The following Address was presented to The King on Monday, the 16th instant, when Their Majesties, accompanied by Their Royal Highnesses The Prince and Princess of Wales, visited the City in order that His Majesty might lay the foundation stone of the new Post Office Buildings to be erected on a portion of the site formerly occupied by Christ's Hospital, or the Bluecoat School :--

To The KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty.

It was with feelings of great satisfaction that all ranks of the Post Office employees of London heard of Your Majesty's gracious intention to lay the Foundation Stone of the new Post Office Building; and I beg leave, in their name, to thank Your Majesty, and also Her Majesty the Queen who has so graciously accompanied Your Majesty on this occasion.

May I also be permitted to express the gratification of the whole staff at the presence of Their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales, and to assure Your Majesty of the earnest desire of all here present to-day that Their Royal Highnesses may have a happy voyage and a prosperous visit to Your Indian Empire, and a safe return to these shores?

Concerning the buildings in which the work of the General Post Office in London has been carried on in the past, it may be opportune to recall to Your Majesty's notice that what is now the old Post Office Building of Saint Martin'sle-Grand, built from the design of Sir Robert Smirke, was opened for business no longer ago than the 23rd September, 1829. It is difficult now to realize that at that time

It is difficult now to realize that at that time the sole service rendered to the public by the Post Office was the conveyance of letters and newspapers, and that the other branches of Post Office business, which now appear indispensable, are of more recent creation. I may mention, as some of the more important extensions, the issue of Money Orders, and of Postal Orders; the Parcel Post; the Savings Bank; the Telegraph, and, finally, the Telephone Service.

Moreover, the growth of population, the increase of commerce and industry, and the spread of education, have produced an enormous development in every branch of Post Office Work, with the result that, again and again, since 1829, the work has outgrown its accommodation; and to the once sufficient building of Smirke, known as the General Post Office East, have gradually been added the General Post Office West, South, and North, the vast building at Mount Pleasant, and the Savings Bank building at Earl's Court, of which Your Majesty laid the Foundation Stone. To illustrate to Your Majesty the pacessity for

To illustrate to Your Majesty the necessity for greater accommodation arising from this marvellous growth, I would venture to submit a few figures, comparing the London Postal Service of 1829 with that of to-day.

1829 with that of to-day. In 1829 the single St. Martin's-le-Grand building accommodated, with much room to spare, 800 officers, administrative, accounting, and operative; to-day postal operatives and controlling staff alone to the number of 3,536 occupy that building.

Although the population of London has, in the past 75 years, increased less than fourfold, the number of letters delivered has increased fiftyfold.

In 1829 the number of London Postmen was 564; they had some 400,000 letters a week to deliver; and the London Post Offices and posting receptacles numbered 425. In 1905 there are nearly 10,000 London Postmen with some twenty million letters a week to deliver; and the Post Offices and posting receptacles now number between four and five thousand.

The structure which Your Majesty is this day graciously pleased to found will stand upon a site of three acres and a half, the whole of which will not be at once occupied; so that ample work which may be confidently expected.

The ground now acquired for the needs of Your Majesty's General Post Office has much historical interest. Here in old time stood the Monastery of the Grey Friars. Here, after the Grey Friars had been ejected, their Convent was put to the uses of an orphanage; whence grew the foundation of Christ's Hospital, chartered by King Edward VI in 1552, more popularly known in later years as the Bluecoat School. Changed conditions rendered it necessary to remove that great school from the site in the centre of the city, where it had stood for more than three centuries, to a more suitable position in the country. A part of the ground which thus became vacant was purchased by the Governors of Saint Bartholomew's Hospital, our near neighbours, and the remainder provides the space now required to meet the growth of the Post Office.

Having regard to Your Majesty's presence here to-day, and also to the association of the site with King Edward VI, the Royal Founder of Christ's Hospital, there is special appropriate-ness in the name of King Edward's Building, which Your Majesty has approved for the new General Post Office now to be erected, and of this building I would now respectfully ask Your Majesty to lay the Foundation Stone. I am confident that, when it is completed, it will add much to the efficiency of the Postal Service of the Capital in which the lines of communication of the British Empire are concentrated, and thereby materially tend to increase the prosperity, not only of London, but of all parts of Your Majesty's Dominions.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:

"I am glad to be able to be present here today to receive your loyal Address, and to lay the foundation stone of the new Post Office Building, and the Queen is very pleased to accompany Me. I cordially appreciate your loyalty and devotion to My Throne and Person, and I thank you on behalf of the Prince and Princess of Wales for the good wishes you have expressed for their approaching journey to India and for their safe return.

"I well remember the occasion to which you refer, when I laid the foundation stone of the new Post Office Savings Bank Buildings at Earl's Court on behalf of Queen Victoria, My Dearly Beloved Mother, and this recollection increases the interest I feel in the ceremony which I am present here to-day to perform.

"The review which you have given of the continuous development of the various branches of the postal service shows to what a large extent all classes of My subjects are dependent upon the labours of the officers of the Post Office; and I am confident that all the members of the Department of every grade have worked faithfully and loyally with a view to attaining the greatest efficiency in the despatch of public business, and that they will continue to do so in the future.

"I have watched with the greatest interest the large growth of the Post Office, and I am specially pleased to know of the wide use made of the Savings Bank Institution, particularly by the working classes. It has been the source of much gratification to Me to learn how successful this Institution has been in encouraging thrift and in stimulating industry, virtues which will,

room will be afforded for that further growth of [I hope, always be characteristic of My people; and I feel that the marvellous success of the system is the highest tribute which can be paid to the administrative ability of those who conduct it.

> "I have also observed with great satisfaction the establishment and rapid growth of the telephone. I feel confident that this wonderful invention, which has already proved so useful in economising time and facilitating commercial transactions, will be found in the future to be capable of more extended use and wider development

> "I trust that the establishment of this new building, the site of which is rich in historical associations, and has been the scene of so much noble endeavour, may increase the efficiency of the various branches of the postal service, and, by giving additional facilities for intercommunication, assist in binding together the various portions of My Empire by still closer ties, and in establishing amongst the nations of the world that peace and goodwill which I have so much at heart.'

To Their Most Excellent Majesties The King and Queen.

The Dutiful and Loyal Address of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Councillors of the Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Poplar.

We, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Councillors of the Metropolitan Borough of Poplar, desire to avail ourselves of Your gracious permission to approach Your Majesty with an expression of our loyalty and devotion, on the occasion of the opening of the Kingsway and Aldwych, a great public improvement in which Poplar shares equally with the heart of London, and which has afforded employment for many of its workmen.

The deep sympathy and interest which Your Majesty and Your Majesty's Gracious and Royal Consort have at all times shown with the cares and welfare of the poorest of Your Majesty's subjects emboldens us to crave Your Majesty's notice of the grave position of many of the industrial population of this Borough, and other industrial centres by reason of the prolonged lack of employment.

Your Majesty has been graciously pleased to assent to the Unemployed (Workmen) Act, which, while setting up a useful organization, makes no provision for funds, other than by voluntary contribution, for affording employment; and this Borough having reached the utmost limits of its financial resources, both in respect of Poor Law Relief, and in the provision of employment by the Council, views with dread and alarm the prospect of another winter before the revival of trade in London enables the unemployed to become absorbed in the industrial occupations of the neighbourhood.

We feel that the problem of the Unemployed is one worthy of the attention of Parliament in a Special Session, with a view to the grant of Public Funds to enable the Central Bodies and Distress Committees, appointed under the Unemployed (Workmen) Act, to provide or contribute towards the provision of employment, and we humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to cause this expression to be considered by Your Majesty's responsible Ministers.

We humbly assure Your Majesty of our loyalty and devotion to Your Majesty's Person and Throne, and our profound regard for Your Majesty's Gracious and Royal Consort Her Majesty Queen Alexandra.

We humbly pray that Your Majesty may long be spared to reign over a united, prosperous, and contented people.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:----

"I thank you on behalf of the Queen and Myself for the loyal Address you have presented, and for the sentiments of devotion and regard to My Throne and Person which you have expressed.

"The welfare of the industrial classes has always been a matter of the gravest concern to Us, and We are deeply grieved to hear of the distress which prevails among many of the labouring population in your Borough and elsewhere, owing to lack of employment. The Queen specially desires Me to express Our heartfelt sympathy with the wives and children, who must, in these circumstances, endure such severe hardships.

"We hope and pray that the sufferings of those at present unemployed may speedily pass away with a revival of trade, and, in the meantime, be mitigated by the legislation enacted by My Parliament in its last Session.

"I will not fail to refer the suggestions in your Address to My Ministers, who will, I am confident, advise Me in such a way as may be consistent with wisdom and sound policy."

To Their Most Excellent Majesties The King and Queen.

The Dutiful and Loyal Address of the Chairman and Members of the Council of the Administrative County of London.

May it please Your Majesties,

We, the Chairman and Members of the London County Council, the representative authority of the capital of Your Majesty's Empire, desire respectfully to express our heartfelt thanks to Your Majesty for so graciously opening, for the benefit of the people of London, the great improvement which we have carried out, and to Her Majesty the Queen, who on this occasion, as on others, where the good of the people is concerned, is pleased sympathy.

Your Majesties will, we believe, recognize that among the great and pressing duties entrusted to our care in the local government of nearly five millions of Your Majesty's loyal subjects, there are few at this juncture of more importance than the clearing of insanitary areas and the opening up of facilities for traffic. The building of London, and particularly of its central parts, was undertaken so many years before its development into the greatest city of the world, that the difficulties in the way of making adequate pro-vision for modern requirements are very great; and we may remind Your Majesties that an improvement similar in object to that now happily completed by Your Majesties to-day was first submitted for approval to a Committee appointed by Parliament seventy years ago. We venture to claim for the Kingsway and Aldwych improvement a special degree of success, because it will at once be the most extensive improvement since the construction of Regent-street in 1820, and at the same time involve the least ultimate charge upon the ratepayers of London. It includes an underground tramway service through the central part of London which we hope will be permitted by Parliament to become a connecting link between north and south London. And we take pride in the fact that while it has caused the demolition of much undesirable property, the inhabitants displaced therefrom have been provided with healthier and better houses in the working class dwellings in which Your Majesties have shown such close and sympathetic interest. We beg leave to assure Your Majesties that the archi-Webeg tecture of the new streets, in which we know Your Majesties take great interest, will receive our earnest and most careful consideration, and we look forward to the immediate future when these two great thoroughfares will have realized our intention and form one of the most beautiful features of Your Majesty's capital.

We desire to tender to Your Majesties our humble and grateful thanks for the encouragement afforded to us by the interest always evinced by Your Majesties in the welfare of London, and we hope that on the occasions of Your Majesties' residence in London the evidence of our constant endeavours to improve the con-dition of its people will be always apparent.

We pray that Your Majesties may long be spared to live in health and strength, continuing to exhibit for all parts of the Empire such care and concern as we see in the capital on whose behalf we address Your Majesties to-day, and as will be seen in India when Their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales carry to its Princes and people Your Majesties' gracious message of hope and goodwill.

"I thank you on behalf of the Queen and Myself for your loyal and dutiful Address and for your good wishes for Our welfare.

"It gives Me great pleasure to be present here to day to open the magnificent streets which are to be known as Aldwych and Kingsway, and the Queen is very glad to be able to accompany Me on this occasion.

"The additional routes for traffic which these new streets provide will, I have no doubt, assist

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Devon) Order, 1905.

Dated 2nd November, 1905.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Devon, I hereby make the following Order :--

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild'Birds Protection (County of Devon) Order, 1905."

BIRDS.

Close Time extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended throughout the County of Devon, so as to be between the 31st day of January and the 1st day of September in each year :--

Bittern, Curlew or Whaup, Dotterel, Dunlin (Ploverspage, Purre or Sealark), Gannet or Solan Goose, Grebe, Hobby, Lark, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker or Night Hawk), Nutcracker, Nuthatch, Oriole, Richard's Pipit, Water Pipit, Plover (Lapwing or Peewit), Puffin (Coulterneb or Sea Parrot), Razorbill, Sanderling, Sandpiper, Summer Snipe or Otterling, Stone Curlew or Thick Knee, Tern or Sea Swallow, Whimbrel.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County of Devon to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the said Act:

Snow Bunting. Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Hobby, Kestrel, Merlin, Nutcracker, Nuthatch, Osprey, Richard's Pipit, Water Pipit, Lesser Redpoll, Mealy Redpoll, Bearded Titmouse.

The Shag and Cormorant deprived of protection in certain Districts.

IV. Those parts of the Administrative County of Devon which are comprised within the limits of the Axe, Exe, Dart, and Teign Fishery Districts, respectively, shall be exempted from the operation of the Act of 1880 as to the following Birds :-

Shag, Cormorant.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Act of 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not extend, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Devon :--

Cirl Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Cornish Chough, Goldfinch, Guillemot or Willock, Gulls, Hawfinch, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kittiwake or Tarrock, Osprey, Owls, Oyster Catcher, Lesser Redpoll, Reeve or Ruff. Bearded Tit, Woodpecker, Wren, Golden-crested Wren.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Devon, viz. :--

Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Bittern, Little Bittern, Chough, Common Crossbill, Dipper, Dunlin (Ploverspage, Purre or Sealark), Rock Dove, Peregrine Falcon, Fire Crest, Pied Flycatcher, Gannet, Goldfinch, Common Guillemot, Great Black-backed Gull, Lesser Black-backed Gull, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hawfinch, Night Heron, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Ring Ouzel, Oaprey, Oyster Catcher, Barn Owl, Long-eared Owl, Tawny Owl, Rose-coloured Pastor, Quail, Raven, Razorbill, Redstart, Green Sandpiper, Common Snipe, White Wagtail, Blackheaded Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Woodcock, Woodlark, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Eggs protected in certain Areas.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the following areas until the end of the year 1910:—

(i.) Lundy Island and the neighbouring islets.

(ii.) Baggy Point district, situate in the parish of Georgeham, and bounded by the sea from the coast off Croyde Bay House to that off Vention Cottages, and thence by the roads passing near Croyde Village, by way of Vention-lane, Stentaway-lane and Moorlane, to the coast off Croyde Bay House.

- (iii.) Clovelly district, being the parishes of Abbotsham, Alwington, Clovelly, Hartland, l'arkham, Welcombe, and Woolfardisworthy (West).
- (iv.) Lynton district, being the parishes of Lynton and Countisbury.
- (v.) Slapton Ley and Start district, being the parishes of Stokenham, Slapton, and Blackawton.

Repeal of former Order.

VIII. The Order of the 8th July, 1903, is hereby repealed.

THE MOTOR CARS REGULATION (COUNTY OF ARGYLL) (No. 1) ORDER, 1905, dated October 31st, 1905, prohibiting Motor Car Traffic on certain Highways in the County of Argyll (District of the Island of Mull).

The column at the inner end of the northern breakwater has been removed.

b. The green and white vertical lights formerly exhibited on the head of the south breakwater extending from Cape Themistocles have been replaced by two green fixed lights shown from an iron support, the upper light being elevated 40 feet above the sea.

The sea has made breaches in both the abovementioned breakwaters, which may render the lights inaccessible for lighting, they must there-fore be considered unreliable.
