Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, January 10, 1906.

Notice is hereby given that His Majesty The King will hold Levées at St. James's Palace on Tuesday, the 20th February, and on Monday, the 26th February, at 12 o'clock noon, and that for these and all future Levées Cards of Admission will be required, as the numbers at each of these Ceremonies must be limited.

The following are the rules to be observed :-

#### ATTENDANCES AND PRESENTATIONS.

All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, of whatever rank, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty. All Civil Officers of the Admiralty will follow the same rule.

Deputy Lieutenants of Counties and all Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Army, Militia, Yeomanry, or Volunteers, of whatever rank, except those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse Guards, Whitehall; but Officers of the Household Cavalry or the Brigade of Guards should communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace.

All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India

Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the Colonies possessing responsible Government, who will apply to the Private Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse

Guards, Whitehall, for their cards for attendance or for presentation by the Inspector-General. The application must in all cases be supported by a credential from the Governor or Officer commanding the local Forces of the Colony.

Similarly, all Gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office, the Home Office, or any Government Department, will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation at Levées from the Department under which they serve.

Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, are requested to make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

Peers, Bishops, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all Gentlemen other than the above mentioned, will be good enough to communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace, when they will each be furnished with a card of admission for use at the Levée.

The names, both for attendance and presentation, must be received at the various Offices above indicated not later than eight days prior to the date of each Levée.

Acknowledgment of applications will not be made, but cards of admission will be sent as soon as possible to the addresses given.

#### Whitehall, January 9, 1906.

The KING was pleased, this morning, at Buckingham Palace, to present to Mr. John Wardrop Thomson, a Town Postman of Stirling, the Albert Medal of the Second Class, conferred

upon him by His Majesty's command for gallantry in saving life as detailed below:

On the night of Saturday, the 21st October, 1905, while Thomson was on duty at the Stirling Railway Station, his attention was called, by an outcry, to the fact that a man was lying on the

metals of the down main line.

Au engine was approaching rapidly, and was not more than 30 yards distant, when Thomson, without hesitation, sprang to the man's assistance, and both men disappeared from view as the engine passed by. The railway officials and passengers on the platform who witnessed the occurrence thought that both men had been run over, especially as another engine passed by, almost at the same moment, on the next line of rails. Thomson had, however, managed to drag the man on to the six-foot way. The rescued man was of heavy build and was quite unable to help himself, being in a state of intoxication; he was unhurt, while Thomson only received cuts about the face.

THEREAS by an Order in Council bearing VV date the seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and known as "The Somaliland Order in Council, 1899" (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order), provision was made for the administration of certain territories in East Africa known as the Somaliland Protectorate, wherein His Majesty has power and jurisdiction within the limits in the said Order in Council described and set forth:

And whereas the said Principal Order was amended in certain particulars by "The Somali-land Order in Council, 1903," and "The Somali-land Order in Council, 1904."

And whereas it is expedient to further amend the said Principal Order, and also to amend "The Somaliland Order in Council, 1903," and "The Somaliland Order in Council, 1904" in certain particulars:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:

- 1. This Order may be cited as "The Somaliland Order in Council, 1906," and shall be read and construed as one with the Principal Order, "The Somaliland Order in Council, 1903," and "The Somaliland Order in Council, 1904.
- . 2. The Principal Order is amended by the insertion between Part III and Part IV thereof of the following provisions under the heading:

#### "PART IIIA.—LEGISLATION."

- "9.—(1.) The Commissioner may make Ordinances for the administration of justice, the raising of revenue, and generally for the peace, order, and good government of all persons in the Protectorate.
- "(2.) The Commissioner shall observe any general or special instructions of the Secretary of State with respect to the previous submission to the Secretary of State of draft Ordinances, to the making of Ordinances for particular purposes, to the amendment of Ordinances or draft Ordinances, and to other matters in relation thereto; but nothing in this provision shall affect the validity of any Ordinance.
- "(3.) In making Ordinances the Commissioner shall respect existing native laws and customs except so far as the same may be opposed to justice or morality.

"(4.) The Commissioner shall sign every Ordinance made by him, and shall at the first available opportunity transmit an authenticated copy thereof to the Secretary of State.

- "(5.) The Secretary of State may disallow any Ordinance, wholly or in part, and upon such disallowance being publicly notified, the provisions so disallowed shall thereupon cease to have effect, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done or suffered thereunder.
- "(6.) The Ordinances of each year shall be numbered consecutively, and each may be cited by its number and year, or by its short title, if
- "(7.) Where a date for the commencement of an Ordinance is not fixed in the Ordinance, it shall come into force on the day on which it is promulgated by the Commissioner.

- "(8.) An Ordinance may apply to the Protectorate any Act or law of the United Kingdom or of any legislature of India or of any Colony, subject to any exceptions and modifica-
- "(9.) The Commissioner may by Ordinance repeal or amend with respect to the Protectorate any enactments, Acts, laws, or Ordinances which are made applicable or have been brought into operation in the Protectorate by or under any of the provisions of Articles 7 and 9 of the Principal Order or Article 9 of 'The Somaliland Order in Council, 1904.'

"(10.) Every Ordinance shall, unless a contrary intention appears, extend to natives, and may in relation to natives comprise such special provisions, modifications, and penalties as the Com-

missioner may think fit.
"(11.) The Commissioner shall at the first available opportunity, after any rules or regulations are made under any Ordinance by any person or body authorized, transmit an authenticated copy thereof to the Secretary of State.

"(12.) An Ordinance shall not be repealable by any rules or regulations made under an

Ordinance.

"(13.) An Ordinance varying or affecting any Order in Council relating to the Protectorate shall not come into force unless it has been previously approved by the Secretary of State, and such approval shall be recited therein."

3. Articles 7 (c), 7 (e) (iii), 9, 32, and 33 of the Principal Order, Article 3 of "The Somaliland Order in Council, 1903," and Articles 9 and 10 of "The Somaliland Order in Council, 1904," are hereby repealed without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and provided that all King's Regulations and Orders of the Secretary of State made under the provisions of any of the said repealed Articles shall continue of full force and effect unless and until repealed or amended by any Ordinance made by the Commissioner as hereinbefore provided.

4. The term "Regulations" in Article 22 of the Principal Order, and the term "King's Regu-lations" in Articles 7 (3), 8 (3), and 12 of "The Somaliland Order in Council, 1904," shall be deemed to include any Ordinance made under the provisions of this Order, and the said Articles shall be read and construed accordingly.

5. His Majesty may from time to time revoke,

alter, add to, or amend this Order.

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 9TH JANUARY 1906.)

EAST SUFFOLK (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, with modifications, to certain Scheduled

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall apply to the Districts specified in the First Schedule hereto, (in this Order referred to as Scheduled Districts,) as if they had been declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area, but subject to the modifications hereinafter contained.

Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

- 2.—(1.) The Local Authority may grant a Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition of swine in a Scheduled District, if they are satisfied that the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held in a market fair-ground saleyard or place of exhibition which is capable of being thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, and thereupon the market fair sale or exhibition may be held accordingly.
- (2.) A Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market fair sale or exhibition (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets fairs sales or exhibitions on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding three months, but the Licence may be renewed from time to time or revoked at any time by the Local Authority.
- (3.) A Licence shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to ensure publicity for the same, and a copy of the Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition where such market fair sale or exhibition is held.
- (4.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article.
- (5.) A fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local Authority and named in the Licence for the purpose of

- swine to the market fair sale or exhibition, and for granting Licences for movement of swine therefrom in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
- (6.) No swine shall be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare into a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Article unless accompanied by a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order.

Licences for Movement out of Licensed Markets, &c.

- 3.—(1.) Swine exposed at a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order may be moved from the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition along over or across a high-way or thoroughfare in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement—in the Form set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect—granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the market fair sale or exhibition is held.
- (2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (3.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where the place of destination specified in the Licence is in a Swine-Fever Infected Area, or a Scheduled District, the swine shall be moved to such place and not elsewhere.

#### Licences after Completion of Movement.

- 4.-(1.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to a market fair sale or exhibition in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District, the Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the market fairground sale-yard or place of exhibition by the person in charge of the swine to the person appointed under this Order to receive the same.
- (2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to any other premises in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

#### Attendance at Markets, &c.

5. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order.

#### Revocation by Board of Licences.

6. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

# Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a receiving Licences authorising movement of Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Forms.

9. For the purposes of any Movement Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order, the Scheduled Districts shall be deemed to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area.

### Offences.

- 10.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any person fail to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Interpretation.

- 11. In this Order-
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

- "Swine-Fever Infected Area" means an area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area:
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Revocation.

12. The Order described in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby revoked as from the date of the commencement of this Order.

#### Commencement.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of January, nineteen hundred and six.

This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars Regulation (County of Forfar) (No. 2) Order, 1905," and the regulations hereby prescribed shall take effect within the limits or places referred to therein on and after the respective dates at which, for the purpose of giving effect thereto, the local authority shall place notices in conspicuous places on or near such limits or places.
- 2. A person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour within the limits or places specified in the schedule to this Order.
