The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated September 11, from His Majesty's Representative at Petropolis, enclosing the following translation of a Decree of the Brazilian Government, published in the "Diario Oficial" of September 7, declaring the Port of Hamburg infected owing to cholera, and other ports of the German Empire to be suspected:—

Republic of the United States of Brazil.—The Minister of State for Justice and Interior in the name of the President of the Republic, having in view the official confirmation of the news of the appearance of sporadic cases of cholera-morbus in the city of Hamburg and in other parts of the German Empire, has decided to declare the said city and its port infected, and the other ports of the said Empire suspected, sailings therefrom being subjected to the provisions established by the sanitary regulation issued under decree No. 5156 of the 8th March, 1904; such provisions to be applicable to ships leaving the said ports after the 25th August last.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated September 12, from His Majesty's Representative at Paramaribo, intimating that a notice was issued on the 5th September by the Government of Dutch Guiana, stating that owing to cases of yellow fever having occurred at St. Jean de Maroni, French Guiana, quarantine has been imposed against all vessels coming from the French shore of the Maroni River, or which may have had communication with vessels coming therefrom.
