WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (West Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1906.

Dated 29th January, 1906.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire, I hereby make the following Order:-

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (West Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1906."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire so as to be between the last day of February and the 12th day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the

Bullfinch, Blackheaded Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Crossbill, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Golden Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Little Grebe (Dabchick), Common Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kite, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Alpine Pipit (Water Pipit), Meadow Pipit, Richard's Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Redbacked Shrike, Woodchat Shrike, Siskin, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Song Thrush, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Treecreeper, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Aquatic Warbler, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

Exclusion from the operation of the Act of 1880.

IV. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall not apply within the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire to the House Sparrow.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During the period between the 11th day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire :-

Bittern, Little Bittern, Bullfinch, Blackheaded Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiffichaff, Crossbill, Cuckoo, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Black-throated Diver, Dunlin (Purre, Ox Bird), Golden Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe (Dabchick), Common Heron, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Lark (Skylark, Woodlark), Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Night-jar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl) Nuthatch, Oriole, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny or Brown Owl, White or Barn Owl, Alpine Pipit (Water Pipit), Meadow Pipit, Richard's Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Redshank, Redstart, Robin, Roller, Ruff or Reeve, Sanderling, Common Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Green Sandpiper, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Redbacked Shrike, Woodchat Shrike, Siskin, Stint, Stoneckat, Swallow, Swift, Song Thrush, Beanled Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh

Tit, Treecreeper, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Aquatic Warbler, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Common Wren, Firecrested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the West Riding.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire:—

Avocet, Bee Eater, Bittern, Blackcap, Blackheaded Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Coot, Curlew, Dipper, Diver, Dotterel, Dunlin (Ox Bird, Purre), Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Godwit, Golden Plover, Goldfinch, Grebe, Greenshank, Heron, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Landrail or Corncrake, Linnet, Mallard, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merganser, Merlin, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Nightingale, Nuthatch, Oriole, Owl, Peregrine Falcon, Meadow Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Pochard or Dunbird, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redshank, Redstart, Ruff or Reeve, Ring Ouzel, Roller, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Shearwater, Sheldrake, Shoveller, Shrike (Butcher Bird), Snipe, Stonechat, Stone Curlew (Thickknee, Thick-kneed Bustard), Stonehatch, Swallow, Swift, Teal, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Coal Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Treecreeper, Turtle Dove, Grey Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Water Rail, Wheatear, Whimbrel, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Widgeon, Wild Duck, Woodcock, Woodlark, Woodpecker, Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Green Plover.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (East Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1906.

Dated 29th January, 1906.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of

the Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (East Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1906.

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. (a.) The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire, except as regards the Mallard (Wild Duck), Golden Plover, Snipe and Woodcock so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in each year.

(b.) As regards the Mallard (Wild Duck), Golden Plover, Snipe and Woodcock, the close time shall be altered so as to be between the last day of February and the 12th day of August in

each year.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire:—

Bittern, Little Bittern, Blackheaded Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Dotterel, Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Blackheaded Gull, Kittiwake Gull, Kestrel or Windhover, Kingfisher, Linnet, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Osprey, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny or Brown Owl, White or Barn Owl, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Swallow, Swift, Tern (all species), Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Birds protected within certain Areas.

- IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended, so far as certain of the birds are concerned by clause II of this Order does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited
 - (a.) On or from the piers or seashore of Bridlington.
 - (b.) On or from the sands and seashore between the south landing in the parish of Flamborough and the Skipsea Watch House, in the parish of Skipsea.

All Birds protected on Sundays within certain Areas.

V. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the undermentioned Urban and Rural Districts, including the foreshore within the East Riding of Yorkshire, the estuary of the Humber, and the tidal portion of the River Hull:—

Urban Districts—Beverley (except in the parish of St. Martin), Bridlington, Cottingham, Driffield, Filey, Hedon, Hessle, Hornsea, Norton, Pocklington, and Withernsea.

Rural Districts. — Beverley, Bridlington, Driffield, Escrick, Howden, Norton, Patrington, Pocklington, Riccall, Sculcoates, Sherburn and Skirlaugh.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the East Riding.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire for a period of five years from the date of this Order:—

VII. The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' Eggs is prohibited for a period of five years from the date of this Order:—

(1.) On the Promontory of Spurn, including Kilnsea Warren south of the line taken by the road leading from the Village of Kilnsea towards the site of the old Village of Kilnsea.

(2.) On Hornsea Mere and the lands immediately adjoining, the boundary of which area (outlined in pink on an Ordnance map sealed with the Seal of the Secretary of State, dated the 29th January, 1906, and deposited with the Clerk of the County Council) commences at a point on the Hornsea and Seaton-road 7 chains east of Mill Lane, and proceeds in a south-easterly direction along the road past the north-east side of "Great Wassand" for a distance of about 51 chains, thence along a footpath on the south side of the Mere to Lelly-lane, thence north-easterly for 11 chains along the north side of Lelly-lane, thence in a north-westerly direction along the boundary fence dividing property belonging to Mr. William Bethell and Mr. Constable to the Mere, thence along the edge of the water of the Mere to and along a stream passing the west front of Ventnor House, to the Hornsea and Seaton Road, and then along the south side of the said road to the above-mentioned point 7 chains east of Mill-lane.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Devon, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Devon) Order, 1906."

BIRDS.

Close Time extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended throughout the County of Devon, so as to be between the 31st day of January and the 1st day of September in each year:—

Bittern, Curlew or Whaup, Dotterel, Dunlin (Ploverspage, Purre or Sealark), Gannet or Solan Goose, Grebe, Hobby, Lark, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker or Night Hawk), Nutcracker, Nuthatch, Oriole, Richard's Pipit, Water Pipit, Plover (Lapwing or Peewit), Puffin (Coulterneb or Sea Parrot), Razorbill, Sanderling, Sandpiper, Summer Snipe or Otterling, Stone Curlew or Thick Knee, Tern or Sea Swallow, Whimbrel.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County of Devon to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the said Act:—

Snow Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Hobby, Kestrel, Merlin, Nutcracker, Nuthatch, Osprey, Richard's Pipit, Water Pipit, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Bearded Titmouse.

The Shag and Cormorant deprived of protection in certain Districts.

IV. Those parts of the Administrative County of Devon which are comprised within the limits of the Axe, Exe, Dart, Teign, Torr, and Torridge Fishery Districts, respectively, shall be exempted from the operation of the Act of 1880 as to the following Birds:—

Shag, Cormorant.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Act of 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not extend, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Devon:—

Cirl Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Cornish Chough, Goldfinch, Guillemot or Willock, Gulls, Hawfinch, Hoopee, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kittiwake or Tarrock, Osprey, Owls, Oyster Catcher, Lesser Redpole, Reeve or Ruff, Bearded Titmouse, Woodpecker, Wreu, Golden-crested Wren.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the

following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Devon, viz.:

Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Bittern, Little Bittern, Chough, Common Crossbill, Dipper, Dunlin (Ploverspage, Purre or Sealark), Rock Dove, Peregrine Falcon, Fire Crest, Pied Flycatcher. Gaunet, Goldfinch, Common Guillemot, Great Black-backed Gull, Lesser Black-backed Gull, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hawfinch, Night Heron, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Ring Ouzel, Osprey, Oyster Catcher, Barn Owl, Long-eared Owl, Tawny Owl, Rose-coloured Pastor, Quail, Raven, Razorbill, Redstart, Green Sandpiper, Common Snipe, White Wagtail, Blackheaded Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Woodcock, Woodlark, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Eggs protected in certain Areas.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the following areas until the end of the year 1910:-

(i.) Lundy Island and the neighbouring islets.

- (ii.) Baggy Point district, situate in the parish of Georgeham, and bounded by the sea from the coast off Croyde Bay House to that off Vention Cottages, and thence by the roads passing near Croyde Village, by way of Vention-lane, Stentaway-lane and Moorlane, to the coast off Croyde Bay House.
- (iii.) Clovelly district, being the parishes of Abbotsham, Alwington, Clovelly, Hartland, Parkham, Welcombe, and Woolfardisworthy (West).
- (iv.) Lynton district, being the parishes of Lynton and Countisbury.
- (v.) Slapton Ley and Start district, being the parishes of Stokenham, Slapton, and Black-

SWINE-FEVER (MOVEMENT FROM IRELAND) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904.

1. The Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, which restricts the landing in Great Britain of swine brought from Ireland and regulates the movement of swine so landed, is modified by this Order in manner hereinafter appearing.

Provision for Landing of Store Swine.

- 2. Swine brought from Ireland may be landed in Great Britain and moved from the place of landing to premises in Great Britain with a view to detention on such premises in accordance with Article 4 of this Order, if accompanied by a licence authorising such landing and move-ment granted by an Inspector or other officer duly authorised in that behalf by the Depart-ment of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, and subject to the following conditions, namely:
 - (i.) Every application for a licence under this Article shall be accompanied by-
 - (a) a declaration in the Form A set forth in the Schedule to this Order or to the like effect signed by the occupier of the premises where the swine to which the application relates have been kept, and countersigned by a member of the Police force of the District in which such premises are situate; and
 - (b) a declaration in the Form B set forth in the said Schedule or to the like effect signed by the applicant for the licence.
 - (ii.) A licence shall become void if the swine to which it relates are during the voyage to Great Britain permitted to come in contact with swine which are not accompanied by a licence under this Order.
 - (iii.) The licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

General Provisions as to Movement.

- 3.—(1.) Swine, while being moved under this Order, shall so far as is practicable be kept separate from all swine which are not accompanied by a licence under this Order, and shall be moved by the nearest available route, and by railway so far as is practicable, and without unnecessary delay, to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.
- (2.) Swine while being moved under this Order shall not, unless otherwise hereafter expressly provided by Order of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, be subject to any restriction on movement of swine imposed by Order of the Board or by regulations made by the Local Authority of any District.

Detention and Isolation after Arrival at Destination.

4.—(1.) Swine moved with a licence under this Order shall not, for a period of twenty eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place Swine, while detained under of destination. this Article, shall be kept separate from all other swine. This provision does not restrict the removal of any carcase of a pig.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 5.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being landed or moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of an officer of Customs or of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the landing or movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand by any such person as aforesaid, give to him his name and address.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

6. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced in Great Britain by the Local Authority.

Offences.

7.—(1.) If a pig is landed or moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing or movement, and the person landing or moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been landed or moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being landed or moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If a pig is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(4.) If any person fail to deliver up or send a licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of March, nineteen hundred and

Notice of Bye-laws and Regulations.

TOTICE is hereby given, that at a Meeting of the Urban District Council of Erith, in the county of Kent, held at Belvedere, in the district of Erith, on the 15th day of January, 1906, the following Bye-laws and Regulations were made and sealed by the Council as the Local Authority, under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

Interpretation.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any car or carriage using the tramways laid down within the urban district of Erith, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car.

Stopping for Passengers.

2. The driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made, at each or any of the specified stopping places along the route.

Warning to Persons in Charge of Other Vehicles.

3. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass. shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

Wilful Obstruction.

4. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

Penalty.

5. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and

not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

2. To enable the Corporation from time to time to make and maintain all such cuts, channels, aqueducts, culverts, tunnels, drains, sluices, gauges, reservoirs, tanks, wells, water towers, filter beds, banks, bridges, arches, piers, abutments, embankments, roads, approaches, engines, machinery, telegraphs, telephones and appliances as may be necessary or convenient in connection with the before mentioned works or any of them, or for conducting, inspecting, cleansing, repairing or managing the same, and together with full power and right at all times of approach and access to the works aforesaid, or any of them for the purposes of the Bill or their Undertaking.

3. To authorize the Corporation to lay down and maintain mains, pipes, wires, and apparatus in, over, under, through, and across, and for that purpose to break up, alter, divert, stop up, and interfere with permanently or temporarily, public and private streets, roads, lanes, footways, thoroughfares, bridges, rivers, watercourses, streams, drains, gas-mains, pipes, and telegraph, telephonic, and other electric

apparatus.

- 4. To empower the Corporation for any of the purposes of the Bill or their Waterworks Undertaking to purchase, take, and acquire compulsorily or by agreement, or to take on lease and to hold lands, streams, springs, waters, houses and buildings, and other property, and any rights and easements therein, thereunder or thereover, and in particular to enable the Corporation to acquire, for the purposes of their water Undertaking, by compulsion or agreements, lands, houses, buildings and other property in the parishes above mentioned, and also in the parishes of Ratlinghope, All Stretton, Smethcott and Church Pulverbatch.
- 5. To authorize the Corporation to take and divert, and to appropriate and use for the purposes of the Bill, and for the general purposes of their Undertaking the waters of streams above referred to, and particularly the waters of the Cound Brook and its tribujaries which flow through, between and to the north of the villages of Picklescott and Castle Pulverbatch into the River Severn and thence into the sea, and to enable the Corporation to make compensation in money or water to any parties injuriously affected by the abstraction of the water by the Corporation.

To make provision with reference to the quantity or amount of compensation (if any) by water or otherwise to be given by the Corporation in respect of the proposed taking, impounding, and diverting of such water and (in case of compensation by water) with reference to the time and manner of the delivery thereof, and the mode of measuring or ascertaining the quantity

to be delivered.

11. To authorize the Corporation temporarily to discharge water from any of the works aforesaid, into any available river, stream or watercourses, including any river, stream or watercourse with which any of the intended conduit, lines of pipes, by-washes, or over-flows may communicate, or into any river, stream or watercourse crossed by any of the works aforesaid, and to make provisions for compensating all riparian owners and other persons for any damage which may be caused by the exercise of such power.

12. 21. To empower the Corporation to invest their sinking funds in the rates or other securities of any corporation, including those of the Corporation, and to include in all mortgages granted by the Corporation, as security for moneys borrowed by them, the corporate estate and all properties and undertakings and the rents and profits thereof.

22. To confirm or otherwise give effect to any agreements which may be made before the passing of the Bill touching any of the matters men-

tioned or contained in this Notice.

23.
