## ALIENS ACT, 1905.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 3 (3) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that on the 9th instant, for the purposes of the Aliens Act, 1905, he made the following Order under section 8 (2) of that Act:—

Whereas section 8 (2) of the Aliens Act, 1905, provides that the expression "immigrant ship" means a ship which brings to the United Kingdom more than twenty alien steerage passengers, who are to be landed in the United Kingdom whether at the same or

different ports, or such number of those passengers as may be for the time being fixed by Order of the Secretary of State;

And whereas by an Order, dated the 19th December, 1905, the number of those passengers was fixed at twelve;

And whereas it now seems to me expedient to revert to the number mentioned in the Act, that is to say twenty;

Now, I hereby withdraw the said Order.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Provincial District Schools: Exclusion of certain classes of Children.

To the Boards of Management of the Farnham and Hartley Wintney and the Walsall and West Bromwich School Districts;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions comprised in the said School Districts respectively;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by certain Orders of the Poor Law Board, the Farnham and Hartley Wintney and the Walsall and West Bromwich School Districts were formed for the management of the Infant Poor chargeable to the Poor Law Unions in those Districts respectively, not being above the age of sixteen years; and by the said Orders Boards of Management of the said Districts were constituted;

And whereas by certain other Orders of the Poor Law Board and the Local Government Board, regulations were prescribed for the government of every School (hereinafter referred to as a "District School") provided for each of the said Districts, including regulations as to the admission of children into the District School, and as to the duties of the Medical Officer of each District School; and it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned in regard to the District Schools:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order that the following regulations shall have effect in regard to each District School:—

ARTICLE I.—No child under the age of three years shall, unless We otherwise direct, be admitted into a District School.

ARTICLE II.—No child suffering from any contagious affection of the scalp or of the skin or of the eyes shall be admitted into a District School; and the Order of Admission to be signed by the Clerk to the Guardians of a Poor Law Union prior to the admission of any child into the District School from that Union shall not be given unless the Medical Officer of the Workhouse of the Union has examined the child on the day of the proposed removal of the child to the District School, or on the day immediately preceding, and has signed a Certificate in the following Form, which Certificate the Medical Officer of the Workhouse is hereby required to give, upon the request of the Clerk to the Guardians, or of the Master of the Workhouse, in every case in which, after due examination, he may find the child to be as therein described: that is to say,—

#### MEDICAL CERTIFICATE.

I, the undersigned, do hereby certify that I have this day personally examined \_\_\_\_\_, and that he is, in my judgment, free from any contagious affection of the scalp, of the skin, or of the eyes, and that he is in such a state of health as will permit of his taking part at once in the ordinary discipline and occupations of the District School.

ARTICLE III.—(1.) The Medical Officer of a District School shall, once at least in every calendar month, and as often as may be necessary, examine each child in the District School, and report to the Board of Management of the District School, immediately after any periodical examination, the case of any child suffering from any contagious affection of the scalp, or of the skin, or of the eyes.



(2.) The Superintendent, on being informed by the Medical Officer of any such case, shall forthwith cause the child to be separated from the children in health, and shall adopt such other precautions or take such other steps for preventing the spread of contagion as the Medical Officer may direct.

ARTICLE IV.—The Superintendent of a District School shall provide proper facilities for the examination of children by the Medical Officer of the District School in pursuance of this Order.

ARTICLE V.—In this Order the expression "Workhouse" includes any House provided by Guardians for the reception of children.

ARTICLE VI.—This Order shall come into operation from and after the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and six.
