> ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

NEWCASTLE-UPON-TYNE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Provision for Movement of Swine into City of Newcastle-upon-Tyne from a specified Area.

1.—(1.) The place of destination of swine moved from any lair, market, or saleyard in the Area described in the Schedule hereto, if such place of destination is in the city of Newcastleupon-Tyne may be a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or a lair, market, or saleyard licensed or authorised by the Local Authority of that city under the Newcastle-upon-Tyne (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") or this Order.

(2.) Swine so moved to a lair may be moved only to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or to a market or saleyard licensed by the Local Authority under the principal Order.

(3.) Swine moved to a market or saleyard may be moved only to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse.

(4.) The movement from a lair, market, or saleyard in the city of Newcastle-upon-Tyne is subject to the following provisions :—

(i.) the swine must be marked in the manner

(i.) the swine must be marked in the manner described in Article 2 of the principal Order; (ii.) the swine must be accompanied by a

(ii.) the swine must be accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city; and

(iii.) the movement must be in accordance with the provisions of the principal Order.

#### Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the NEWCASTLE-UPON-TYNE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906 (No. 2).

No. 227.-BALTIC-GULF OF BOTHNIA.

Nahkiainen und Plevna Shoals—Intended Change in Light-Vessels.

The Russian Government has given notice, dated 12th February, 1906, that from the opening of uavigation in the present year, the light-vessel formerly marking Nahkiainen Shoal will be moved to mark Plevna Shoal, and the lightvessel formerly marking Plevna Shoal will be placed to mark Nahkiainen Shoal. The characteristics of these light-vessels will then be as follows:—

Nahkiainen Light-vessel, moored on the western side of the shoal, painted red, with "Nahkiainen" in white letters on the sides, has two masts, and carries a red ball at the foremast head.

It exhibits, at an elevation of 30 feet above the sea, a red fixed light, visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.

During thick or foggy weather a hand foghorn gives one blast of six seconds' duration at intervals of two minutes.

When the fog-horn is not working the usual fog-signal for Russian light-vessels in the Baltic is made with the bell, viz., three strokes in quick succession followed by an interval of six seconds, continued for one minute, followed by a silent interval of two minutes.

A gun is fired when a vessel is observed standing into danger.

Approximate position, lat. 64° 35' N., long 23°  $52\frac{1}{2}$  E.

Plevna Light-vessel, moored about 2 miles west of Plevna Shoal, painted red, with "Plevna" in white letters on the sides, has two masts, and carries a red ball at each masthead.

It exhibits, at an elevation of 34 feet above the sea, two white fixed lights, placed horizontally, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 7 miles.

During thick or foggy weather, a fog siren gives one blast every fifteen seconds, thus: blast, seven and a half seconds; silent interval, seven and a half seconds.

When the fog siren is not working the usual fog-signal for light-vessels is made with the bell.

A gun is fired when a vessel is observed standing into danger.

Approximate position, lat. 65° 26' N., long. 24° 22' E.

Wicklow Head—Intended Alteration in Light.

The Commissioners of Irish Lights have given notice that it is intended during the present year to alter the character of the light exhibited from Wicklow Head from occulting to white group flashing, showing groups of three flashes every fifteen seconds, thus :--flash, three-tenths of a second; eclipse, two and two-tenths seconds; flash, three-tenths of a second; eclipse, two and two-tenths seconds; flash, three-tenths of a second; eclipse, nine and seven-tenths seconds. The light power will also be increased.

#### No. 232.—BALTIC—GULF OF FINLAND.

Helsingfors Approach—Lights Established and Altered.

The Government of Finland has given notice, dated 2nd February, 1906, that the under-

mentioned lights have been established in the approach to Helsingfors:---

1. Sandholm.—On the outer end of a pier on the eastern side of Sandholm, situated at a distance of  $\$_1^4$  cables S.  $65^\circ$  W. from Helsingfors Observatory, a light is exhibited at an elevation of 17 feet above the sea, visible from a distance of about 5 miles. and showing the following sectors :—red and white alternating from the bearing of S. 22° E., through south, to S. 72° W., green flashing from S. 72° W., through west, to N. 53° W., red and white alternating from N. 53° W. to N. 51° W., red flashing from N. 51° W. to N. 50° W., green flashing from N. 51° W. through north, to N. 15° E., red and white alternating from N. 30° E., red flashing from N. 30° E. to N. 62° E., being obscured in other directions.

2. Lik Grund.—On the southern part of Lik, at a distance of 12 cables S. 48° W. from Helsingfors Observatory, a light, elevated 16 feet above the sea, and visible from a distance of about 5 miles, is exhibited, showing the following sectors:—green flashing from N. 83° W. to N. 62° W., red and white alternating from N. 62° W., through north, to N. 18° E., red flashing from N. 18° E. to N. 48° E., green flashing from N. 48° E. to N. 59° E., white and red alternating from N. 59° E., through east and south, to S. 14° W., being obscured in other directions.

3. Miolö Knekt.—On the northern part of Miolö Knekt, situated at a distance of about  $3\frac{8}{10}$ miles S. 30° E. from Helsiugfors Observatory, a light is exhibited, elevated 19 feet above the sea, and visible from a distance of about 5 miles, showing the following sectors :—red and white alternating from N. 65° E., through east, to S. 85° E., obscured from S. 85° E. to S. 51° E., green flashing from S. 51° E. to S. 31° E., red and white alternating from S. 31° E. to S. 28° E., red flashing from S. 28° E., through south, to S. 18° W., green flashing from S. 18° W. to S. 56° W., red and white alternating from S. 56° W. to S. 59° W., red flashing from S. 59° W., through west, to N. 66° W., being obscured in other directions.

4. Miolko.—A red and white alternating light, elevated 36 feet above the sea, and visible from a distance of about 8 miles from the bearing of N. 59° W., through west, to S. 87° W., being obscured in other directions, is exhibited on the castern part of Miolko, situated at a distance of  $2\frac{1}{10}$  miles S. 42° W. from Helsingfors Observatory. This light in line with Tirgrundet Light N. 83° W. leads through the fairway of Miolo Road.

5. Tirgrundet.—This light will in future show alternating red and white from the bearing of S. 66° W., through west, to N. 74° W.

Approximate position, Helsingfors Observatory, lat. 60° 9<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>' N., long. 24° 57<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>' E.

6. Smultrongrund.—On the south-western side of a shoal named Smultrongrund, a light, elevated 24 feet above the sea, and visible from a distance of about 6 miles, is exhibited, showing the following sectors :—green flashing from S.  $36^{\circ}$  W. to S.  $71^{\circ}$  W., red and white alternating from S.  $71^{\circ}$  W., through west and north, to N.  $43^{\circ}$  E., red flashing from N.  $43^{\circ}$  E. to N.  $53^{\circ}$  E., green flashing from N.  $53^{\circ}$  E. to N.  $72^{\circ}$  E., red and white alternating from N.  $72^{\circ}$  E. to N.  $75^{\circ}$  E., red flashing from N.  $75^{\circ}$  E., through east, to S.  $69^{\circ}$  E., being obscured in other directions.

Approximate position, lat. 59° 56' 35" N., long. 24° 23' 50" E.

7. Ronngrund.—On the south-western part of a shoal named Ronngrund, a light, elevated 11 feet above the sea, and visible from a distance of

about 4 miles, is exhibited, showing the following sectors :--red and white alternating from N. 23° W., through north and east, to S. 88° E., from red flashing from S. 88° E. to S. 23° E., being obscured in other directions.

Approximate position, lat. 59° 56' 25" N., long. 24° 23' 40" E.

These two lights (5) and (6), in line N. 4° E. lead through the fairway.

All the foregoing lights are exhibited from iron white octagonal huts, with 'pyramidal roofs, erected on stone bases.

The following alterations have been made in the existing lights :-
