BYE-LAWS AS TO MOTOR OMNIBUSES.

Pursuant to the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Eastbourne Corporation Act, 1902.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eastbourne, have made the following Bye-laws :-

Bye-laws made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Eastbourne, pursuant to the Eastbourne Corporation Act, 1902, and the Tramways Act, 1870, for regulating the travelling in or upon any Motor Omnibus belonging to the said Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses, and for the prevention of nuisances.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the expression "the Council" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Eastbourne acting by the Council the term "motor omnibus" shall mean any carriage moved by mechanical power, including in that expression steam, electrical, and every other motive power not being animal power, which the Council may provide and run within the limits authorised by the Eastbourne Corporation Act, 1902, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of any motor omnibus.

2. The Bye-laws hereinafter set forth, shall apply to all motor omnibuses belonging to the Council, and to all places within which the Council are authorised by the Eastbourne Corporation Act, 1902, to provide and run motor omnibuses.

3. No person shall smoke any tobacco, or any like substance inside any motor omnibus, or spit on the floor, platform, or roof, or on any part of any motor omnibus.

4. A person in a state of intoxication, or suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or whose dress or clothing might in the opinion of the conductor soil or injure the linings or cushions of the motor omnibus, or a person who might for any reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any motor omnibus and may

omnibus after being requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in or upon any motor omnibus shall on the request of the conductor quit the same upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned, and may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

5. No person shall swear or use obscene, profane, or offensive language whilst in or upon any motor omnibus, or commit any nuisance in, or upon, or against any motor omnibus, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

6. No person, not being a servant of the Council duly authorised in that behalf, shall touch, handle or interfere with any machine or appliance in, under, upon, or about any motor omnibus (except electric bells provided for the use of passengers).

7. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorised officer of the Council, the fare legally demandable for the journey, and in any case whether demanded or not, shall pay such fare before leaving the motor omnibus.

8. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Council, and shall also, when required so to do, either show his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

9. Luggage of a form or description which in the opinion of the conductor is calculated to annoy or inconvenience any passenger shall not be taken in or upon any motor omnibus.

10. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Council employed in connection with a motor omnibus, shall travel on the steps of any motor omnibus, or stand either on the roof or platform, or in the interior of any motor omnibus, or sit on the outside rail on the roof or platform of any motor omnibus.

11. No person shall hold or hang on, by, or to any part of any motor omnibus, or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

12. When any motor omnibus contains the full number of passengers which it is authorised to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such motor omnibus after being warned by the conductor not to do so.

13. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any motor omnibus. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any motor omnibus in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the motor omnibus immediately upon request of the conductor.

14. No person shall enter, get upon, or travel in or on any motor omnibus with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

15. No passenger or other person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Council in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any motor omnibus.

16. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding forty shillings.

17. There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position, inside of each motor omnibus in use, a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

18. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of May, 1906.

THE STALYBRIDGE, HYDE, MOSSLEY AND DUKINFIELD TRAMWAYS.

Bye-Laws and Regulations made by the Stalybridge, Hyde, Mossley and Dukinfield Tramways and Electricity Board (hereinafter called the Board) under the powers in that behalf conferred on them by section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

1. The Bye-Laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Board, and to all places with respect to which the Board have power to make Bye-Laws and Regulations.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform and not otherwise.

3. No passenger shall smoke or carry any lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette inside a car, or on any compartment of a car not especially provided for that purpose.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the carriages, or remove or deface any number-plate, printed or other notice in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of a conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorised officer of the Board, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Board, and shall also when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.

12. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Board shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platform of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

13. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers except by express permission of the conductor first obtained.

14. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is certified to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on such carriage except by express permission of the conductor first obtained.

15. When a carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is certified to contain, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters, and in a conspicuous position on the carriage.

16. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any carriage whilst in motion.

17. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this Regulation, shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

18. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Board with loaded firearms.

19. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Board in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Board.

20. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-Laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.

21. No person other than the conductor shall signal a carriage to start, or shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a carriage, or its equipment, or without reasonable cause signal a carriage to stop.

22. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

23. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Board and having charge of a carriage.

24. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

25. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and six.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 10TH FEBRUARY 1906.)

SHEEP-DIPPING (SCOTLAND) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Order.

1.-(1.) This Order applies to Scotland.

(2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly in Scotland and partly in England, the whole farm or holding shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be in Scotland.

PART I.—PERIODICAL DIPPING OF SHEEP IN SCOTLAND.

Mode of Dipping prescribed.

2. Where under this Order it is provided that sheep are to be dipped, they shall be dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab, or purporting to be so approved.

Prescribed Dipping.

3.—(1.) All sheep in Scotland during any part of a prescribed dipping period (except those exempted by later provisions of this Article) shall be caused to be dipped by the owner or person in charge thereof during that period. The first prescribed dipping period shall commence on the first day of January and terminate on the thirty-first day of August, and the second prescribed dipping period shall commence on the first day of September and terminate on the twelfth day of November.

(2.) This Article shall not apply to the following sheep:—

(i.) Sheep which on account of their being intended for exhibition, or which, for any other special circumstances, the Local Authority of the District where the sheep are kept may exempt from these dipping requirements, but so that every exemption shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority and shall be subject to such conditions as may be specified in the exemption. The exemption may be granted subject to conditions as to subsequent dipping or otherwise. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board. The exemption shall be in the Form A set forth in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

(ii.) Sheep slaughtered in Scotland, or moved out of Scotland without contravening Article 15 of this Order, before the expiration of the period within which their dipping is required under this Article.

Notice to Local Authority of Time and Place of intended Dipping and Returns of Dippings.

4.--(1.) For the purposes of enabling the lor person in charge of any sheep then in contact Local Authority to be represented at the dipping with the undipped sheep with a notice, in the whenever they think such a course desirable, the Form D set forth in the Schedule hereto, or owner or person in charge of any sheep required to the like effect, and thereupon it shall be unlawful to move the sheep referred to in the

give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is hereinafter provided :---

(i.) The notice shall be delivered, or sent by post, to such person as the Local Authority of the District may appoint to receive such notices in respect of sheep in their District.

(ii.) The notice shall be sent or delivered at such time as to be received by the appointed person three clear days, at least, before the intended time of dipping.

(iii.) The notice shall state the time and place of the intended dipping, and the approximate number of sheep intended to be dipped.

(2.) If from any cause the dipping of the sheep on the date specified in a notice becomes impracticable, no further notice shall be required if the sheep are dipped as soon after such date as is practicable.

(3.) A return in the Form B set forth in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, shall be sent immediately after each dipping by the owner or person in charge of the sheep dipped to the person appointed to receive such returns by the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are dipped.

Clipping before Dipping.

5. During the second prescribed dipping period a sheep shall not be deemed to have been dipped in accordance with the requirements of this Order, unless it has been previously clipped, but this provision shall not apply to lambs less than nine months old.

Isolation of Sheep after Dipping.

6. All sheep after having been dipped during the second prescribed dipping period, shall during the remainder of the period be kept isolated, as far as practicable, from sheep which have not been so dipped.

Declaration after Dipping Period.

7. The occupier of a farm or holding on which sheep are kept shall personally, or by his agent authorised in that behalf, on or after the thirtyfirst day of August, but not later than the fourteenth day of September, and on or after the twelfth day of November, but not later than the twenty-sixth day of November, in each year, send a declaration as to the dipping of the sheep, in the Form C set forth in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, to the person appointed to receive such declarations by the Local Authority of the District in which the farm or holding is situate.

Notice of Appointment of Persons to receive Returns, &c.

8. The Local Authority shall appoint persons for their District or for separate parts of their District to receive notices, returns and declarations under the preceding Articles, and shall give adequate notice in their District of appointments so made.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep not Dipped within Dipping Period.

9. Where any sheep shall not have been dipped as required by this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority may, without prejudice to any proceedings for the offence, serve the owner or person in charge of the sheep and the owner or person in charge of any sheep then in contact with the undipped sheep with a notice, in the Form D set forth in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, and thereupon it shall be unlawful to move the sheep referred to in the notice from the farm, holding, or other place where they are at the time the notice is served unless and until all the sheep shall have been dipped after the service of the notice in the presence of an Inspector of the Local Authority.

Cleansing of Dipping Places.

10. The place on any farm or premises which has been used for the dipping shall, without unnecessary delay, be thoroughly cleansed by the occupier, and all tufts of wool gathered and disinfected or destroyed.

Samples of Dip may be taken.

11. Every owner or person in charge of sheep being dipped under this Order shall permit and give every facility to an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board to take samples of dip or material which is being or has been used for the dipping of sheep.

Power to provide Dipping Places.

12. The Local Authority may provide and fit up and maintain dipping places, but subject to the approval in writing by the Board of the site of each dipping place; provided that no dipping place shall be used under this provision if its use would injuriously affect the water in any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, well, pond, or place constructed or used for the supply of water for drinking or other domestic purposes.

Power for Local Authority to regulate time and place of Dipping in particular cases.

13. The Local Authority may in any case where they think such procedure desirable serve a notice on the owner or person in charge of any sheep requiring that the sheep shall be dipped at such time and place as is stated in the notice and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and the sheep shall thereupon be dipped in accordance with the requirements of such notice. The notice may be in the Form E set forth in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

Powers of Entry of Inspectors.

14. An Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board may, subject to their direction and for the purposes of this Order, enter any premises and examine any sheep thereon.

PART II.

Restrictions on Movement of Sheep out of Scotland and Regulation of Exposure of Sheep at Markets.

15.—(1.) After the fifteenth day of July until the thirty-first day of August sheep shall not be moved out of Scotland unless they have been dipped on or since the fifteenth day of June then last past, and unless they are accompanied by a declaration stating that they have been so dipped, signed by the owner of the sheep or his agent authorised in that behalf.

(2.) On and after the first day of September until the twelfth day of November sheep shall not be exposed for sale in any market, fair, or saleyard in Scotland or be moved out of Scotland unless they have been dipped on or since the first day of August then last past, and unless they are accompanied by a declaration stating that they have been so dipped, signed by the owner of the **theop** or his agent authorised in that behalf.

(8.) Declarations under this Article shall be in the Form F set forth in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

(4.) Sheep intended for exhibition at agricultural shows may be exempted from the restrictions imposed by this Article by an exemption to that effect signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are when the exemption is granted upon production of a veterinary certificate showing freedom from sheep-scab. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board. The exemption shall be in the Form A set forth in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

PART III.—GENERAL.

Production of Declarations and Licences; Names and Addresses.

16.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved where under this Order a declaration or exemption is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the declaration or exemption, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector, or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

17. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

18.—(1.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the period within which their dipping is required by this Order shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person fail to give any notice or send any return or declaration required by this Order, or falsely makes any return or declaration, for the purposes of this Order, or offers or utters any such return or declaration knowing the same to be falsely made, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a sheep is exposed for sale in any market, fair, or saleyard, in contravention of this Order, the occupier of the premises where the sheep is exposed, and the person exposing the same, and the owner and person in charge of the sheep, and the purchaser thereof, knowing the same to be exposed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894. (5.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a declaration or exemption is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If a sheep is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the sheep is detained, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

19. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Sheep" includes lambs;

Dated

"Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector and any person appointed by a Local Authority to be their Inspector for the purposes of this Order;

- "Owner" includes a joint owner;
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries;

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Borough of Wallsend.
