Whereas the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, find it necessary for the protection of the Port of Barnstaple to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from that portion of the shores or banks of the sea, and of the estuary of the Rivers Taw and Torridge, between the junction of the parishes of Abbotsham and Northam (near Rock Nose, Westward Ho), and the stream which enters the estuary on the north-east side of Northam Burrows, near West Appledore, which lies to the southward of an imaginary line drawn south 80 degrees west true from the Upper Lighthouse at Braunton, such line passing 530 yards to the northward of the Old Lifeboat House on Grey Sand Point, when that boathouse is in line with Northam Church, being within the said Port, but excepting therefrom that portion of the foreshore extending from opposite the Old Lifeboat House to the eastward and southward for a distance of about 660 yards to the remains of an old groyne which lies between lines drawn at a distance of 80 and 150 feet respectively from the toe of the sandhills.

Now the Board of Trade do hereby, by this Order, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea from the area above specified.
