The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated October 13, from His Majesty's Representative at Stockholm, enclosing a copy of the following Circular issued by the Royal Swedish Board of Trade with respect to quarantine in that country:—

In compliance with the Royal Order in Council of June 16th, 1905, the Board of Trade, upon official reports, hereby declare the government district of Stettin in Prussia free from cholera.

In accordance with the notices previously issued, the following places are considered as infected:

Egypt; Rio Grande, Porto Alegre, Rio de Janeiro, Victória, Aracaju, Maranhao, Pará, and Manaos in Brazil; Peru; Autofagasta and Pisagua in Chile; the provinces of Hedschas and Yemen in Arabia; the Ural territory in Asia; the ports of the Persian Gulf and Schatel-Arab; British East India; Rangoon in British Burma; the island of Sumatra; Manila on Luzon; the islands of Formosa and Hongkong; Hanoi in Tonkin; the ports of Newchwang, Foochow, and Amoy in China; Japan; Madagascar; Port Elisabeth, East London, and Durban, in British South Africa; and

With Cholera:-

The provinces of West-Prussia and Posen in Prussia; Asiatic Turkey; the ports of the Red Sea and the Persian Gulf; the ports of British East India; Cochinchina; Tonkin; China; Japan and Morocco.

ABERDEENSHIRE (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER OF 1905.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in

this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Detention of Animals.

- 1.—(1.) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority may serve a Notice (in the Form A set forth in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect) on the occupier of any stable, shed, field or other premises in which there is a horse, ass, or mule, which in his opinion is affected with, or suspected of, parasitic mange, and thereupon the following restrictions shall take effect:—
 - (i.) The horse, ass, or mule so affected or suspected shall not be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises specified in the Notice, except with the written authority, and under the supervision, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and only to some other place of detention;
 - (ii.) No other horse, ass, or mule shall be moved out of the stable, shed, field, or other premises, unless on each occasion immediately before the movement it is treated with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange

approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority;

(2.) A Notice under this Order shall remain in force until it is withdrawn by a Notice in writing served on the occupier of the premises by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

Extent.

2. This Order extends to the county of Aberdeen only.

Short Title and Construction.

3. This Order may be cited as the ABERDEEN-SHIRE (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER OF 1905, and shall be read with the Aberdeenshire (Parasitic Mange) Order of 1903.

2. No other horse, ass or mule shall be moved out of the premises specified in this Notice, unless on each occasion immediately before the movement it is treated with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 20TH OCTOBER 1905.)

DIPPING OF SHEEP (GLOUCESTERSHIRE) ORDER OF 1905.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations.

- 1. The Local Authority of any district specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make regulations—
 - (i.) for prescribing regulating and securing the periodical treatment by effective dipping of all sheep in the district, or in any part of the district specified in the regulations;
 - (ii.) for prescribing the separation of sheep dipped in accordance with regulations under this Order from sheep not so dipped, and, for such purpose, for prohibiting or regulating the movement of sheep along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare;
 - (iii.) for requiring returns by owners of sheep as to the sheep in their possession to be delivered to such persons, at such time, in such form, and with such particulars, as may be prescribed by the regulations;
 - (iv.) for requiring notice of intention to carry out the prescribed dipping to be given by the owner or person in charge of the sheep to be dipped to such person, at such time, in such form and with such particulars, as may be prescribed by the regulations;
 - (v.) for requiring evidence of dipping in compliance with the regulations to be furnished by the owner or person in charge of sheep to such person, at such time, in such form, and with such particulars as may be prescribed by the regulations;
 - (vi.) for prescribing and regulating the cleansing and disinfection of dipping places; and
 - (vii.) for authorising the sampling by an Inspector of the Local Authority of any dip which is being used for the dipping of sheep.

Confirmation of Regulations.

- 2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—
 - (i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the district four weeks at least before the making of the application.
 - (ii.) For four weeks at least before an application, a copy of the regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the district, and be open during office hours thereat to the

inspection of ratepayers of the district without fee or reward.

- (iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed regulations on payment of sixpence.
- (3.) A copy of any regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the regulations, without further or other proof.

Powers of Entry of Inspectors.

3. An Inspector of the Local Authority may, subject to their direction and for the purposes of any regulation under this Order, enter any premises and examine any sheep thereon.

Power to provide Dipping Places.

4. The Local Authority of any district specified in the Schedule to this Order may provide and fit up and maintain dipping places, but subject to the approval in writing by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries of the site of each dipping place; provided that no dipping place shall be used under this provision if its use would injuriously affect the water in any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, well, pond, or place constructed or used for the supply of water for drinking or other domestic purposes.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the Dipping of Sheep (Gloucestershire) Order of 1905.












Approaches to the Yang-tse-kiang; Saddle Islands; southern part of Yellow Sea.







