No. 278.—AFRICA, CAPE COLONY.

Table Bay—Wreck no longer Dangerous, Lights.

The following information respecting the wreck and lights in Table Bay is taken from the Navigating Officer's Remark Book, His Majesty's ship Forte, 1905:—

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 663 of 1902:—

a. The wreck of the ship Highfields, which sank in a depth of about 10 fathoms, at a distance of 8 cables N. 40° E. from the end of the north breakwater, is not regarded by the local pilots as dangerous to navigation, as it is supposed to have become embedded in the sand.

The green wreck buoy and the tug have in consequence been withdrawn.

Vessels are, however, recommended to avoid anchoring over the wreck.

Approximate position, lat. 33° 53' S., long. 18° 25½' E.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 365 of 1904:—

b. A provisional fixed green light (oil lantern), visible over an arc of about 200°, is shown from the extremity of the breakwater in place of the light washed away.

c. The three white fixed lights triangularly placed on the south pier have been discontinued. [Variation 29° Westerly in 1906.]

INVERCLYDE BEQUEST.

(Confirmation of Holograph Trust Disposition of George Arbuthnot Second Baron Inverclyde; Alteration or Annulment of certain Provisions thereof; vesting of Trust Estate in Trustees thereof; Definition of Trusts thereof; Payments by Trustees; Powers and Duties of Trustees; Appointment of New Trustees; ultimate vesting of Trust Estate in Merchants' House of Glasgow for Charitable Purposes; Definition of Objects of Charity; Administration of Trust and Powers and Duties of Merchants' House in regard thereto; Alteration of Powers and Confirmation of Schemes relating to Trust Estate by Court of Session; Confirmation of Agreements; Variation and Extinguishment of Rights and Interests; and other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Secretary for Scotland, on or before the 17th day of April

next, for a Provisional Order (hereinafter called "the Order"), for all or some of the following, among other purposes, that is to say:—

To remove doubts as to the validity of and to confirm and give effect to, with such alterations as the Order may prescribe, a certain holograph testamentary writing (hereinafter called "the trust deed"), signed by the late Right Honourable George Arbuthnot, second Baron Inverclyde (hereinafter called "Lord Inverclyde").

To alter or annul all or some of the provisions of the trust deed with regard to the application of the income and capital of the estate of Lord Inverclyde (hereinafter called "the trust estate") and other matters, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.

To vest the trust estate in the trustees of the trust deed (hereinafter called "the trustees"), and to define the trusts upon which the trustees shall hold the trust estate, both as regards income and capital.

To authorize the trustees to make certain payments out of the income or capital of the trust estate not provided for by the trust deed, including such payment as the Order may prescribe to the widow of Lord Inverclyde.

To confer upon the trustees with or without variation all or some of the powers possessed by gratuitous trustees and such further powers as the Order may prescribe, including powers of sale and investment of the trust estate in such securities as the Order may prescribe, and retention of securities forming part of the trust estate whether such securities are or are not authorized by law as trust investments.

To provide for the appointment of new trustees of the trust deed, and to regulate the administration of the trust estate by the trustees.

To provide for the vesting in or conveyance to the Merchants' House of Glasgow of the capital of the trust estate at such period and in such manner as the Order may prescribe, upon trust for the benefit of seamen and of seamen's charities in Scotland, England, Ireland and the United States of America, or some or one of those countries in terms of the trust deed or otherwise as may be provided in the Order.

To confirm any agreement or agreements that have been or may be entered into between the trustees, the Right Honourable Mary Baroness Inverclyde and the said Merchants' House of Glasgow, with regard to any of the matters aforesaid, and to authorize the said parties to enter into and carry into effect other agreements with reference thereto.

To make provision for and regulate the management and administration of the trust estate in the hands of the said Merchants' House and the application of the income and capital thereof, and to confirm any agreement, scheme, or arrangement with regard to such purposes, or any of them.

To define or provide for the definition of the persons and bodies, or classes of persons or bodies, who, and the proportions in which such person or bodies shall be entitled or allowed to participate in the trust estate and to make provision for the giving of a preference in such participation to any persons or classes of persons.

To authorize the said Merchants' House to vary from time to time the application of the income and capital of the trust estate in such manner as they may think fit, or as may be approved by the Court of Session, or otherwise as the Order may prescribe.
