#### PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it was enacted that, in case it appeared to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground should be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case might require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances might require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it should please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by

the Privy Council, should be published in the London Gazette, and should be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation was so considered; provided also, that no such representation should be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation should have been given to the Incumbent and vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice

as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the churchwardens of the parish of All Saints, Wigan, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representation, made a representation stating that they were of opinion that so much of the Orders in Council of the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, as relate to burials in the churchyard of the said parish, should be varied as hereinafter set forth:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the twenty-ninth day of May last to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the tenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and five, and copies thereof have been affixed as

required by the said first recited Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that so much of the Orders in Council of the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, as relate to burials in the churchyard of the parish of All Saints, Wigan, be varied by substituting for the directions contained in the said Orders with regard to the said churchyard the following directions, viz.:-

WIGAN.-That burials be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the churchyard of the Parish Church of All Saints, Wigan.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regu-

2. (b) The period for which the transfer is to be made is 25 years from the 19th day of May, 1903.

(c) Payment is to be made :-

(1) By the Council to the Company for all land, buildings, plant, apparatus, articles, and things supplied, and for work done by the Company under the said Order, in accordance with the Council's authority, and a schedule of prices agreed upon and signed by the engineers to the Council and the Company respectively, and upon the certificate of the engineer of the Council.

1.—The amount of £55,314 9s. 8d. charged to Capital Account as the cost of obtaining the Company's Special Acts and for preliminary work in connection therewith, and with the obtaining of Contracts, &c., includes a sum of £30,000 paid (partly in Shares and partly in Debentures) as remuneration to the South Wales Electrical Power Distribution Company Limited over and above the expenses actually incurred by that Company. A question of legal construction might arise as to whether this payment strictly comes within the powers conferred upon the Company by its Special Acts, or under the general law, and, if not, whether it can properly be charged to Capital Account. On the other hand, if it is legally within the power of the Company, the amount of remuneration appears to be a question entirely within its discretion.

2.—A somewhat similar question might arise in regard to a sum of £46,793 4s. Od. included in the item of £55,643 3s. Od., charged to the same account as the cost of issuing capital—of this sum about £11,000 consists of commission (other than ordinary brokerage) allowed for underwriting a portion of the Capital, and £35,000 appears to have been paid partly as a consideration for taking up £50,000 of the Company's Debentures, and partly for guaranteeing or procuring subscription of £125,000 of the share capital of the Company. I am not aware of any authority or power under which the underwriting of shares could (at all events without the concurrence of the Shareholders) be made the subject of a charge against the funds of the Company, although the power to issue debentures at a discount, or to allow

a commission upon their issue is not, I believe, open to doubt,

3.—I have not considered that it comes within my duty as Auditor to adjudicate upon the difficult points of legal construction involved in these questions, but I think it right to point out (1) that although the total initial expenditure incurred in the preliminary stages of this enterprise appears to have been large, there can be no doubt that the Promoters rendered valuable services to the Company in preparing for and obtaining the Act of incorporation, without which it is probable that it would not have come into existence. (2) That the amount of the remuneration paid to the limited company was duly published in the Prospectus inviting subscription of capital by the public, and (3) that the fact of an underwriting contract having been entered into was also disclosed in the Prospectus, although the amount was not stated, and I have no reason to believe that the money required to put the Company in a position to fulfil the objects for which it was incorporated, could under the then existing circumstances have been procured on more favourable terms.

4.—I understand that the Directors are considering the propriety of inviting the Shareholders to pass a formal resolution transferring the whole of the preliminary expenses, including the cost of obtaining the Act of Parliament, and of the promotion of the Company, and the issue of its capital, to a special suspense account to be paid off out of the profits of the undertaking by a series of annual payments spread over a series of years. I am of opinion that if this is done, it will tend to facilitate the administration of the Company's affairs, and to strengthen its financial position.
