SALMON FISHERIES (SCOTLAND) ACTS, 1828 to 1868.

The District of the River Thurso (Annual Close Time) Order, 1905.

In pursuance of the powers vested in me and upon application by petition from the District Board of the River Thurso, in terms of section 9 of the Salmon Fisheries (Scotland) Act, 1868, I, the Most Honourable John Adrian Louis, Marquess of Linlithgow, K.T., G.U.M.G., G.C.V.O., His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following Order:

1. The Annual Close Time for the District of the River Thurso shall commence on the 27th day of August, and terminate on the

10th day of February, both days inclusive.

2. It shall be lawful to fish for and take salmon with the Rod and Line in the District of the said River Thurso, from the 11th day of January to the 5th day of October, both days inclusive.

3. This Order shall take effect on the fifteenth day of September, 1905.

4. This Order may be cited as the Salmon Fisheries District of the River Thurso Order, 1905.

5. The Bye-law applicable to the District of the River Thurso contained in Schedule C of the Salmon Fisheries (Scotland) Act, 1868, and the Bye-law approved by the Secretary of State on the 25th October, 1869, applicable to the said District, are hereby revoked.

Preparations are also being made to have the following observation stations opened if it is found desirable, viz.:—Bredvik, near Umea; Juniskär, Sundsvall district; Harön, near Juniskär, Sundsvall district;

Sandhamn; and Arko, Ostergötland.

The instructions to be followed are those of the Royal decree of 16th June, 1905, which were

published on the 14th August last.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated September 6, from His Majesty's Representative at Riga, intimating that as cholera cases are reported to have occurred at some German ports, the Riga Harbour Authorities have taken energetic measures for preventing its introduction across the German frontier. At Bolderaa (the entrance to Riga) they have established a quarantine station and taken other sanitary precautions.

# Board of Trade (Harbour Department), London, September 12, 1905.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of Despatch, dated September 6th, from His Majesty's Representative at Christiania, enclosing the following translation of a Circular issued by the Norwegian Department of Justice, declaring West Prussia and Dantzig to be infected with cholera:

Circular relating to Places infected with Cholera.

Royal Department of Justice and Police, Christiania, 4th September, 1905 (received 6th September, 1905).

West Prussia and the Port of Danzig are to be regarded as infected with cholera until further notice.

The following districts have also been declared infected with cholera in previous Notices, and still continue to be so regarded:-

Palestine, Syria, and the towns of Baku and Saratow in Russia.

Ships with cholera patients on board bound for Norwegian Ports should be referred by pilots to the quarantine station at Oddersen, near Christiansand: in other ports, Masters of vessels risk being obliged to keep the patients on board, and meanwhile lie in quarantine.
