ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 25TH APRIL 1906.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or of any Order by which such provisions are applied to any scheduled area, swine may be moved to the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and from such exhibition to any place of destination in Great Britain situate in any scheduled area, if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement.

2. In the case of movement to the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by some person authorised in that behalf by the Oxfordshire County Council, and in the case of movement from the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

3. The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the exhibition or place of destination specified in the Licence and not elsewhere, and while being so moved shall not be subject to Regulations made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board relating to Swine-Fever.

INSTRUMENT substituting the New Church of Saint Osmund, situate within the parish of Osmaston by Derby, in the county of Derby, and in the diocese of Southwell, for the Old Church of Saint James, situate within and hitherto being the Parish Church of the same parish.

To all to whom these presents shall come the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England send Greeting.

WHEREAS a new church has lately been built

within the parish of Osmaston by Derby, in the county of Derby, and in the diocese of Southwell, and has been consecrated and dedicated to Saint Osmund.

And whereas the Right Reverend Edwyn, Bishop of the said diocese of Southwell, as Diocesan, Sir Robert Rodney Wilmot, of Binfield-grove, Bracknell, Berks, Baronet, as the patron of the vicarage of the said parish of Osmaston by Derby, and the Reverend Launcelot Sydney Currey, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the Vicar or Incumbent of the said vicarage of Osmaston by Derby, have by an Instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the seventeenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said parish of Osmaston by Derby that the said new church of Saint Osmund, situate within such parish, should be substituted for the old parish church (dedicated to Saint James) of the same parish.

Now, therefore, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained in the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do by this Instrument, under our common seal, with the consents (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said Edwyn, Bishop of the the said diocese of Southwell, and of the said Robert Rodney Wilmot, and Launcelot Sydney Currey, hereby declare that the said new church of Saint Osmund, situate within the said parish of Osmaston by Derby, and duly consecrated as aforesaid, shall be and the same is hereby substituted for the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint James as aforesaid) of the same parish, and that such new church shall henceforth be the parish church of the said parish of Osmaston by Derby, in lieu of the said old parish church of Saint James, as fully in all respects as if the said new church of Saint Osmund, so hereby substituted, had been originally the parish church of the same parish; and we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint James as aforesaid), of the said parish of Osmaston by Derby, or of or belonging to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof, to the said new church of Saint Osmund (now being by virtue of these presents the parish church of the said parish of Osmaston by Derby), and to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof, and his successors, for ever.

In witness whereof to these presents we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have set our common seal, and the said Edwyn, Bishop of the said diocese of Southwell, has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal, and the said Robert Rodney Wilmot and Launcelot Sydney Currey have respectively set their hands and affixed their seals this fifth day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six.
