WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant out of the common fund under our control to the Incumbent for the time being of the parish and benefice of Saint Peter, Coventry, in the county of Warwick and in the diocese of Worcester, a temporary yearly stipend of sixty pounds, such stipend to be payable for a period of three years, to be calculated as from the first day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, and to be receivable in four equal portions, on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each of the said three years: Provided always, that the temporary yearly stipend of sixty pounds hereby granted to the Incumbent of the benefice aforesaid shall be paid only upon the production to us on or after each of the said lastly-mentioned days of a certificate (in a form approved by us) under the hand of the Bishop of the diocese of Worcester, that during the quarter then ended the Incumbent has employed within his parish two Assistant-Curates with the licence or written permission of such Bishop, and that the Curate towards whose maintenance the grant hereby secured is payable is in receipt of a salary of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction consisting of a piece or parcel of land comprising one acre (or thereabouts) which has been permanently secured by deed, dated the twelfth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, as a site for a parsonage or house of residence for the vicarage of Saint Clement, Branksome, in the county of Dorset, and in the diocese of Salisbury, and in consideration also of a further benefaction consisting of three hundred pounds Poole Water Works Debenture Stock which has been transferred into our name in favour of the same vicarage, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-
