WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (City of Norwich) Order, 1906.

Dated 23rd April, 1906.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the Council of the City of Norwich, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (City of Norwich) Order, 1906."

BIRDS.

Additions to Schedule of Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the City and the County of the City of Norwich (which county includes all that part of Norwich without the walls and within the areas described in Clause V of this Order) to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—Little Bittern, Great Bustard, Crossbill, Sand Martin, Bearded Titmouse or Reed Pheasant.

Close Time extended.

III. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the City and the County of the City of Norwich, so far as regards the Birds mentioned in the schedule to

the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as amended by the Act of 1881, or added thereto by Clause II of this Order, except the Snipe, Teal, and all species of Wild Duck, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of September in any year.

The Bittern, Little Bittern and the Great Bustard Protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the Bittern, Little Bittern and the Great Bustard is prohibited throughout the City and County of the City of Norwich.

All Birds Protected on Sundays.

V. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited within the City of Norwich, and within the County of the said City, namely, the parts without the walls, and the parts of the Rivers Yare or Weensum within the County of the said City, from the boundary of the County of the said City at Hellesdon to Hardley Cross, at Hardley, and from Trowse Hythe to, at, or near, Earham Bridge, and the rands, skirts, and walls of all the before-mentioned rivers, and the fens, reed grounds, islands therein, and dykes within the said County communicating therewith.

Eggs.

All Eggs Protected in certain Areas.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds—except the House Sparrow—is prohibited during the period expiring on the last day of February, 1911, within the areas described in Clause V. of this Order.

Repeal of former Order.

VII. The Order of the 4th April, 1901, is hereby repealed.
