ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 12rH OCTOBER 1905.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The provisions of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 shall not apply to the Exhibition intended to be held by the Birmingham Agricultural Exhibition Society at Bingley Hall, in the city of Birmingham, on or about the twenty-fifth day of November, nineteen hundred and five, and following days.

2. The provisions of the Birmingham (Swine-Fever) Orders of 1897 and 1905 shall not apply to or affect the movement out of the said city of swine exhibited at the said Exhibition provided that the same are so moved from the said Exhibition by the nearest available route and with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of the said city.
