The KING has been pleased to confer the Albert Medal of the Second Class upon Mr. Edward Nicholls, a miner employed in the Lake View Consols Mine, Kalgoorlie, Western Australia, for conspicuous gallantry displayed in attempting to save the life of a fellow miner, as detailed below:—

On the 18th April, 1905, Nicholls (with two other miners, Bentley and King) was working in a "stope" on the 1,200 feet level of the Lake View Consols Mine, at Kalgoorlie. He and his comrades had charged a round of holes with dynamite, had lit the fuses, and were in the act of retiring to the level below for safety. Bentley had not retreated more than ten feet when one of the charges exploded. Nicholls was six or eight feet further away down the "stope," and, consequently, partially sheltered from the force of the explosion. All lights were put out by the explosion and the mine was in complete darkness. Nicholls called to ascertain if any one was hurt, and hearing the groans of his comrade Bentley, groped his way back to the top of the rill (which is the name of the pyramid forming the floor of the "stope"), in this case about 40 feet high. On the top of the rill he found Bentley, on whose body a big stone was resting. He had to roll this stone away before he could move him, but he succeeded, at the peril of his own life, in getting his comrade down the rill. While they were at the foot of the rill the other holes exploded. Bentley subsequently died of the injuries he had sustained.

When Nicholls returned to aid his comrade, the lighted fuses of four other charged holes were burning, and other explosions were momentarily to be expected. The fuses averaged 6 feet in length, and the rate of burning was about 90 seconds per yard, that is to say, the explosions were timed to take place within 3 minutes of the lighting of the fuses.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Temporary Order: Relief to able-bodied Men, their Wives, and Families:—

PARISH OF SAINT MARY, ISLINGTON.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Mary, Islington;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order, dated the 1st day of January, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Parish of Saint Mary, Islington, the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of out-door relief to poor persons in the said Parish:

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Parish;

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

Article I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Mary, Islington, may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

Article II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and

Article II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the Workhouse, the wife and family of any ablebodied male person who is relieved in the Work-

house.

(2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the Workhouse, shall not be absent from the Workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for a period exceeding twelve hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians.

(3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the Workhouse without any contravention of subdivision (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the Workhouse, without being set to work during the time, or any part of the time, of his absence.

Article III.—This Order shall operate and have effect during a period not exceeding six calendar months from the date of the said Order.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction of two hundred pounds sterling which has been paid to us in favour of the consolidated chapelry and benefice (hereinafter called the benefice) of Saint Aidan, Bamber Bridge, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, and in respect of which we have agreed to pay to the Incumbent of the same benefice, and to his successors, a yearly sum of six pounds, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twentyninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant out of our common fund to the said benefice of Saint Aidan, Bamber Bridge, to meet such benefaction, one other capital sum of two hundred pounds, in respect of which so long as the same capital sum, or any part thereof, shall remain in our hands, there shall be paid by us to the Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice one other yearly sum of six pounds, or such part thereof as shall be proportionate to any balance of the same capital sum which shall so remain in our hands; the above-mentioned yearly payments to com-mence as from the twenty-ninth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, and to be receivable in equal quarterly portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and on the first day of November in each and every year; and we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a further benefaction of one hundred pounds sterling which has been paid to us in favour of the aforesaid benefice of Saint Aidan, Bamber Bridge, do hereby

in pursuance of sections five and eleven of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, also grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said benefice, to meet such further benefaction, one other capital sum of one hundred pounds, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said benefice, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of two pounds and ten shillings per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Saint Aidan, Bamber Bridge.
