The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated April 6th, from His Majesty's Representative at Stockholm enclosing the following translation of a Circular, dated March 30, issued by the Royal Swedish Board of Trade, respecting quarantine measures in force in Sweden:

In compliance with the Royal Order in Council of December 5th, 1905, the Board of Trade, upon official reports, hereby declare Perth, Fremantle, and Geraldton, in Western Australia, infected with plague; the Island of Sumatra,

Africa, free from plague, and the Russian Poland free from cholera.

In accordance with the notices previously issued the following places are considered as infected:

With Plague-

The Russian Government Astrachan; Egypt; Rio de Janeiro in Brazil; Peru; Antofagasta and Pisagua in Chile; the provinces of the Hedschas and Yemen in Arabia; the Ural territory in Asia; the port of Schat-el-Arab; British East India; Rangoon in British Burma; Manila on Luzon; the Islands of Formosa and Hongkong; Hanoi in Tonkin; the ports of Newchwang, Foochow, and Amoy in China; Japan; Madagascar; Port Elizabeth; Perth, Fremantle, and Geraldton in Western Australia; and

With Cholera-

Asiatic Turkey; the ports of the Red Sea; the ports of British East India; Cochin China; Tonkin; China; Japan, and Morocco.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the following Bye-laws and Regulations were made by the Corporation of the Borough of Hastings at a meeting held on the 6th day of April, 1906:—

BYE-LAWS and REGULATIONS made by the Corporation of Hastings as the Local Authority for the Borough, under Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, and Section 65 of the Bexhill and St. Leonards Light Railways Order, 1900.

The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Hastings, acting by the Council as the Local Authority for the said Borough under the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Bexhill and St. Leonards Light Railways Order, 1900, do hereby with respect to the tramways and to the portion of the railways authorized by the said Order laid down within the said Borough, and in pursuance of the power for that purpose contained in the said Act and Order, make the Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter contained as to the following matters:—

The distances at which carriages using such tramways and railways shall be allowed to follow one after the other.

The stopping of carriages using such tramways and railways.

The traffic on the road in which such tramways and railways are laid.

- 1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any machine, engine, or carriage, using the tramways or railways, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car; the term "Local Authority" shall mean the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Hastings acting by the Council, and the term "the Company" shall mean the Hastings Tramways Company and any company authorized to construct or use any tramways within the borough.
- 2. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than 50 yards.
- 3. In any street in which the Local Authority after notice to the Company shall have appointed stations or stopping places for the taking up and setting down of passengers, no driver of any car shall stop the same except at such stations or stopping places as aforesaid, or at a passing place or terminus unless when necessary to preserve the distance required by Bye-law No. 2, or when required by any police officer having the direction of street traffic in any street, or to avoid impending danger.
- 4. Every driver of a car shall cause such car to stop at all points from time to time duly appointed by the Local Authority, in pursuance of the Bye-law in that behalf, as absolute stopping places for such car.
- 5. Every driver of a car on being informed or becoming aware at any of the points from time to time duly appointed by the Local Authority in pursuance of the Bye-law in that behalf as conditional stopping places for such car, of the intention of any passenger to alight from such car, or on being hailed by any passenger in waiting at any such point, if such car shall not then be occupied by the full number of passengers that may lawfully be conveyed in or upon it, shall cause such car to stop at such point.
- 6. Such places as shall be appointed by the Local Authority and indicated in each case by a

- notice affixed in some conspicuous position at or near to such place, and marked with the words "All cars stop here," shall be deemed to be absolute stopping places, and such places as shall be so appointed and indicated as aforesaid, and marked with the words "cars stop by request," shall be deemed to be conditional stopping places for the taking up and setting down of passengers.
- 7. Every conductor of a car on being informed, or becoming aware of the intention of any passenger to alight from such car, or on being hailed by any passenger in waiting at any point duly appointed by the local authority in pursuance of the Bye-law in that behalf as a conditional stopping place, if such car shall not then be occupied by the full number of persons that may lawfully be conveyed in or upon it, shall forthwith communicate such intention, or the fact of being so hailed, to the driver of such car.
- 8. No car shall be stopped within 10 yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails unless the driver of such car is so required by any police officer having the direction of street traffic in any street or to avoid impending danger.
- 9. Every driver of a car on coming in sight of a vehicle travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.
- 10. No person shall in any way wilfully obstruct or interfere with the traffic on the railway or tramway, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.
- 11. The Company shall cause to be placed and kept in a conspicuous position inside of every car and at each end thereof, a complete printed copy of these Bye-laws.
- 12. The Company, or any driver, conductor, or other person who shall disregard or neglect or fail to observe or comply with any of these Bye-laws, so far as such Bye-laws are applicable to the Company, or any driver, conductor, or other person respectively, shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against the Bye-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty of 40s. for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence 10s. for every day during which the offence continues. Provided, nevertheless, that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made or any proceedings taken in respect of any such offence may, if they think fit, adjudge the payment as a penalty of any sum less than the full amount of the penalty imposed by these Bye-laws and Regulations.
- 13. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the thirtieth day of June, 1906.
