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At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 23rd day of October, 1905.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the churchwardens of the parish of Saint James, Well, in the North Riding of the county of York, of the parish of Saint Agnes, Cawston, in the county of Norfolk, and of the parish of Saint Mary, Weston Zoyland, in the county of Somerset, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representations, have, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, made representations stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial grounds should be opened in the civil parishes of Well, Cawston, and Weston Zoyland, without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz.:—

- WELL.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint James, Well, in the North Riding of the county of York.
- CAWSTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Agnes, Cawston, in the county of Norfolk; and in the churchyard, except as follows :—

In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

WESTON ZOYLAND.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Mary, Weston Zoyland, in the county of Somerset; and in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In an earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of Mrs. Elizabeth Bawdon at her decease.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representations, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the fourth day of December next:

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be atfixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representations one month before the said fourth day of December.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit: And whereas an Order in Council has been made directing the discontinuance of burials in the parish churchyard of Saint Mary, Leighton, in the county of Salop, from the time specified in such Order; and whereas the time for the discontinuance of burials therein, has, by Orders in Council been postponed to the thirtieth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and five, and whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyard be further postponed :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time appointed for the discontinuance of burials in the parish churchyard of Saint Mary, Leighton, in the county of Salop, be further postponed to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and five.

Gibraltar Harbour - Tidal Streams.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 852 of 1905:-

The following information, dated 22nd September, 1905, has been received from the Commander-in-Chief of the Atlantic Fleet respecting the set of the tidal streams in the entrances to Gibraltar Harbour :---

1. The flood stream entering the bay runs to the northward across the southern entrance to the harbour, striking the south end of the Detached Mole, one portion entering the harbour and setting to the northward on the inside of the Detached Mole, and sometimes spreading and extending to the eastern side of the harbour; the stream continues to the uorthward outside the Detached Mole past the northern entrance, but not perceptibly entering it. 2. When the stream is running to the southward outside the harbour, the current sets from the viaduct at the Commercial Mole to the north end of the Detached Mole, a portion of it going out of that entrance, but of very little strength, the other portion setting along the Detached Mole to the southward (on the inside) increasing in strength as it reaches the southern entrance, and setting directly across it on to the north-east angle of the New Mole Head with varying velocity (at times very strong), when it runs out round the Mole Head and joins the southern going stream outside.

3. Caution is required in passing through both entrances to the harbour, on account of the current which is setting with variable strength across both entrances.

It is recommended that ships intending to secure to the New Mole, or the mooring buoys abrenst of it, should proceed into harbour by the southern entrance, taking care to make the approach well to the northward.

If going alongside the Detached Mole, or securing to the mooring buoys abreast of it, ships should, if possible, enter the harbour by the northern entrance, and the best approach is made by passing to the northward of the southernmost coal hulk ("The Three Brothers").

Ships securing to mooring buoys abreast of Detached Mole, when going astern to pick up their buoys, invariably find their sterns deflected towards the Detached Mole, which is a point worth remembering when other ships are proceeding to the Detached Mole at the same time, as in the case of the arrival of a fleet.

## Cape D'Alprech Light-Intended Alteration in Character.

The French Government has given notice, dated 9th October, 1905, that, towards the end of the present or the beginning of the next year, Cape D'Alprech Light will be altered from red flashing to a white group flashing dioptric light showing groups of three flashes every fifteen seconds, thus:--flash, nine-tenths of a second; eclipse, two and one-tenth seconds; flash, nine-tenths of a second; eclipse, two and one-tenth seconds; flash, nine-tenths of a second; eclipse, eight and one-tenth seconds, having a light power of 18,000 candles. In other respects the light will be unaltered.

The following information, dated 29th September, 1905, has been received from Captain J. F. Parry, His Majesty's surveying-vessel "Egeria" respecting the dangers in Portier Pass, the result of a recent survey :---

1. The rock situated about half a cable southwestward of Race Point Lighthouse dries 4 feet at low water.

2. Romulus Rock has a depth of 5 feet (not  $2\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms) over it at low water, and is situated at a distance of 4 cables S. 16° W. from Race Point Lighthouse. A rocky head, with a depth of 4 feet over it at low water, exists at a distance of 4 cables S. 26° W. from Race Point Lighthouse.

Romulus Rock is the south-eastern extremity of a rocky patch,  $1\frac{1}{4}$  cables long in a N.W. by N. and S.E. by S. direction, and about one cable broad. The general depths between Romulus and Black Rocks are from 3 to 5 fathoms. Black Rock dries 11 feet at low water.

3. A shoal, with a depth of 24 feet over it at low water, exists at a distance of  $4\frac{9}{10}$  cables South from Race Point Lighthouse. There is another rocky head, with a depth of 5 fathoms over it, situated at a distance of half a cable N. 27° W. from this rock.

4. A large rocky patch,  $1\frac{1}{4}$  cables long in a N.N.W. and S.S.E. direction, and about 125 yards broad, and having several heads of from 3 to 6 feet over them at low water, exists nearly mid-way between Race Point and Valdes Island; the southernmost head of this danger is situated at a distance of  $2\frac{1}{10}$  cables N. 64° W. from Race Point Lighthouse.

5. A small rocky head, with a depth of 5 fathoms over it, exists at a distance of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  cables N 22° W. from Race Point Lighthouse.

Approximate position, Race Point Lighthouse, lat. 49° 1' N., long. 123° 35' W.

Owing to the oblique direction and strength of the tides in Portier Pass, and its very limited breadth, vessels should not make use of it.

## No. 1105.—CHINA SEA.

Flat, Nanshan, and West York Islands—Positions and Particulars of.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 1082 of 1905:-

Further information, dated 24th August, 1905, has been received through the Board of Trade that Mr. W. D. Prideaux, commanding United States naval collier "Nanshan," sent from Manila to relieve the crew of the British barque "West York," wrecked on a reef south-eastward from North Danger Reef in the China Sea, makes the following report respecting some islands and dangers between North Danger Reef and Palawan :---

a. Flat Island was found to be a flat, low, sandy island about 250 yards across. A reef extends in an easterly direction from it for a distance of 2 to 3 miles, and several discoloured patches were observed to the N.N. Eastward. The position of the island was ascertained to be lat. 10° 48' 15" N., long. 115° 50' 30" E., or about 16 miles to the south-eastward of the position shown on the Charts. The position formerly given, lat. 11° 3' N., long. 115° 42' E., was passed over without any sign of land being observed.

b. Nanshan Island. An island (now named Nanshan) covered with small trees, and about 600 yards across, was observed to be situated about 6 miles S.  $12^{\circ}$  W. from Flat Island, in approximately lat.  $10^{\circ}$  42' 30'' N., long.  $115^{\circ}$  49' 30'' E.

c. West York Island. This island is about one mile long and half a mile broad, covered with grass and trees, some of which are coccanut palms; it is fringed with a reef, which extends from it a quarter of a mile on the eastern side to fully 2 miles on the northern side; on the latter reef the ship "West York" was wrecked. An ancorage was found in 14 fathoms, coral, with the north point of the island bearing S. 25° W., distant  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles. Signs of former Chinese habitation were found, and it is apparently visited every year by fishermen from Hainau for the purpose of collecting Trapang, &c. The position of the island was ascertained to be lat. 11° 5' 45" N., long. 115° 1' 30" E.
