

## CITY OF CHICHESTER ELECTRIC LIGHTING.

**T**HE Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Chichester (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") being the Undertakers for the purposes of the Chichester Electric Lighting Order, 1898 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), hereby give notice, that with the consent of the Board of Trade they propose by Deed to be approved by the Board of Trade to transfer their powers, duties, and liabilities under the Order to the Chichester Electric Light and Power Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Company").

The following are particulars of the proposed transfer:—

(a) The area in respect of which the transfer is proposed to be made is the whole of the area of supply under the Order.

(b) Subject to certain powers of the Corporation to repurchase the Undertaking as stated hereafter, there is no limit to the period of the proposed transfer.

(c) The pecuniary consideration payable in respect of the transfer is £500.

(d) The following sections of the Order are not to apply to the Company—

Section 7, as to purchase and use of lands,  
Section 28, as to remuneration of electric inspectors,

Section 52, as to application of revenue,  
Section 53, as to application of capital moneys,

Section 54, so far as relates to the authentication of any notice, order, or document by the Corporation, and

Section 68, incorporating section 265 of the Public Health Act, 1875.

And the Company is to observe certain provisions usually forming part of Electric Lighting Orders not granted to local authorities.

In case in the opinion of an arbitrator the Company fails in material respects to work the Undertaking as required by the Electric Lighting Acts or the Order, and it is desirable in the public interest that the working thereof should be resumed by the Corporation, the Company may be required to sell the Undertaking to the Corporation on terms to be determined by arbitration.

After the expiration of 42 years the Corporation are entitled to purchase the Undertaking upon the terms mentioned in section 2 of the Electric Lighting Act, 1888.

A copy of the draft Deed of Transfer will be deposited for public inspection during office hours at the Town Clerk's Office, East-street, Chichester, during one month from the date hereof, and printed copies thereof will be supplied by the Town Clerk to every person demanding the same, on payment of sixpence for each copy.

## No. 112.—MALACCA STRAIT—PULO PENANG.

*Pulo Rimau Light—Character Altered.*

Information has been received from the Harbour Master at Penang that, on 15th January,

1906, the character of Pulo Rimau Light would be altered from fixed to a red occulting light every twenty seconds, thus:—light, seventeen and a half seconds; eclipse, two and a half seconds; it would be elevated 129 feet above high water, visible in clear weather from a distance of about 13 miles, and shown from an iron tower, 57 feet high, erected on a masonry base, situated on the eastern side of the island at a distance of  $1\frac{3}{4}$  cables N.  $12^{\circ}$  E. from its southern point.

The light is of the 3rd order.

Approximate position, lat.  $5^{\circ} 14'$  N., long.  $100^{\circ} 16\frac{1}{2}'$  E.

## No. 113.—JAPAN—HONSHU, NORTH-WEST COAST, WAKASA WAN.

*Tsunegami Zaki—Rock awash off, Chi Shima—Amended Height of.*

The Japanese Government has given notice of a rock awash, situated at a distance of about  $3\frac{1}{2}$  cables S.  $55^{\circ}$  W. from the extremity of Tsunegami Zaki.

Approximate position, lat.  $35^{\circ} 38\frac{1}{2}'$  N., long.  $135^{\circ} 48\frac{1}{4}'$  E.

Also, that the height of Chi Shima, situated  $2\frac{3}{4}$  miles S.  $30^{\circ}$  W. from Tsunegami Zaki, is 103 feet, and not 38 feet above high water as at present shown on the Charts.
