Whereas by the North Eastern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1900, it is provided that a Secretary of State may, by notice published in any official Gazette published within the limits of the said Order, declare that any part of Africa within the limits of the said Order shall, until otherwise directed, be excepted from the application of the said Order, and that from the date of the publication of that notice in such official Gazette the part named in the said declaration shall be excluded from the limits of the said Order;

And whereas by the Barotziland North Western Rhodesia Order in Council, 1899, as amended by the Barotziland North Western Rhodesia Order in Council, 1902, it is provided that a Secretary of State may, from time to time by notice published in the Official Gazette of the High Commissioner for South Africa, declare that any parts of Africa north of the Zambesi and under the protection of His Majesty shall be included within the limits of the said Order, and that from the date of such publication in the said Gazette the said Order shall apply to the part named therein;

And whereas it is expedient that the parts of Africa north of the Zambesi hereinafter described should be excepted from the application of the North Eastern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1900, and should be included within the limits of the Barotziland North Western Rhodesia Order in Council, 1899;

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Alfred Lyttelton, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the said Orders in Council, hereby declare that the parts of Africa bounded on the north by the Congo Free State; on the west by the Territory of North Western Rhodesia; on the south by the River Zambesi; and on the east by a line drawn from the point where the Congo Zambesi watershed is cut by the meridian which passes through the point at which the Luapula River leaves Lake Bangweolo to the headwaters of the River Mlembo, thence along the centre of the channel of the River Mlembo to the junction of that river with the River Lukasashi, thence along the channel of the River Lukasashi to the junction of that river with the River Loangwa, and thence along the centre of the channel of the River Loangwa to the junction of that river with the River Zambesi, shall be excepted from the application of the North Eastern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1900, and shall henceforth be included within the limits of the Barotziland North Western Rhodesia Order in Council, 1899.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated September 20, from His Majesty's Representative at Budapest, intimating that in view of the outbreak of sporadic cholera in Galicia steps are being taken by the Sanitary Department of the Royal Hungarian Ministry of the Interior to establish a system of medical examination of passengers crossing the Galician frontier into Hungary.

Emigrants are being examined by Medical Officers at the railway stations of Budapest and Fiume, and a chief Sanitary Inspector has been sent to Fiume to organize the necessary preventive measures against cholera.

### No. 988.—BLACK SEA—RUSSIA.

Kertch Strait—Dredging in Progress; Regulations.
The Russian Government has given notice, dated 2nd September, 1905, that the work of dredging the channel through Kertch Strait to

a depth of 24 feet being now in progress, vessels must observe the following regulations:-

1. Vessels drawing less than 13 feet are to pass by the old channel.

2. Vessels of a greater draught than 13 feet are only allowed to navigate the dredged channel at certain times as follows :-

a. If bound to the westward (Sea of Azov to the Black Sea), from sunrise to 8 a.m. and from 1 P.M. to 5 P.M.

b. If bound to the eastward (Black Sea to Sea of Azov), from 9 A.M. to noon and from 6 P.M. to sunset

A red flag will be hoisted on board the guardship below the latter's own flag, when vessels may pass through the dredged channel; this signal will be repeated by the dredger.

The beacons marking the channel will be

removed if necessary for dredging purposes.

3. Vessels approaching the dredger must sound three prolonged blasts on the whistle or

4. Vessels are not to pass inside the area of the dredging operations, which is marked by

special buoys.

During the period when vessels may pass through the channel there will be at least 140 feet of space between the anchorage of the dredger and the side of the channel, while the chains of the dredger will be slackened on the side on which a vessel is passing. The barges lie on the outer side of the channel.

5. Steam vessels whilst passing the dredger

must stop their engines.

6. Sailing vessels navigating the channel, with a draught of more than 13 feet, must in the event of a contrary wind or other unfavourable circumstances, either take a tug or wait for a favourable wind: and shall only pass through the channel within the times mentioned in paragraph 2.
7. The entry into the channel or passage

through it is absolutely forbidden during fog,

thick mist, or bad weather.

By night, the anchorage of the dredger is

indicated by two electric lights.

8. Coasting vessels, which have received permission to pass through the channel at night, when approaching the dredger must leave the channel.

9. The guardship and Pilot Master are responsible that the present obligatory regulations are

carried out exactly.

10. Any person infringing these regulations, in addition to a penalty, will be responsible also for all damage caused to the dredger and her attendant vessels.
