Order under Section 3 of the Public Offices Fees Act, 1879.

Fees payable in the Office of Land Revenue Records and Involments.

Whereas by Section 3 of the Public Offices Fees Act, 1879, it is provided that the Treasury may from time to time make, and, when made, revoke, alter, and add to, regulations for all or any of the following purposes respecting Fees in any Public Office, that is to say:—

- Regulating the manner in which the Fees taken in money are to be accounted for and paid over.
- Determining the issue of Impressed or Adhesive Stamps and the mode of cancellation of Adhesive Stamps.
- 3. Regulating the use of stamps and prescribing the application thereof to documents from time to time in use and requiring documents to be used for the purpose of such stamps.

Now we, the undersigned, being two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, do in pursuance of the provisions of the Public Offices Fees Act, 1879, section 3, hereby give notice, order and direct that stamps used for denoting Fees taken in the Land Revenue Record Office shall be of the character and be applied and otherwise dealt with in the manner prescribed in the Schedule hereto, all previous Orders on the subject being hereby cancelled.

The Adhesive Stamps referred to in the Schedule hereto shall be overprinted with the words "Public Records (L.R.R. & I.)." The stamps shall all be cancelled by a hand stamp containing the word "cancelled" and the date or otherwise as the Commissioners of Inland Revenue may from time to time direct.

And we do further direct that this Order shall be binding on all Officers and persons whom it may in any way affect.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated September 11, from His Majesty's Representative at Petropolis, enclosing the following translation of a Decree of the Brazilian Government, published in the "Diario Official" of September 7, declaring the Port of Hamburg infected owing to cholera, and other ports of the German Empire to be suspected :-

Republic of the United States of Brazil.—The Minister of State for Justice and Interior in the name of the President of the Republic, having in view the official confirmation of the news of the appearance of sporadic cases of cholera-morbus in the city of Hamburg and in other parts of the German Empire, has decided to declare the said city and its port infected, and the other ports of the said Empire suspected, sailings therefrom being subjected to the provisions established by the sanitary regulation issued under decree No. 5156 of the 8th March, 1904; such provisions to be applicable to ships leaving the said ports after the 25th August last.

## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The operation of the provisions of Part II (Regulation of Exposure and Movement of Sheep in Compulsory Dipping Areas) of the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1905 shall be suspended in their application to the Compulsory Dipping Area described in the Schedule to this Order from and after the tenth day of October, nineteen hundred and five, until the fifteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and six.

and Fisheries have hereunto set their Official Seal this sixth day of October, nineteen hundred and five.

and easterly along the main road through Toft Hill to High Etherley, thence south-easterly along the main road leading to West Auckland to the point where that road is crossed by the Barnard Castle Branch of the North Eastern Railway, thence south-westerly along that railway to the point of commencement.
