This day had Audience of The King:—

Chang Ta-Jên, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from His Majesty the Emperor of China, to take leave of His Majesty on his departure from England.

*Whitehall, December 4, 1905.*

The KING has been pleased to grant unto Charles Edward Morris, of Wood Eaton Manor, in the parish of Church Eaton and county of Stafford, and of Oxon, in the parish of St. Chad and county of Salop, Esquire, and unto Isabel Margaret Hay, his wife, only daughter of Thomas Slaney Eyton, late of Walford Hall, in the parish of Baschurch, and of Eyton, in the county of Salop, Esquire, deceased, His Royal licence and authority that they may, in compliance with a clause in a Deed of Settlement bearing date the seventeenth day of September, 1859, take and henceforth use the surname of Eyton in addition to and after that of Morris, that he, the said Charles Edward Morris, may bear the arms of Eyton quarterly with his own family arms, and that such surname and arms may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by

the issue of their marriage; the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.
