The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated September 10, from His Majesty's Representative at Madrid, intimating that the Spanish Legation at Caracas has reported that a quarantine of fifteen days has been imposed on arrivals from Colon, Panama, on account of bubonic plague.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated September 10, from His Majesty's Representative at St. Petersburg, intimating that the Sanitary Commission at that place have declared:—

(1) The town of Madras to be dangerously

infected with cholera.

(2) Sydney (New South Wales), Brisbane, Lingeh (Persian Gulf), Hongkong Kwang-chuwan and the Island of Formosa to be free from plague.

Persia, the Island of Bahrein in the Persian Gulf, the towns of Bassorah, Bagdad, and Manilla

to be free from cholera.

The following places continue to be considered

as dangerously infected with plague:-

Hindustan, with the exception of the Island of Ceylon, the Island of Mauritius, Upper Egypt, and the towns of Alexandria and Port Said.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated September 12, from His Majesty's Representative at Christiania, enclosing the following translation of a Circular issued by the Norwegian Authorities laying down certain Regulations against cholera:—

Department of Justice and Police, Christiania, 9th September, 1905.

By Virtue of the Law of the 26th June, 1893, and the Royal Proclamation of the 14th July, 1893, the following Regulations are laid down respecting

#### Precautions against cholera.

1. Persons arriving in Norway by land or sea from a district abroad infected, or declared to be infected, with cholera, either direct, or indirect through an uninfected district, shall on arrival at their destination in Norway at once report themselves to the Local Board of Health or to the Medical Officer chosen for the purpose. They shall also during the first five days after arrival in Norway report themselves daily to the Board of Health or its Medical Officer at the place where they pass a night or remain over twelve hours. Persons may report themselves direct, or indirectly through the person receiving them as lodgers.

2. All persons receiving travellers as lodgers are bound to report to the Local Board of Health, or its Medical Officer, immediately on the arrival of travellers from a district abroad infected, or declared to be infected, with cholera, and who have not yet been five days within the

frontiers of Norway.

3. Masters of vessels arriving at Norwegian ports from abroad, and who come within the provisions of section I of the Quarantine Regulations of the 4th September, 1893, are bound to place before the proper Customs Officials a list of

the ship's crew and passengers, stating each person's name, occupation, domicile, and address, and whether such person has stayed at a place infected with cholera (giving both place and

time)

4. Before the quarantine flag is allowed to be lowered on a vessel which is not placed in quarantine, the Quarantine Commission, or the inspecting physician, Customs Officer, or Senior Pilot acting for the same, shall fill out a pass for each traveller liable to report himself under the above Regulations. Should any traveller wish to leave the place of landing before the expiry of five days, the person issuing the pass must also report this to the Board of Health at the place where the traveller states his intention of first passing a night or staying longer than twelve hours. A list of persons bound to report themselves and who wish to reside temporarily on shore or leave the vessel shall be sent at once to the Director of the Medical Department, stating the destination of the persons named.

These Regulations shall come into force at

once.

Contravention of these Regulations shall be punishable under the common civil penal law, section 357, by fines or imprisonment not exceeding three months, unless otherwise more heavily punishable.

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 16TH SEPTEMBER 1905.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894

to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:
