### By the KING. A PROCLAMATION

For Dissolving the present Parliament, and declaring the calling of another.

EDWARD R. & I.

Whereas We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to dissolve this present Parliament which stands prorogued to Monday, the fifteenth day of January instant: We do, for that end, publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby dissolve the said Parliament accordingly: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are discharged from their meeting and attendance on the said Monday, the fifteenth day of January instant: And We being desirous and resolved, as soon as may be, to meet Our People, and to have their advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all Our loving Subjects Our Royal Will and Pleasure to call a new Parliament: And do hereby further declare, that, with the advice of Our Privy Council, We have given Order that Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain and Our Chancellor of Ireland do, respectively, upon notice thereof, forthwith issue out Writs, in due form and according to Law, for calling a new Parliament: And We do hereby also, by this Our Royal Proclamation under Our Great Seal of Our United Kingdom, require Writs forthwith to be issued accordingly by Our said Chancellors, respectively, for causing the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons who are to serve in the said Parliament to be duly returned to, and give their attendance in, Our said Parliament on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of February next, which Writs are to be returnable in due course of Law.

## By the KING. A PROCLAMATION

In order to the Electing and Summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland.

EDWARD R. & I.

Whereas We have in Our Council thought fit to declare Our Pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of February next ensuing the date hereof: In order, therefore, to the electing and summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland who are to sit in the House of Peers in the said Parliament, We do, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holyrood House, in Edinburgh, on Tuesday, the thirtieth day of January instant, between the hours of twelve and two in the afternoon, to nominate and choose the Sixteen Peers to sit and vote in the House of Peers in Peers to sit and vote in the House of Peers in the said ensuing Parliament by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent (such Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing duly signed before Witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to law): and the Lord Clerk Register, or the two Principal Clerks of the Session appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their Votes, and immediately after such Election made and duly examined to certify the Names of the Sixteen Peers so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the Electors, and return such Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: And We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly command and require the Provost of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the said city, to take especial care to preserve the peace thereof during the time of the said Election, and to

prevent all manner of riots, tumults, disorders, and violence whatsoever: And We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the county towns of Scotland, ten days at least before the time hereby appointed for the meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such Election.

The Governing Body of Corpus Christi College, Oxford, begs to submit for the approval of His Majesty in Council the following alteration of Statutes made at a General Meeting of that Governing Body, specially summoned for the purpose, by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting on the twenty-third day of April, one thousand nine hundred and four, and sealed on the thirteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and five.

In the Statutes made for Corpus Christi | College, Oxford, by the University of Oxford Commissioners and approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and

eighty-two.

In the substituted clause 24 (b) approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the twelfth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, instead of the words "and the other two either Tutors, Assistant Tutors, Lecturers or Officers of the College" the following words shall be substituted "and the other two either Fellows, Lecturers, Officers or Chaplains of the College.'

The Governing Body of Corpus Christi College, Oxford, begs to submit for the approval of His Majesty in Council, the following alterations of Statutes made at a General Meeting of that Governing Body, specially summoned for the purpose, by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting on the second day of December, one thousand nine hundred and five, and sealed on the thirteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and five.

In the Statutes made for Corpus Christi College, Oxford, by the University of Oxford Commissioners, and approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the third day of May, one

thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

In the substituted clause 24 (b) approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council, on the twelfth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, after the words "if the College shall desire to retain his services as a Tutor or Assistant Tutor" at the end of the clause the additional words shall be inserted "for the purposes of this clause residence in Beam Hall shall count as residence in College.

In clause 32 (a) instead of the words "in which case the Scholar's tenure shall be renewed for a further term of two years," the following words shall be substituted, "in which case the tenure of his Scholarship shall be renewed for such period, not exceeding two years, as the College shall, in each case determine, and the said tenure may from time to time be further renewed for such period as the College shall in each case determine, but so that the periods of tenure, original and renewed, shall not exceed four years in all."

The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Merton College, Oxford, on the ninth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and five (and sealed on the fourteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and five), have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so

submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and

Cambridge Act, 1877":

The Warden and Fellows of Merton College, Oxford, respectfully submit to His Majesty the King in Council the following new Statutes, which were passed unanimously on Saturday, December ninth, one thousand nine hundred and five, at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the College, specially summoned for that purpose, in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877," section 54.

I.

At a General Meeting of the Governing Body of Merton College, held on December ninth, one thousand nine hundred and five, it was resolved unanimously-

"That the following sub-section (h) be added at the end of the new Statute III 8 (made by the College on March eighteenth, one thousand nine hundred and four)-

"Statute III 8.

"(h) A person holding a Fellowship under the provisions of sub-section iii of clause 7 is

hereinafter called an Official Fellow.

"Also any Fellow, not holding his Fellow-ship under the provisions of the aforesaid subsection, who, being appointed to act as Tutor, Lecturer, or Bursar, is regularly employed in the service of the College, shall be deemed to be an Official Fellow for the purposes of Statute V 5, and Statute VIII, provided that the number of Official Fellows shall never exceed ten."

At a General Meeting of the Governing Body of Merton College, held on December ninth, one thousand nine hundred and five, it was resolved unanimously:

"That the whole of Statute V 5 be repealed; and that the following new Statute be made:-

"Statute V.

5. "(a) Every Official Fellow shall be entitled to retire on a pension payable out of the Pension Fund hereinafter provided, after completing twenty-one years of service.

"(b) The scale of payment shall be as follows:—Two hundred pounds a year after twenty-one years' service, with the addition of sixteen pounds a year up to thirty years' service; three hundred and fifty pounds a year after thirty years' service and upwards.

"(c) A person who is entitled to a pension under this clause shall not be disqualified for receiving it by reason of his holding any other property, pension or office; provided that if and so long as such person hold any Ecclesias-tical Benefice, Headship or Fellowship in a College, Professorship, Mastership in a School, office tenable for life or during good behaviour, or office in the permanent Civil Service of the State, his pension from the College shall not exceed such amount as with the income derivable from all these sources, clear of deductions (except for Property or Income Tax), will make up a sum of eight hundred pounds a year.

"(d) On the retirement of an Official Fellow, who, not having served for twenty-one years, retires on account of mental or bodily infirmity, and whose circumstances seem to require such assistance, the Warden and Fellows may grant to him, at a Stated College Meeting, a pension L S.

which shall in no case exceed two hundred pounds a year, payable out of the Pension Fund, or if such Fund is insufficient, out of the Corporate Revenues, and tenable for such time and under such conditions as they may think fit. Provided that no such pension shall be granted unless by three-fourths of the votes of the Warden and Fellows present at the said meeting.

"(e) For the purposes of this clause, the service of any person shall be computed from the date when he first became an Official Fellow within the meaning of Statute III, 8(h), and his years of service shall mean his years

of service as an Official Fellow.

"(f) The provisions of these Statutes in respect of the right to Pensions shall apply to the existing Fellows who are for the time being Tutors, Lecturers, or Bursars of the College. Such Fellows shall be counted in the number of, and shall be deemed to be, Official Fellows, and their years of service shall be computed from the date of their original appointments respectively as Tutors, Lecturers, or Bursars."

At a General Meeting of the Governing Body of Merton College, held on December ninth, one thousand nine hundred and five, it was resolved unanimously.

"That Statute VIII be repealed, and that the

following new Statute be made:-

"Statute VIII. Pension Fund.

"1. For the payment of Pensions under these Statutes there shall be a Pension Fund, into which shall be paid the sum of three thousand five hundred pounds from the Reserve Fund in the hands of the College, and the sum of one thousand pounds from the balance at the credit of the Tuition Fund. Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, there shall be paid into this Fund in every year (1) two hundred pounds from the Tuition Fund, and (2) a sum from the Corporate Revenues at the rate of seventy pounds for each Official Fellow (hereinafter called ordinary statutable pay-

ments).

"2. The sums so contributed, so far as not required for the payment of current pensions, shall be invested in any securities in which Trestees are for the time being authorized to invest Trust Funds; and the interest on such investments, so far as not required for the payment of current pensions, shall be invested

in the same manner.

"3. For the purposes of this Statute, the capital of the Fund shall mean the accumulated sums invested on account of the Fund, and the amount of such capital in any year shall be estimated by the market value on the first of January in that year of the securities standing to the credit of the Fund at that date; and the income of the Fund in any year shall include the contributions for that year from the Tuition Fund and the Corporate Revenues as well as the interest derived from

"4. The capital and the income of the Fund shall be applicable to the payment of current pensions, subject to the following limitations:-

"(1) No pension shall be payable from the Pension Fund until the capital of the Fund amounts to ten thousand pounds;

Fund is insufficient to pay the current pensions in full, only such a sum shall be taken from the capital to make up the deficiency. as will not reduce the amount of the said capital below ten thousand pounds.

"5. In any year when the income of the Fund together with the sum (if any) taken from the capital is insufficient to pay the current pensions in full, a rateable deduction shall be made from all the pensions payable

in that year.

"6. No person shall have any claim on the Pension Fund in respect of the non-payment of his pension in any previous year under the provisions of sub-section (1) of Clause 4, or in respect of any sum deducted from his pension in any previous year under the provisions of Clause 5.

"7. If in any year the Corporate Revenues are unable to meet the ordinary statutable payments in full, the College shall have power, by a resolution passed at a Stated College Meeting, to reduce such payments for that

"8. The College may, if and when the state of its finances permits, increase the ordinary statutable payments, provided that the total sum paid out of the Corporate Revenues into the Pension Fund in any year shall not exceed one thousand five hundred pounds.

- "9. All contributions from the Tuition Fund and the Corporate Revenues shall cease in any year when the capital of the Fund shall amount to forty thousand pounds or a greater sum; and in any year when the capital of the Fund shall amount to fifty thousand pounds or a greater sum, any part of the interest derived from the capital of the Fund not required for the payment of current pensions shall be transferred to the Corporate Revenues.
- "10. Subject to the provisions of these Statutes, the payments into the Pension Fund as herein authorized shall first be made in and for the year one thousand nine hundred
- "11. The existing Statute VIII is hereby repealed, without prejudice to any right or interest acquired by any person thereunder.'

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of Sidney Sussex College in the University of Cambridge which amending Statutes were duly made at a College Meeting being a meeting of the Governing Body of the College specially summoned for this purpose and held on the twenty-ninth day of December, one thousand nine "(2) In any year when the income of the hundred and five, and having been passed at such meeting by the unanimous vote of those present are now submitted for the approval of

His Majesty the King in Council.

We the Master Fellows and Scholars of Sidney Sussex College in the University of Cambridge in exercise of the powers given us by the fiftyfourth section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 do hereby alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College in the manner following, viz.:-

Chapter 1.—Of the Constitution of the College.

By repealing section 1 and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 1.

1. The College of the Lady Frances Sidney Sussex shall consist of a Master, ten Fellows and thirty-six Scholars.

Section 3. By substituting the number "thirtysix" for the number "twenty-four" at the end of the section.

#### Chapter II.—Of College Meetings.

By repealing section 6 and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended

6. There shall be held every year on a day in the Easter Term a General Meeting of the Governing Body to be called the Annual Meeting. The day and hour of this meeting shall be fixed at a College Meeting. month's notice of the Annual Meeting shall be sent by the Master to all the Fellows.

#### Chapter III.—Of the Master.

By repealing the last paragraph of section 9 and substituting therefor the following para-

graph.

The Senior Fellow present shall then read out the votes, and if it be found that the votes of a majority of those present are in favour of any one duly qualified person the said Senior Fellow shall declare him to be duly elected Master. But if no duly qualified person has received the votes of a majority of those present the process of voting shall be repeated in like manner until either a duly qualified person has received such majority of the votes of those present or it becomes evident that no such majority can be obtained at that meeting.

#### Chapter IV.—Of the Fellows.

By repealing section 10 and substituting therefor the following section.

10. The Governing Body may for the purpose of filling the office of Dean Tutor or Lecturer re-elect a Fellow whose tenure has expired by lapse of time but in exercising this power shall make it a condition of re-election that the Fellow re-elected shall hold the office for such time as the Governing Body may require. On any breach of such condition, the Fellowship shall become vacant as in the preceding section 8.

By repealing section 11 and substituting therefor the following section to form an

amended section 11.

11. The Governing Body may, by a vote in which not less than two-thirds of their whole number concur, prolong the tenure of a Fellow on account of his marked distinction in literature or science for a period not exceeding six years on each occasion and they may in the same manner and for the same reason, but not otherwise except as hereinbefore provided, re-elect a Fellow whose tenure has expired by lapse of time.

By adding the following section to form section 12.

12. A Fellow whose tenure is prolonged under the last preceding section and a Fellow who is re-elected at the same annual meeting as that at which his Fellowship becomes vacant shall retain his seniority amongst the Fellows as if his tenure had been continuous in each case.

By affixing the number 13 in lieu of the number 12 to the present section 12.

#### Chapter VIII.—Of the Scholars.

By repealing section 1 and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 1.

1. The Scholars shall be elected by the Governing Body of the College from among the deserving Students of the College who have distinguished themselves in the College examinations or from other deserving persons who shall distinguish themselves in any examination approved by the Governing Body. Every person elected to a scholarship shall forthwith procure admission to the College, if he be not already a Student of the same, and shall receive no emoluments from his Scholarship until he shall have commenced residence as a Student of the College.

By repealing section 4 and substituting

therefor the following section to form an

amended section 4.

4. Twenty-four of the Scholars of the College shall receive their stipends from the Scholarship Fund hereinafter defined.

#### Chapter X.

By altering the title of this chapter from "Of the Tutor and Lecturers" to "Of the Tutors and Lecturers," and making a corretion in the "Table of Contents." ' and making a corresponding altera-

By substituting the words "College Tutors"

for the first three words of section 1.

By inserting after the words "The Tutor" at the beginning of section 2 the words "or Tutors" and by substituting the words "If a Tutor" for the words "If he" in the second sentence of section 2.

By repealing section 3 and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended

section 3.

3. It shall be the duty of the Tutors to direct the studies and watch over the conduct of their pupils.

By substituting "A" for "The" as the first

word of section 5.

By deleting the latter portion of section 8

"unless he is offered a life pension of three hundred pounds (£300) a year or until one year after he has accepted a College Benefice of the clear annual value (not deducting the pension if any of a former incumbent) of not less than four hundred pounds (£400) and in either of the two cases last mentioned his Fellowship shall immediately become vacant.' By repealing section 11.

By repealing section 12 and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended

section and to be numbered 11.

11. The accounts of the Tuition Fund, which shall consist of the payments for tuition made by the Members of the College shall be kept by some person appointed from time to time by the Governing Body and shall be submitted by him annually to a College Meeting. Tutors, College Lecturers and Assistant Lecturers shall receive such payments out of the Tuition Fund as the Governing Body may from time to time determine at the annual meeting. If there be an Assistant Tutor he shall receive out of the payment from the Tuition Fund assigned to the Tutor or Tutors as the case may be such portion or stipend as may be determined by the Governing Body.

#### Chapter XV.

By altering the title of this Chapter from "Of the Removal of Officers" to "Of the Removal of Officers and Appointment of Deputies," and making a corresponding alteration in the "Table of Contents."

By adding the following paragraph.

If any one of the above named College Officers be unable through illness to discharge the duties of his Office the Governing body may if they think fit appoint a Deputy for any time not exceeding one year and such appointment may be renewed if necessary but shall not in any event exceed a period of two years in the whole. The Deputy shall receive such portion of the stipend of the Officer for whom he acts as the Governing Body may determine.

#### Chapter XIX .-- Of Dividends.

By repealing section 2 and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 2.

2. The Divisible Fund shall be divided halfyearly at the General Audit into equal parts called Dividends, of which the master shall receive two; each Fellow who has held the office of Tutor or College Lecturer or either of these offices in succession to the other for twenty years and no longer holds either of these offices, shall receive one and one-fifth; each Fellow who has held the office of Tutor or College Lecturer or either of these offices in succession to the other for twenty-five years and no longer holds either of these offices, shall receive one and two-fifths; each other Fellow shall receive one; and five shall be paid to a Fund to be called the Scholarship Fund provided that these Dividends shall not exceed the sum of one hundred and twenty-five pounds (£125) each.

#### Chapter XX.-Of the Reserve Fund.

By repealing section 2 and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 2.

2. The Capital of the Reserve Fund shall consist of.

(1) All amounts paid by Members of the College as composition in lieu of fees due by them to the College.

(2) All proceeds of Fellowships suspended under chapter IV section 5 of these Statutes.

(3) All proceeds of Fellowships temporarily vacant under chapter IV section 7 of these Statutes.

(4) Any surplus of the Divisible Fund which may be allotted to the Reserve Fund according to the provisions of chapter XIX section 3 of these Statutes.

By adding to section 3 the following words:

The income of the Reserve Fund shall be added to the Divisible Fund defined in chapter

XIX. section 1 of these Statutes. By deleting sections 4 and 5.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Docking

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by General Orders of the Poor Law Board, dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Docking Union (amongst others), it is required that in relation to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, the Accounts when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of those Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness of the said Accounts as regards the stock remaining in store;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse belonging to the said Union, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in the exercise of our powers in that behalf, hereby Order as follows :-

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Docking Union, as and when they shall think fit to do so, may appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth, and may revoke that appointment. Any appointment of a Stocktaker by the Guardians shall be notified to Us forthwith.

ARTICLE II.—Every appointment of a Stocktaker shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations in force for the time being as to the appointment of Officers by the said Guardians, and a person appointed to the office of Stocktaker shall receive such remuneration as may from time to time be assigned to him by the said Guardians.

ARTICLE III.—No person, except with Our consent, shall be appointed to the office of Stocktaker while holding any other office under the Guardians.

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse, and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account," and shall compare the various articles enumerated in the "Inventory Book," and see that the said articles are distributed in accordance with the entries therein.

ARTICLE V.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article IV, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the balanced Accounts in the following form:—
