WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Gloucester) Order, 1905.

Dated 9th November, 1905.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me unto Dashwood Poyntz Ricketts, Esq., District by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, Engineer of the Imperial Railways of North and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Gloucester, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Gloucester) Order, 1905."

BIRDS.

Close Time extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the County of Gloucester, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of November in each year:—

Hoopoe, Short-eared Owl, Redpole, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

The House Sparrow and Woodpigeon deprived of protection.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act. 1880, shall not apply within the County of Gloucester to the House Sparrow and the Woodpigeon.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Gloucester:—

Bittern, Cirl Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Stone Curlew, Dipper (Water Ouzel), Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Nightjar, Ring Ouzel, Long-eared Owl, Great Grey Shrike, Siskin, Great Snipe (Solitary Snipe), Woodlark.

All Birds protected on Sundays in certain Districts.

V. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited in such parts of the County of Gloucester as lie within the Districts of the several undermentioned Urban and Rural District Councils:—

Urban District Councils:—Awre, Charlton Kings, Cheltenham, Cirencester, Coleford, Kingswood, Newnham, Stroud, Tetbury, Tewkesbury, Westbury-on-Severn.

Rural District Councils:—Cheltenham, Cirencester, East Dean and United Parishes, Gloucester, Newent, Stroud, Tetbury, Tewkesbury, Thornbury, Warmley, West Dean, Wheatenhurst.

And also within the Parishes of Filton, Stoke Gifford, and Winterbourne, in the Chipping Sodbury Rural District.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is for the period of 5 years next ensuing prohibited throughout the County of Gloucester:—

Cirl Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Dipper (Water Ouzel), Goldfinch, Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover),

Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goatsucker, Night Hawk, or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Owl (all species), Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Grasshopper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Wood Warbler, Woodcock, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Repeal of former Order.

VII. The Order of the 14th November, 1902, is hereby repealed.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Prohibition of Movement of swine into out of or within Scheduled District.

1. No swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District.

Prohibition of Movement of swine out of the County Borough of Derby.

2. No swine shall be moved out of the county borough of Derby.

Provision for through Movement.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine into or out of the Scheduled District, or to movement out of the county borough of Derby, where they are moved through such District or borough, as the case may be, by railway from a place outside such District or borough to another place outside such District or borough without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within such District or borough.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

5.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and

the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act,

1894.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the DERBY AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1905.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and five.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We, the Local Government Board, may, by Regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, restrict the driving of any motor cars or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in Our opinion, be especially dangerous;

And whereas the Town Council of the Borough of Torquay having applied to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned sections prohibiting the driving of motor cars on a certain highway known and hereinafter referred to as Anstey's Cove-road, and situate in the Borough of Torquay, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and such Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now, therefore, after consideration of the said Report and of all the circumstances of the case, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of our powers in that behalf, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—A person shall not drive a motor car on the highway known as Anstey's Coveroad at a speed exceeding five miles per hour.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made this 16th day of October, 1905, by the LEAMING-TON AND WARWICK ELECTRICAL COMPANY Limited, under the powers conferred on the Company by the "Tramway Act, 1870."

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Bye-

laws or Regulations.

2. Every person shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's plat-

form, and not otherwise.

3. No person shall smoke inside any carriage, or any compartment of a carriage, not especially provided for that purpose. Any person offending against this Bye-law is liable, in addition to incurring the penalty below mentioned, to be summarily removed at the first opportunity from the carriage.

4. No person shall spit in, upon, or against any

carriage.

5. No person shall while travelling in or upon any carriage play or perform upon any musical instrument.

6. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount on any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of

any passenger.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number-plate, printed or other notice or advertisement, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

9. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

10. Each passenger shall, on demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorized officer of the Company, the fare legally demandable for

the journey.

11. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized officer of the Company, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

12. Any ticket for the time being issued by the Company in respect of fares shall be available only for the carriage on or for which it is issued (except in the case of transfer or season tickets), and no passenger after leaving any carriage for any purpose whatever shall be entitled to resume his journey on the same or on any other carriage without payment of a fresh fare from

the point at which the passenger again entered the same or other carriage.

13. No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface his ticket so as to render the number, or any material portion thereof, illegible.

14. No passenger shall use or attempt to use a ticket on any day for which such ticket is not available, or use a ticket which has already been

used on a previous journey.

15. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, shall not use or attempt uo use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

16. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof

of any carriage.

17. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Company, shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand on the roof, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and any passenger or other person so acting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

18. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall board a carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a

carriage.
19. When any carriage contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the carriage, is provided in such interior, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

When any carriage contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the carriage, is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.

20. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to euter, mount, or leave any carriage

whilst in motion.

21. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately on request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

22. No person shall enter, get upon, or travel in or on any carriage with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

23. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty upon, or in connection with, any carriage or tramway of the Company

24. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.

25. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

26. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Company and having charge of a carriage.

27. There shall be placed and kept placed in " a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

28. These Bye-laws shall come into force on

the first day of January, 1906.

29. The Bye-laws made by the Company and certified by the Board of Trade, on the 14th March, 1882, are hereby repealed.
