## GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board:—

## PARISH OF HAMMERSMITH.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Hammersmith:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, bearing date the eighth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, which is in force in the Parish of Hammersmith, certain rules and regulations were made relating to the administration of relief to the Poor; and by Article 182 of the said Order provision was made for the payment of special fees to Medical Officers in certain cases;

And whereas it is expedient to suspend, as hereinafter mentioned, the operation of the said Article as regards the Medical Officer for the No. 1 Medical Relief District of the said Parish:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us

by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby suspend the operation, until We by Order shall otherwise direct, of Article 182 of the above cited Order with respect to the Medical Officer for the time being for the No. 1 Medical Relief District of the said Parish.

## No. 1304.—CANADA, NOVA SCOTIA—SOUTH COAST.

*Lunenburg Bay Approach—Whistle Buoy Replaced by Whistle and Light-buoy.*

The Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, dated 9th November, 1905, that the whistle buoy, painted in red and black horizontal bands, situated in the approach to Lunenburg Bay, at a distance of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles S. 50° W. from Cross Island Lighthouse, has been replaced by a whistle buoy, painted in a similar manner, exhibiting a white light occulted at short intervals.

Approximate position, lat. 44° 17' N., long. 64° 11' W.

## No. 1305.—JAPAN, KIUSIU, WEST COAST—HIRADO NO SETO APPROACH.

*Fuku Se—Light Beacon Destroyed.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 1088 of 1904:—

Information, dated 13th October, 1905, has been received from Captain E. F. B. Charlton, His Majesty's Ship "Hecla," that the cylindrical stone beacon, painted in red and white horizontal bands, established on Fuku Se, Hirado No Seto approach, from which an unwatched white fixed light was exhibited, has disappeared, and that this rock is now unmarked either by day or night.
