Kiel Fiord Entrance—Regulations Respecting Artillery Practice.

The German Government has given notice, dated 7th April, 1906, that artillery practice will take place during certain specified periods over an area, as given below, in the entrance to Kiel Fiord, and that the following regulations must be observed by mariners entering and leaving the fiord during those periods:—

- 1. From 25th June to 21st August next gun practice will take place in the entrance to Kiel Fiord from 6.30 A.M. to 3 P.M. (with regard to night firing, see No. 6 below).
- 2. THE LIMITS OF THE PRACTICE AREA ARE AS FOLLOWS.—On the west by a line drawn N. 10° E. from Bülk Point Lighthouse and to the southward by the shore between Friedrichsort and Bülk; on the north by the parallel of 54° 30′ N.; on the east by a line drawn N. 10° E. from the church of Schonberg; on the south by the line (S. 23° E.) from Friedrichsort Lighthouse to Korugen Pier.

Approximate position, Bulk Lighthouse, lat. $54^{\circ}\ 27\frac{1}{2}'\ N.$, long. $10^{\circ}\ 12'\ E.$

- 3. SIGNALS DENOTING THAT PRACTICE IS PROGRESSING.—When firing is in progress, a red double pennant will be hoisted at the top of the signal mast at the Bülk Lighthouse, at the Bülk Lightship, on the balustrade of the Friedrichsort Lighthouse, at the battery from which practice is in progress, and on board the police vessels. When these flags are displayed, entrance into the practice area is forbidden to all ships and vessels, with the exception of the German and Danish mail steamers, which carry the German or the Danish mail flags.
- 4. REGULATIONS FOR FISHING VESSELS.—Fishing boats entering or leaving must assemble, in accordance with instructions given by the police vessel, at a point outside the danger zone. They will be towed through the practice area, as far as is possible, during the pauses in the firing.
- 5. Navigational Intervals.—To admit of the entrance and departure of steamers and tugs of sufficient speed (7 knots), firing will cease from approximately 9 to 10 a.m., and from 11.30 a.m. to 0.30 p.m. These times may be accelerated or retarded by a quarter of an hour.
- 6. Special regulations for the practice on 20th and 21st August, and for night firing.—On 20th and 21st August, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m., as well as during the nights of 19th-20th, 20th-21st, 23rd-24th, 24th-25th, and 25th-26th of July, from 8 p.m. to 2 a.m., the practice area is altogether closed, except to the mail steamers mentioned in paragraph 3. The conclusion of the night firing will be notified from the police vessels by rockets emitting two green double stars in succession.
- 7. SIGNAL FOR INTERVALS BETWEEN THE FIRING.—During the intervals when firing ceases a black flag will be hoisted at the places named in paragraph 3, as well as on the Dusternbrook Signal Station. If flag A. (International Code) is hoisted from 3 P.M. to 4 P.M. at the Düsternbrook Signal Station, there will be no firing on the following week-day.
- 8. GENERAL REGULATIONS.—When ships entering or leaving, approach the boundary of the practice area, they must close on one of the police vessels lying there, or stop until that vessel approaches.

Vessels are prohibited even during the intervals | Point I between the firing from entering the boundary is free.

of the practice area without the express sanction of the captains of the police vessels. The captains of the police vessels are empowered, even during those intervals, to detain vessels from passing through the practice area, if they are of opinion that the passage through the area will not be completed during the pause in the firing.

All vessels crossing the area while the practice is going on must keep well clear of the steam tugs with floating tow ropes and targets.

Mariners entering the practice area (even during the intervals in the firing) without special sanction, or delay their passage through it without valid reason, or anchor or stop, or contravene the orders of the captains of the police vessels, besides exposing themselves to the danger of serious injury during their stoppage in the practice area, are liable to punishment, as well as to the expense of compulsorily carrying out of the police regulations.

- 9. The police vessels are distinguished by day by a yellow flag at the bow, and, in addition, the flags mentioned in paragraphs 3 and 7 at the masthead; by night, in addition to the prescribed coloured side lights, and at least 6 feet above the white masthead light, a red light visible over the whole horizon. All civil and military persons must comply immediately with the orders of the captains of the police vessels.
- 10. Note.—Contraventions of the above regulations are punishable under Section 2 of the Naval Port Law of 19th June, 1883, with a fine up to 150 marks, or with imprisonment, or as a contravention of official orders; captains of vessels concerned also are responsible for the injuries arising to any of the practice apparatus, and for the expenses arising through the delay in the practice.
- 11. Shells Found.—Should live shells which have missed the target be found, the finders are strictly cautioned against, taking them up, or attempting to force out the fuzes, since the shells may explode at any movement. Upon the discovery of live shells, notice is immediately to be given to the Local Beard, or the Marine Artillery Depôt at Friedrichsort. Live shells may be recognised by red, white or blue colour, with a black point.

No. 409.--MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT.

New Regulations Respecting the Lights Carried by, and the Signals Made from Fishing Vessels.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 831 of 1905:—

Mariners are hereby informed that the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, has been amended with respect to the lights carried by, and the signals made from fishing vessels, as follows:—

ART. 9.—Fishing vessels and fishing boats, when under way and when not required by this Article to carry or show the lights hereinafter specified, shall carry or show the lights prescribed for vessels of their tonnage under way.

(a) Open boats, by which is to be understood boats not protected from the entry of sea water by means of a continuous deck, when engaged in any fishing at night, with outlying tackle extending not more than 150 feet horizontally from the boat into the seaway, shall carry one all-round white light.

Open boats, when fishing at night, with outlying tackle extending more than 150 feet horizontally from the boat into the seaway, shall carry one all-round white light, and in addition, on approaching or being approached by other vessels, shall show a second white light at least 3 feet below the first light and at a horizontal distance of at least 5 feet away from it in the direction in which the outlying tackle is attached.

(b) Vessels and boats, except open boats as defined in sub-division (a), when fishing with drift nets, shall, so long as the nets are wholly or partly in the water, carry two white lights where they can best be seen. Such lights shall be placed so that the vertical distance between them shall be not less than 6 feet, and not more than 15 feet, and so that the horizontal distance between them, measured in a line with the keel, shall be not less than 5 feet and not more than 10 feet. The lower of these two lights shall be in the direction of the nets, and both of them shall be of such a character as to show all round the horizon, and to be visible at a distance of not less than 3 miles.

Within the Mediterranean Sea and in the seas bordering the coasts of Japan and Korea, sailing fishing vessels of less than 20 tons gross tonnage shall not be obliged to carry the lower of these

two lights; should they, however, not carry it, they shall show in the same position (in the direction of the net or gear), a white light, visible at a distance of not less than one sea mile, on the approach of or to other vessels.

(c) Vessels and boats, except open boats as defined in sub-division (a), when line-fishing with their lines out and attached to or hauling their lines, and when not at anchor or stationary within the meaning of sub-division (h), shall carry the same lights as vessels fishing with drift-nets. When shooting lines, or fishing with towing lines, they shall carry the lights prescribed for a steam or sailing vessel under way respectively.

Within the Mediterranean Sea and in the seas bordering the coasts of Japan and Korea sailing fishing vessels of less than 20 tons gross tonnage shall not be obliged to carry the lower of these two lights; should they, however, not carry it, they shall show in the same position (in the direction of the lines) a white light, visible at a distance of not less than one sea mile, on the approach of or to other vessels.

- (d) Vessels, when engaged in trawling, by which is meant the dragging of an apparatus along the bottom of the sea—
- 1. If steam-vessels, shall carry in the same position as the white light mentioned in Article 2 (a), a tricoloured lantern so constructed and fixed as to show a white light from right ahead to two points on each bow, and a green light and a red light over an arc of the horizon from two points on each bow to two points abaft the beam on the starboard and port sides respectively; and not less than 6 nor more than 12 feet below the tricoloured lantern a white light in a lantern, so constructed as to show a clear uniform and unbroken light all round the horizon.
- 2. If sailing vessels, shall carry a white light in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear uniform and unbroken light all round the horizon, and shall also on the approach of or to other vessels, show where it can best be seen a white flare-up light or torch in sufficient time to prevent collision.

All lights mentioned in sub-division (d) 1 and 2 shall be visible at a distance of at least 2 miles.

- (e) Oyster dredgers and other vessels fishing with dredge nets shall carry and show the same lights as trawlers.
- (f) Fishing vessels and fishing boats may at any time use a flare-up light in addition to the lights which they are by this Article required to carry and show, and they may also use working lights.
- (q) Every fishing vessel and every fishing boat under 150 feet in length, when at anchor, shall exhibit a white light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile.

Every fishing vessel of 150 feet in length or upwards, when at anchor, shall exhibit a white light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile, and shall exhibit a second light as provided for vessels of such length by Article 11.

Should any such vessel, whether under 150 feet in length, or of 150 feet in length, or upwards, be attached to a net or other fishing gear, she shall, on the approach of other vessels, show an additional white light at least 3 feet below the anchor light, and at a horizontal distance of at least 5 feet away from it in the direction of the net or gear.

(h) If a vessel or boat when fishing becomes stationary in consequence of her gear getting

fast to a rock or other obstruction, she shall in daytime haul down the day-signal required by sub-division (k); at night show the light or lights prescribed for a vessel at anchor; and during fog, mist, falling snow, or heavy rainstorms make the signal prescribed for a vessel at anchor. (See sub-division (d), and the last paragraph, of Article 15.)

- (i) In fog, mist, falling snow or heavy rainstorms, drift-net vessels attached to their nets, and vessels when trawling, dredging, or fishing with any kind of drag-net, and vessels line-fishing with their lines out, shall, if of 20 tons gross tonnage or upwards, respectively, at intervals of not more than one minute make a blast; if steam vessels, with the whistle or syren; and if sailing vessels with a fog-horn; each blast to be followed by ringing the bell. Fishing vessels and boats of less than 20 tons gross tonnage shall not be obliged to give the above-mentioned signals; but if they do not, they shall make some other efficient sound signal at intervals of not more than one minute.
- (k) All vessels or boats fishing with nets or lines or trawls, when under way, shall in daytime indicate their occupation to an approaching vessel by displaying a basket or other efficient signal where it can best be seen. If vessels or boats at anchor have their gear out, they shall, on the approach of other vessels, show the same signal on the side ou which those vessels can pass.

The vessels required by this Article to carry or show the lights hereinbefore specified shall not be obliged to carry the lights prescribed by Article 4 (a), and the last paragraph of Article 11.

This article shall be read and construed as part of the Regulations contained in Schedule I to the Order in Council under Section 418 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, made the 27th day of November, 1896, and as if it had formed one of such Regulations and been numbered 9 among the articles containing the same.

These regulations are to take effect from the 1st May, 1906.

No. 410.—COCHIN CHINA.

Tourane Bay-Leading Lights Discontinued.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 252 of 1902:—

The French Government has given further notice that, on 1st May, 1906, the white and red fixed leading lights exhibited on the western side of the Tourane River, and leading to the western anchorage, would be discontinued, but that the beacons from which they are exhibited would be maintained in position.
