## LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

The Board of Trade have recently confirmed the following Orders made by the Light Railway Commissioners:—(1) County of Middlesex (Waltham Cross and Enfield) Light Railways Order, 1906, authorizing the construction of Light Railways in the Urban Districts of Enfield and Edmonton, in the County of Middlesex. (2) County of Hertford Light Railways Order, 1906, authorizing the construction of a Light Railway in the Urban District of Cheshunt, in the County of Hertford. (3) Blagdon and Pensford Light Railway Order, 1906, authorizing the construction of a Light Railway in the County of Somerset, from Blagdon to Pensford.
