FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under section 36 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, repealing the existing Orders under that section which permit the employment of women and young persons from 9 A.M. to 9 P.M. in certain cases, but allowing the continuance of such employment for one year only and subject to conditions in Bookbinding Factories in London, Drapers' Workrooms in Manchester and Salford, and Factories and Workshops for the manufacture of straw hats and bonnets.

Revellata Point Light-Alteration in Character of.

The French Government has given notice, dated 15th March, 1906, that it is intended, during the present year, to alter the character of Revellata Point Light from white fixed to a white group flashing light, showing groups of two flashes every ten seconds, thus:—flash, three-tenths of a second; eclipse, two and fourtenth seconds; flash, three-tenths of a second; eclipse, seven seconds, the light power being 40,000 candles.

A provisional white group flashing light, showing groups of two flashes every ten seconds, and visible from the bearing of N. 70° E., through east and south, to N. 35° W., will be exhibited in place of the present light during alterations.

The new light may be exhibited also, experimentally.

(Purchase by Compulsion or Agreement of Undertaking of Poole Waterworks Company; Winding up and Dissolution of Company; Transfer of Powers and conferring of Additional Powers: Maintenance and Improvement of Existing Works; Construction of Additional Waterworks; Taking of Water; Extension of Limits; Supply of Water; Acceptable of Limits of quisition, Appropriation, Retention and Sale of Lands; Protection of Water; Surplus Lands; Bye-Laws; Agreements with Bournemouth Gas and Water Company for Purchase of Part of their Undertaking; Rates and Charges; Borrowing of Money; Levying, Collection and Recovery of Borough, Poor, General District and other Rates; Repeal, Amendment and Incorporation of Acts.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Poole (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") for an Act for all or some of the following objects and purposes (that is to say):

1. To empower the Corporation to purchase, by compulsion or agreement, the undertaking, rights, powers and properties of the Poole Waterworks Company (hereinafter called "the Company,") to provide for the transfer to and vesting in the Corporation of the said undertaking, rights, powers, and properties, to provide for the application of the purchase money, and the payment of the debts of the Company, the redemption or extinction of all mortgages and other charges and encumbrances of the Company, and to provide for the continuance of their debenture stock, charged upon the present security or some other security, the employment of or compensa-tion to officers and servants of the Company, the compensation of directors, and the winding up and dissolution of the Company, and to confirm and authorize the carrying into effect of any agreement between the Company and the Corporation entered into prior to the passing of the intended Act for the sale and purchase of the undertaking, or otherwise.

2. To provide for the settlement by arbitration (in default of agreement) of the amount of purchase money or compensation for, and the terms and conditions of, the transfer to the Corporation of the Company's undertaking, rights, powers, and properties, and for the settlement of all other questions in relation to or connected with the transfer.

3. To empower the Corporation to carry on the undertaking acquired by them, and to maintain, alter, improve, enlarge, renew, or discontinue the existing waterworks of the Company, or some of them, and to authorize the Corporation to supply water for public, domestic, trade and other purposes within an area comprising the whole or part of the borough of Poole, the parishes of Canford Magna and Lytchett Minster, in the rural district of Poole, and the parish of Corfe Mullen in the rural district of Wimborne and Cranborne, all in the county of Dorset.

4. To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the powers contained in the Act and Orders relating to the Company's undertaking including the Order for which they have applied in the present Session, or to repeal the said Act and Orders, and to re-enact with amendments, and to make applicable to the Corporation and to their proposed limits of supply, all or some of the

enactments contained therein.

5. To empower the Corporation to make and maintain the waterworks and other works hereinafter described in the parishes of Canford Magna, Corfe Mullen, Lytchett Minster and Sturminster Marshall and the borough and parish of Poole, all in the county of Dorset (namely):

Work No. 1.—A pumping station, with wells, headings and other works and conveniences connected therewith, to be situate in the parish of Corfe Mullen, to be constructed in and upon land forming two adjoining fields which abut upon the south side of the Somerset and Dorset Railway, numbered respectively 133 and 139 on the 1500 Ordnance Map (2nd edition, 1901) of the said parish of Corfe Mullen, between Corfe Mullen level crossing and the bridge carrying the road from Corfe Mullen to Chalk Pit Copse over the said railway;

Work No. 2.—An aqueduct, conduit, or line or lines of pipes commencing at or near to the said Work No. 1, in the said parish of Corfe Mullen, and terminating at or near to Work No. 3 hereinafter mentioned, at Forest Hill, in the parish of Lytchett Minster, at a point two and a half chains or thereabouts, measured in a westerly direction, from the stone marking the intersection of the boundaries of the parishes of Corfe Mullen, Sturminster Marshall, and Lychett Minster;

Work No. 5.—A covered service reservoir (Reservoir No. 2) to be situate in the said parish of Lytchett Minster to be constructed in and upon a piece of land forming part of the field numbered 159 on the \$\frac{2700}{2700}\$ Ordnance Map (2nd edition 1901) of the said parish of Lytchett Minster, and abutting upon the south-west side of the said Poole and Blandford main road to the northward of the common, at a point nineteen chains or thereabouts measured along the said road in a north-westerly direction from the mile-stone on the said road marked Poole three miles;

Work No. 6.—An aqueduct, conduit, or line or lines of pipes to be situate in the said parish of Lytchett Minster commencing by a junction or junctions with the said Works No. 4 and 5 or either of them, and terminating at the point where the Poole and Blandford main road is crossed by the road leading from Lytchett Minster to Upton;

Work No. 7.—An aqueduct, conduit, or line or lines of pipes commencing at the termination of the said Work No. 6, in the said parish of Lytchett Minster, passing through the parish of Corfe Mullen, and terminating in the parish of Canford Magna on or near to Creekmoor Bridge at the boundary line between the said parish of Canford Magna and the borough;

Work No. 8.—An aqueduct, conduit, or line or lines of pipes to be situate in the borough and parish of Poole, commencing at the termination of the said Work No. 7 and terminating at or near to Work No. 9, hereinafter mentioned, on Constitution Hill at a point on the said hill four chains or thereabouts measured along a straight line running due south from the house known as Parkstone Heights;

Work No. 9.—A covered service reservoir (Reservoir No. 3) to be situate in the said borough, to be constructed in and upon a piece of land known as Constitution Hill, numbered 20 on the \(\frac{25}{1500}\) Ordnance Map (2nd edition, 1901), of the parish of Parkstone, and lying between and abutting upon the Ringwood-road and St. Peter's-road at and near to the junction of the roads;

Work No. 10.—An aqueduct, conduit, or line or lines of pipes to be situate in the said parish of Lytchett Minster, commencing at the termination of the said Work No. 6 and terminating on the Poole and Blandford main road at a point where that road is crossed by the boundary line between the said parish of Lytchett Minster and the borough;

Work No. 11.—An aqueduct, conduit, or line or lines of pipes to be situate in the said borough, commencing at the termination of the said Work No. 10 and terminating on the Hamworthy-road at a point thirteen chains or thereabouts measured along the said road in a south-easterly direction from Hamworthy School.

6. To authorize the Corporation to deviate in the construction of the proposed works, both vertically and horizontally, to the extent shown on the deposited plans and sections, or to be defined in the intended Act.

7. To authorize the Corporation on any lands

belonging to them to make, maintain, alter, renew and repair cuts, channels, catchwaters, tunnels, adits, pipes, culverts, conduits, drains, sluices, byc-washes, shafts, wells, bores, watertowers, overflows, waste-water channels, gauges, filter beds, tanks, banks, walls, bridges, embankments, piers, approaches, engines, machinery and appliances

8. To empower the Corporation to take, impound, divert, appropriate and use all such streams, springs and waters as can or may be taken, impounded, diverted, appropriated, or used by the Company, or as can or may be intercepted or taken by the existing or proposed works, or as may be found on, in, or under any lands for the time being belonging to the Corporation, or over, or in respect of which they have, for the time being, easements.

9. To empower the Corporation to acquire by compulsion for the purposes of the intended Act, lands, hereditaments and easements and rights in, or over any lands and hereditaments in the parishes of Canford Magna, Corfe Mullen, Lytchett Minster, and Sturminster Marshall, and the borough and parish of Poole.

10. To exempt the Corporation from the operation of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, relating to superfluous lands, and to make other amendments in the Land Clauses Acts, in their application to the intended Act.

11. To empower the Corporation to purchase by agreement, and to appropriate lands, buildings and hereditaments, and easements and rights in, under and over lands for any of the purposes of their undertaking (including the protection of their water against pollution) and to sell, lease and dispose of lands, buildings and hereditaments, and to reserve to themselves the water rights in or under any lands and hereditaments so sold, let or disposed of and to erect dwellings for persons in their employment upon any land belonging to them.

12. To authorize the Corporation to discharge water from their existing and proposed waterworks into any available stream or watercourse.

13. To authorize the Corporation both within and without the borough to lay down, maintain, alter and renew mains, pipes, culverts, discharge pipes, telephone or telegraph conductors, wires and posts and other works, in, through, along, under, across, and over highways (whether dedicated to the public or not), streets, roads, streams, paths and railways, and for those purposes to extend to such works all or any of the provisions of the Waterworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863.

14. To make provision for securing the purity of the water obtained by the Corporation, for regulating the user of, and the construction of, necessary works on lands over or under which such water flows, and for inspection thereof, and the prevention of nuisances, and of the pollution and contamination of water, and to empower the Corporation to enter into agreements with the owners, lessees and occupiers of lands with reference to the matters aforesaid, and to make and enforce bye-laws with reference thereto.

15. To make provision in regard to the supply of water, and, amongst other things, with reference to the following matters:—

The rates for supply of water for domestic purposes; the payment of rates by owners of small houses; the provision of separate communication pipes for each house; the prevention of waste, undue consumption, misuse and contamination of water; the supply of water by measure; supply to houses used partly for trade; the supply to ships and vessels; the pressure at which water is to be supplied; the sale and letting by the Corporation of meters, pipes, and fittings and the extension thereto of Section 14 of the Waterworks Clauses Act, 1863; regulations as to supply by meter; the making of bye-laws; the imposition and recovery of penalties.

- 16. To empower the Corporation, and any local authority, company or person within or beyond the limits of the intended Act, to enter into and fulfil contracts and agreements in relation to the supply of water by the Corporation in bulk or otherwise.
- 17. To authorize the Corporation to levy or impose rates, rents and charges for the supply of water, and for the use or hire of meters, fittings, apparatus and things, to alter existing rates, rents and charges, and to confer, vary or extinguish exemptions from the payment of rates, rents and charges.
- 18. To confer upon the Corporation, with reference to their water undertaking, all or some of the rights, powers and privileges of a local authority under the Public Health Acts, and to empower them to exercise such rights, powers, and privileges within and without their borough.
- 19. To empower the Corporation and the Bournemouth Gas and Water Company to enter into and carry into effect contracts and agreements for the transfer to the Corporation of all or any part of the undertaking of the said Company situate within the borough of Poole, to extend the provisions of the intended Act to the undertaking so transferred, and to enact all necessary provisions for giving effect to any such contract or agreement.
- 20. To extinguish all public and private rights of way and other rights over the lands acquired under the intended Act, and to vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would or might in any way prevent or interfere with or delay the accomplishment of any of the objects of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.
- 21. To provide for the application of the revenue and profits arising from the water undertaking of the Corporation, and for meeting any deficiency in such revenue out of the district fund or such other fund or rate as may be indicated in the intended Act, and to provide for the formation and application of a reserve fund in respect of the said undertaking and of a pension fund for the persons in the employment of the Corporation in connection with that undertaking.
- 22. To authorize the Corporation to borrow money for the purchase of the said undertaking, for the construction of the proposed works, for paying the costs of the intended Act, and of the opposition to the Order of the Company and otherwise for the purposes of the intended Act upon the security of their water undertaking or the revenue thereof, and upon the district fund and the general district rate, and any other rates, revenue or property of the Corporation, or on any of such securities, and to empower the Corporation to grant and issue mortgages, debentures and stock in respect thereof.
- 23. To make provision for the redemption and extinction of the debenture stock of the Company and for that purpose to empower the Corporation to borrow money and to establish a sinking fund.
 - 24. To make further provision in regard to the

- levying, collecting and recovery of the borough rate, the general district rate, the poor rate, the water rate, and other rates leviable in the borough, to provide for all or any of such rates being collected by the assistant overseer, to empower the Corporation to appoint collectors, clerks and other assistants to the overseers, and to use one form of rate, demand note, receipts and other documents.
- 25. To authorize the Corporation to use one form of mortgage for all purposes for which they are for the time being authorized to borrow money, charging the loans upon all or any of the revenues, rates or property of the Corporation.
- 26. To make further provision in regard to the acquisition and holding of land, and to empower the Corporation to appropriate for any purpose for which they are empowered to hold lands, any lands for the time being vested in them and not required for the purposes for which they were acquired.
- 27. To alter, amend, extend, enlarge or repeal or re-enact, with or without amendment, all or some of the provisions of the Poole Waterworks Act, 1859; the Poole Water Order, 1881 (confirmed by the Water Orders Confirmation Act, 1881); the Poole Water Order, 1887 (confirmed by the Water Orders Confirmation Act, 1887); the Poole Water Order, 1893 (confirmed by the Water Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act, 1893); the Poole (Extension) Order, 1905 (confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 12) Act, 1905); and any other Act or Order relating to the Company or their undertaking or to the borough of Poole.
- 28. To incorporate with amendments all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts; the Waterworks Clauses Acts, 1845 and 1863; the Arbitration Act, 1889, the Public Health Acts, the Local Loans Act, 1875; the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845; and any Act or Acts varying or amending those Acts.

Plans and sections of the intended works and plans of the lands intended to be taken for the purposes of the Act, together with books of reference to the plans, and copies of this notice as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited on or before the 18th April instant for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Dorset at his office in Sherborne, with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of the town of Poole at his office in the borough, and with the Town Clerk of Poole at his office in the borough, and on or before the same day copies of so much of the plans, sections and books of reference as relates to each of the parishes of Canford Magna, Corfe Mullen, Lytchett Minster, and Sturminster Marshall will be deposited with the Clerks to the Parish Councils of those parishes respectively at their respective offices, or if they or any of them have no offices or office at their or his residence or residences, and a copy of this notice as published in the London Gazette will accompany each of the said deposits.
