The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated March 12th, from His Majesty's Representative at The Hague, intimating that the following measures to be taken in Holland for the prevention of plague will remain in force for the year ending March 13th, 1907:—

The following are forbidden except by permission of the Minister for Home Affairs, and subject to the due observance of the directions which shall be given by him for the prevention of the spread of infection:—

1. The examination of persons and goods to detect the presence of infectious matter by means of experiments on animals.
2. The performance of autopsy of bodies of persons who have died from plague, or who are suspected to have been suffering from plague.
3. The removal of matter which is known or suspected to be infectious.

Juba River, 1893.

Ashantee Medal, with clasp, "Juba River, 1893," awarded to those who were engaged from H.M.S. Blanche, in the expedition on the Juba River, between 23rd and 25th August, 1893.

The clasp only is awarded to any who received the medal for former operations.

Lake Nyassa, 1893.

Ashantee Medal, with clasp, "Lake Nyassa, 1893," awarded to those who took part in the actions on Lake Nyassa in November, 1893.

The clasp only is awarded to any who received the medal for former operations.

Gambia, 1894.

Ashantee Medal, with clasp, "Gambia, 1894," awarded to those from the undermentioned ships who formed part of the expedition against Chief Fodi Selah between 22nd February and 11th March, 1894:—

THE MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Borough of Harrogate.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903"), it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, by regulations made under Section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in their opinion, be especially dangerous:

And whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act of 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

And whereas the Council of the Borough of Harrogate have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made under the above-mentioned provisions, or one of them, restricting to ten miles per hour the speed at which any motor car may be driven within the undermentioned roads or parts of roads, that is to say:—

Albert-street, Beulah-street, Bower-road, Cambridge-crescent, Cambridge-road, Cambridge-street, Chapel-street, Cheltenham-crescent, Cheltenham-mount, Cheltenham-parade, Cheltenham-square, Cold Bath-road, Commercial-street, Cornwall-road (from Ripon-road to the Grand Hotel), Crescent-road, Crown-place, Dragon-road, Dragon-parade, East-parade, Grove-road, High-street (Starbeck), James-street, Montpelier-road, Parliament-street, Princes-square, Princes-street, Promenade-square, Prospect-crescent, Regent-parade, Ripon-road, Royal-parade, Skipton-road, Station-parade, Station Bridge, Station-square, Swan-road, Victoria Bath's-road, West Park, York-road.

THE MOTOR CARS REGULATION (COUNTY OF PEEBLES) ORDER, 1906, dated March 5, 1906, prohibiting Motor Car Traffic on a Highway in the County of Peebles.

WHEREAS by section 8, as read with section 18, of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that the Secretary for Scotland may, in Scotland, by regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in his opinion, be especially dangerous:

And whereas by section 10, as read with section 18, of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that local authorities within the meaning of section 9 of the said Act, shall give public notice of any regulation of the Secretary for Scotland made in pursuance of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the use of motor cars on any highway, or part of a highway, or limiting the speed of motor cars within any limits or place, and for the purpose of giving effect to any such regulation, shall place notices in conspicuous places on or near the highway, part of a highway, limits or place, to which the regulation refers:

And whereas the County Council of the County of Peebles, being the Local Authority of the said county, have applied to me to make a regulation under the said Acts, and I am of opinion that it is desirable to give effect to the said application:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers vested in me in that behalf, I, the Right Honourable John Sinclair, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following regulations under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, as read with section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars Regulation (County of Peebles) Order, 1906," and the regulation hereby prescribed shall take effect on the highway specified therein on and after the date at which, for the purpose of giving effect thereto, the local authority shall place notices in conspicuous places on or near such highway.
2. No person shall cause or permit a motor car to be driven, or shall drive a motor car, on such part of the highway named in the first column of the schedule to this Order as is defined in the second column of the said schedule.
