#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Cambridge) Order, 1905.

Dated 17th November, 1905.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Cambridge, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Cambridge) Order, 1905."

#### BIRDS.

*The Great Bustard, the Goldfinch and the Little Owl protected during the whole of the Year.*

II. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year, and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the Great Bustard, the Goldfinch and the Little Owl is prohibited throughout the County of Cambridge.

#### EGGS.

*All Eggs protected within a certain Area.*

III. The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' Eggs is prohibited within that part of the County of Cambridge known as Wicken Sedge Fen for a period of three years from the date of this Order.

#### Repeal of former Order.

IV. The Order of the 2nd April, 1904, is hereby repealed.

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 15TH NOVEMBER 1905.)

## POOLE AND DISTRICT (SWINE - FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1905.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

### *Movement of swine into out of or within Scheduled District.*

1. No swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District,

or be moved along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

3.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Short Title.*

4. This Order may be cited as the POOLE AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1905.

## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 16TH NOVEMBER 1905.)

### PORTSMOUTH (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER OF 1905.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in

them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1908, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.*

1.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from animals not so affected or suspected; and (b) with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected or suspected to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the horse, ass, or mule so affected or suspected is.

(2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

*Veterinary Inquiry by Local Authority as to existence of Parasitic Mange.*

2.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving information of the existence, or supposed existence, of parasitic mange shall forthwith cause inquiry to be instituted as to the correctness of such information with the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector, or of a veterinary practitioner qualified according to the Act of 1894 to be a Veterinary Inspector.

(2.) The owner and occupier of any premises on which there is a horse affected with, or suspected of, parasitic mange, shall give all reasonable facilities for the inquiry by the Local Authority under this Article, and any person failing to give such facilities shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Detention of Animals.*

3.—(1.) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority may serve a Notice (in the Form A set forth in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect) on the occupier of any stable, shed, field or other premises in which there is a horse, ass, or mule, which in his opinion is affected with parasitic mange, and thereupon the following restrictions shall take effect:—

(i.) The horse, ass, or mule so affected shall not be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises specified in the Notice, except with the written authority, and under the supervision, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and only to some other place of detention; and during the detention it shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, be treated by the owner thereof with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority;

(ii.) No other horse, ass, or mule shall be moved out of the stable, shed, field, or other premises, unless on each occasion immediately before the movement it is treated with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority.

(2.) A Notice under this Order shall remain in force until it is withdrawn by a Notice in writing served on the occupier of the premises by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

*Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.*

4.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic

mange, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:

(i.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about, any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange:

(ii.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be effected:

(iii.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect any such place, utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things, at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee, or occupier:

(iv.) For requiring the removal by the owner from contact with horses, asses, or mules, of litter used for or about any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange.

(2.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, or to remove any litter, in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, to be cleansed and disinfected, or to remove such litter, and to recover summarily the expenses thereby incurred from such person.

(3.) Where the power conferred by the preceding provisions of this Article is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee, or occupier of the place to be cleansed and disinfected shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

*Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.*

5.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Order.

(2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

*Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.*

6. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences or procedure.

*Exemption of Army Veterinary Department and Veterinary Colleges.*

7. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass, or mule kept in stables of military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Department, or in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

*Offences.*

8.—(1.) If a horse, ass, or mule is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice under

this Order, the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the horse, ass, or mule is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of this Order, or of any Regulation made thereunder, the owner and the lessee and the occupier and the person in charge of any place or thing in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any owner, occupier, or person in charge of premises requiring to be cleansed and disinfected fails to give the facilities to a Local Authority required under this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Interpretation.

9. In this Order—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Extent.

10. This Order extends to the county borough of Portsmouth only.

#### Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and five.

#### Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the PORTSMOUTH (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER of 1905.

Motor Car Act, 1903: Regulations under  
Section 8:—

# **BOROUGH OF KINGSTON-UPON-THAMES.**

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We, the Local Government Board, may, by Regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, restrict the driving of any motor cars or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in Our opinion, be especially dangerous;

And whereas the Town Council of the Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned sections restricting the driving of motor cars on certain highways or parts of highways situate within the Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames (hereinafter referred to as "the Borough"). We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, do hereby, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—A person shall not drive a motor car at a greater speed than ten miles an hour on the highways or parts of highways within the Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the fourth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and five.

## **SCHEDULE.**

To enable the Company to collect, impound, take, use, divert and appropriate for the purposes of their Undertaking all such springs, streams and waters as will or may be intercepted by the Company's works or as may be found in or under any of the lands for the time being belonging to the Company.

6. To enable the Company by compulsion or agreement to purchase and acquire and to hold lands in the before-mentioned parishes and places for the purposes of the said intended works and for other purposes of the intended Act and of the Company's Undertaking, and also to acquire by compulsion or agreement, and to hold for the purposes aforesaid the lands hereinafter described or referred to, that is to say:—

19. To provide that all mortgages of the Company shall be trustees investments within the meaning of section 1 of the Trustee Act, 1893.

20. To alter, amend, or repeal such of the provisions of section 18 of the Borough of Portsmouth Waterworks Act, 1857, as have reference to the qualification as regards place of residence of any of the directors or chairman of the

Company, and if deemed necessary to make other provisions with reference thereto.

21. To empower the Company from time to time to make, vary, and rescind bye-laws, rules, or regulations for the purpose of carrying into effect any of the provisions of the intended Act, to prescribe penalties for securing compliance with any such bye-laws, rules, and regulations, and to make provision for imposing, demanding, and recovering penalties and for the application thereof.

22. To alter, amend, extend, or repeal all or some of the provisions of the Borough of Portsmouth Waterworks Acts and Orders, 1857 to 1902, and any other Acts relating to the Company, and in particular the provisions hereinbefore referred to.

9. To empower the Council to work and use the intended tramway by means of carriages and vehicles propelled by electrical power applied on either the conduit or overhead systems or otherwise, or any mechanical power (and to supply such power for that purpose from any generating station of the Council for the time being existing or authorized or hereafter authorized), or by animal power, and for that purpose or any purpose appurtenant or ancillary thereto to confer on the Council such rights, powers and privileges as may be necessary or expedient for carrying into effect the purposes of the intended Act, and to enter upon and open the surface of and to lay down on, in, under or over the surface of any street, road, footway, bridge or place such posts, conductors, wires, tubes, mains, plates, cables, boxes and apparatus, and to make and maintain such openings and ways in, on or under any such surface, and to attach to any house or building such supports, brackets and fittings as may be necessary or convenient either for the actual working of the tramway or for providing access to or in connection with any generating or other stations, engines, machinery or apparatus, or for connecting any portions of the tramways and light railways of the Council, and to empower the Council for the purpose of working the said tramway to erect engines and machinery, and to acquire and hold patent and other rights and licences, and to use patent and other rights and licences in relation to any such electrical power.

10. To empower the Council to enter upon, open and break up the surface of, alter, cross and stop up, and divert or otherwise interfere with streets and roads, bridges, tramways, footways, railways, watercourses, sewers, drains, pipes,

tubes, wires, apparatus, matters and things or any of them for the purposes of the aforesaid tramway and works or of the intended Act.

11. To empower the Council from time to time and either temporarily or permanently to make, maintain, alter, remove or abandon such tramways, crossings, deviations, sidings, junctions, curves, turnouts, turntables and other works in addition to those particularly specified in this Notice as may be necessary or convenient for the efficient working of the tramway or otherwise in the interests of the Council, or for facilitating the passage of traffic along streets or roads, or for providing access to any stations, power-houses, engine-houses, stables, carriage-houses, works or buildings of the Council, and to enable the Council to make junctions and connections from the intended tramway with any other tramways or light railways existing, authorized or hereafter authorized.

12. To empower the Council from time to time to convert single lines into double or interlacing lines, or double lines into single or interlacing lines or interlacing lines into double or single lines on the intended tramway.

To enable the Council to levy tolls, rates and charges for the use of the tramway and for the conveyance of passengers and traffic thereon, and to confer, vary or extinguish exemptions from the payment of such tolls, rates and charges, and to alter existing tolls, rates and charges and any exemptions therefrom.

To empower the Council, notwithstanding anything contained in the Tramways Act, 1870, to lease the intended tramway or some part or parts thereof to the Metropolitan Electric Tramways Limited (hereinafter called "the Tramways Company"), and to enable the Tramways Company to take a lease thereof and to have and exercise all or any of the powers to be conferred upon the Council, and to provide that any such lease as aforesaid may be for such period exceeding the period limited by the Tramways Act, 1870, as the intended Act may prescribe.

15. To empower the Council or their lessees on the one hand, and the North Metropolitan Electric Power Supply Company (hereinafter called "the Supply Company") or any company, body or person authorized to supply electricity in any district in which the intended tramway or any part of the Undertaking of the Council (including any tramways or light railways for the time being belonging to or leased to or worked by the Council) is situate on the other hand, to enter into and carry into effect agreements with respect to the supply to the Council or their lessees of electrical power for the purposes of the intended tramway or their Undertaking (including as aforesaid), and to empower the Supply Company or any such company, body or person to supply electrical power accordingly for use by the Council or their lessees, either within or beyond the area of supply of the company, body or person supplying the same.

16. To empower the Council and the London County Council to enter into and carry into effect contracts and agreements with respect to the construction, working, use, management and maintenance by the London County Council of the intended tramway or some part or parts thereof, and with respect to the carrying out of all or some of the proposed road widenings and the acquisition of lands, and to confer upon the London County Council the powers necessary for

To incorporate in the intended Act and extend and apply to the intended tramway and works, with or without modification or amendment or exception, all or some of the powers and provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, and so far as may be deemed expedient to alter, amend, repeal, render inapplicable or extend all or some of the provisions of that Act (and in particular

to exempt the Council and the intended tramway from the provisions of section 43 thereof) and of the Middlesex County Council Tramways Act, 1902; the County of Middlesex Light Railways Order, 1901, and any other Act or Order relating to the Council or to their tramways or light railways or any of them; the Metropolis Management Acts, 1855 to 1893, and any other Act or Acts relating to the London County Council or their tramways or the local management of the metropolis; the North Metropolitan Tramways Act, 1869, and any other Act or Acts relating to the Tramways Company or their Undertaking; and the North Metropolitan Electric Power Supply Act, 1900, and any other Act or Acts relating to the Supply Company or their Undertaking.

24.
