dipped, and (b) the certificate of a Veterinary Inspector of the said Local Authority, appointed by them for the purpose, to the effect that to the best of his knowledge and belief all
