WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (City of Norwich) Order, 1906.

Dated 23rd April, 1906.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the Council of the City of Norwich, I hereby make the following Order:-

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (City of Norwich) Order, 1906."

BIRDS.

Additions to Schedule of Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the City and the County of the City of Norwich (which county includes all that part of Norwich without the walls and within the areas described in Clause V of this Order) to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:-Little Bittern, Great Bustard, Crossbill, Sand Martin, Bearded Titmouse or Reed Pheasant.

Close Time extended.

111. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1889 shall be extended throughout the City and the County of the City of Norwich so far as regards the Birds mentioned in the schedule to

the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as amended by the Act of 1881, or added thereto by Clause II of this Order, except the Snipe, Teal, and all species of Wild Duck, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of September in any year.

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The Bittern, Little Bittern and the Great Bustard Protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the Bittern, Little Bittern and the Great Bustard is prohibited throughout the City and County of the City of Norwich.

All Birds Protected on Sundays.

V. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited within the City of Norwich, and within the County of the said City, namely, the parts without the walls, and the parts of the Rivers Yare or Wensum within the County of the said City, from the boundary of the County of the said City at Hellesdon to Hardley Cross, at Hardley, and from Trowse Hythe to, at, or near, Earlham Bridge, and the rands, skirts, and walls of all the before-mentioned rivers, and the fens, reed grounds, islands therein, and dykes within the said County communicating therewith.

Eggs.

All Eggs Protected in certain Areas.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds—except the House Sparrow—is prohibited during the period expiring on the last day of February, 1911, within the areas described in Clause V. of this Order.

Repeal of former Order.

VII. The Order of the 4th April, 1901, is hereby repealed.

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ORDER of the Local Government Board: District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Duties and District:----

KENT AUDIT DISTRICT.

- To Nugent Charles Simner, Barrister-at-Law, District Auditor ;—
- To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order;—
- To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised within the said Unions respectively;—
- To the Authorities referred to in Article I (3) of this Order ;—

To the Council of the city of Rochester ;--

To the Rochester and Chatham Joint Hospital Board ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas the said Nugent Charles Simner is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment to the office of District Auditor of the said Nugent Charles Simner (hereinafter referred to as "the District Auditor"), and do Order and Prescribe as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers; namely:—

- (1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order.
- (2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said several Unions.
- (3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said Unions, and whose Accounts are not subject to audit by any other District Auditor.
- (4.) The Council of the City of Rochester, so far as those Accounts relate to receipts and expenditure under the Education Act, 1902.
- (5.) The Rochester and Chatham Joint Hospital Board.
- (6.) Such other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may by Order hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the District Auditor shall, from and after the date hereof, act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him for the performance of his duties under this Order, shall be termed "The Kent Audit District," and shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order, the City named in paragraph (4) of Article I of this Order, the District of the Joint Hospital Board named in paragraph (5) of the said Article, and the Districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in paragraph (6) of the said Article.

ARTICLE IV.—Any Order in force assigning a District to the District Auditor for the discharge of his duties or prescribing his duties, shall, from and after the date of this Order, be rescinded, but nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the existing duties and powers of any District Auditor as regards any Audit of which notice has already been given or any matters or proceedings already commenced. ARTICLE V.-In this Order-

The term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.



BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

The Croydon and District Electric Tramways Act, 1902.

The Croydon and District Electric Tramways (Extensions) Act, 1903.

The Mitcham Light Railway Order, 1901.

BYE-LAWS and REGULATIONS made the 5th day of April, 1906, by the British Electric Traction Company Limited, under the powers conferred on the Company by the Tramways Act of 1870 and the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and the Mitcham Light Railway Order, 1901. 1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter

set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company used ou the tramways or railways, and to all places with respect to which the Company now have or at any time hereafter may have power to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

2. Every person shall enter or depart from a carriage by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor. No passenger shall board or enter or attempt to board or enter a carriage until all passengers desiring to alight have done so.

3. The motorman of a carriage, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the carriage to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to . be removed so as not to obstruct the carriage.

4. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramway or railway.

5. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette in or upon any carriage, except behind the trolley pole on the top of the carriage. Any person offending against this Bye-law shall be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty below mentioned, to be summarily removed at the first opportunity from the carriage.

6. No person shall expectorate in, upon, or against any carriage.

7. No passenger or other person shall, while in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

8. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious, or infectious disorder, shall enter or mount upon any carriage, and any such person found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed from the carriage by or under the direction of the conductor.

9. No person shall whistle or sing, or swear, or use obscene, noisy or offensive language, whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon, or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

10. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or. damage any cushions or the linings, or remove •...

or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or upon any carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage donc.

11. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of the carriage, soil or injure the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter into or mount, or remain in or upon any carriage; and shall not enter into or mount upon any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in or upon any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

12. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company the fare legally demandable for the journey.

13. Each passenger shall show his ticket when required to do so to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Company, and shall also, when required to do so, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

14. A ticket shall only be available for the carriage on or for which it is issued (except in the case of transfer, return, or season tickets), and no passenger shall be entitled to leave any carriage for any purpose whatever at any stage or place and resume his journey by a different carriage to that on or for which such ticket was issued without payment of a fresh fare from the point at which the passenger again entered the same or other carriage.

Tickets issued to passengers are not transferable.

15. No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible.

16. No passenger shall use, or attempt to use, a ticket on any day for which such ticket is not available, or which has already been used on a previous journey.

17. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Company, shall not use, or attempt to use, any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers.

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18. No passenger shall bring in or on to any carriage any luggage other than his own personal luggage, and any such personal luggage shall be carried at the responsibility of the passenger. The personal luggage of any passenger must not exceed 28 lbs. in weight, and must be carried by hand, and must not occupy or overlap any part of a seat, or be placed so as to reduce the clear way between seats, nor be of a form or description to annoy or inconvenience any other passenger.

19. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Company, shall ride on, or lean over the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand on the roof, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall board a carriage, and no person shall hold on or hang on to any part of a carriage.

20. When any carriage contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation is provided in such

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interior, no additional person shall enter by coming in the interior of such carriage, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

When any carriage contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation is provided on such outside no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.

21. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

2. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any carriage except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to any passenger. Any dog or other animal so taken in or on a carriage shall be carried on the lap of the passenger, and not otherwise. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested by the conductor not to do so. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

23. No person shall enter, get upon, or travel in or on any carriage with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement, or any material, or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

24. No person, other than the conductor or motorman or other servant of the Company acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controller, brakes, lamps. lights, trolley rope, or any part of a carriage or its equipment, and no person other than the conductor or other servant of the Company acting in the performance of his duty, shall ring or otherwise signal the carriage to start.

25. No person shall wilfully obstruct any conductor, motorman, or other servant of the Company acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage, tramway, or railway, or any part thereof.

26. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.

27. Any person offending against or committing a breach of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

28. There shall be placed, and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage, a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

29. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Company, and having charge of a carriage.

'30. These Bye-laws shall come iuto force on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and six.
