COMPANIES (WINDING UP) RULES, 1903.

Notice is hereby given, that the following draft Rules have been prepared under the Companies (Winding Up) Act, 1890. Copies may be obtained on application to the Lord Chancellor's Office, House of Lords:—

1. If the Petitioner, or his Solicitor, does not within the time prescribed by Rule 27 of the Companies (Winding Up) Rules, 1903, or within such extended time as the Registrar may allow, duly advertise the Petition in the manner prescribed by the said Rule, the appointment of the time and place at which the Petition is to be heard, shall be cancelled by the Registrar, and the Petition shall be removed from the file in the Registrar's Chambers, unless the Judge or the Registrar shall otherwise direct.

Registrar shall otherwise direct.
This Rule shall be read as one of the Companies (Winding Up) Rules, 1903, and shall be cited in the body of those Rules as Rule 27A.

2. The following words shall be added to Rule 170 (2) of the Companies (Winding Up) Rules, 1903:—

Provided that the Official Receiver, when acting as Liquidator, may, without taxation, pay and allow the costs and charges of any other person other than a Solicitor, employed by him, where such costs and charges are within the scale usually allowed by the Court and do not exceed the sum of £2: provided always that the Board of Trade may require such costs or charges to be taxed by the Taxing Officer.

WANDSWORTH UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Wandsworth Union ;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order, dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Wandsworth and Clapham Union (now known as the Wandsworth Union), the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of outdoor relief to poor persons in the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes

of poor persons in the said Union; Now, therefore, We, the Lecal Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:

Article I.--The Guardians of the Poor of the Wandsworth Union, may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolu-") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

Article II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the Workhouse, the wife and family of any ablebodied male person who is relieved in the Work-

house.

(2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the Workhouse, shall not be absent from the Workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for a period exceeding twelve hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians.

(3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the Workhouse without any contravention of subdivision (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the Workhouse, without being set to work during the time, or any part of the time, of his absence.

Article III.—This Order shall operate and have effect during a period not exceeding six calendar months from the date of the said Order.
