CLERGY DISCIPLINE ACT.

The following draft Rules are published pursuant to the Rules Publication Act, 1893:—

Additional Rules, dated the day of 1906, under the Clergy Discipline Act, 1892.

1. The Schedule to the Clergy Discipline Rules, 1892, shall, be read as if the following additions were made in the appropriate places

under the Province of Canterbury in that Schedule:—

Birmingham .. | Warwick;

Worcester; Stafford;

Southwark .. | London;

Surrey;

and as if the county of Surrey were omitted opposite the diocese of Rochester in that Schedule.

2. The first triennial election of the assessors to be elected from the justices of the county for the dioceses of Birmingham and Southwark respectively, shall be held at the quarter sessions next after the date of this Rule, and another triennial election shall be held at the same sessions in every third year thereafter.

The additional Rule, dated March, 1893, amending Rule 22 of the Clergy Discipline Rules, 1892, shall have effect with reference to any failure to hold an election under this Rule.

CONWAY FAIRS.

Whereas on the 20th March, 1906, a representation was made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Conway Town Council in favour of the revocation of my order of the 21st December, 1905, whereby the dates of the Fairs annually held at Conway were altered to the second Friday in the months of February, March, April, May, June, August, September, October, November, and December respectively, and the fixing of the

several dates as follows, for the convenience and advantage of the public, namely the 26th March, 15th May, 13th September, 15th November, and the 23rd December (the dates on which the Fairs in the months named were originally held), and the second Friday in the months of February, April, June, August, and October:

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when the same would be taken into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of the Fairs Act, 1873:

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the dates for the holding of the said Fairs should be further altered as desired:

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Fairs Act, 1873, do hereby order that the said Fairs, the dates for the holding of which were, by the Order above referred to, altered to the second Friday in the months of February, March, April, May, June, August, September, October, November, and December respectively, shall in future be held annually on the 26th March, 15th May, 13th September, 15th November, and the 23rd December, and on the second Friday in the months of February, April, June, August, and October.

The Order of the 21st December, 1905, is, hereby revoked.

ORMSKIRK HORSE AND COW FAIRS.

Whereas on the 27th March, 1906, a representation was made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Ormskirk Urban District Council to the effect that Fairs have been annually held at Ormskirk, in the county of Lancaster, on the 10th and 11th days of September, namely a Horse Fair on the 10th and a Cow Fair on the 11th September, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the Cow Fair should in future be held on the second Monday in the month of September in each year, and the Horse Fair on the following day:

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when the same would be taken into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of the Fairs Act, 1873:

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the dates for the holding of the said Fairs should be altered as desired:

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Fairs Act, 1873, do hereby order that the Horse Fair and the Cow Fair which have been annually held at Ormskirk, on the 10th and 11th days of September respectively, shall in future be held on the undermentioned days, namely, the Cow Fair on the

second Monday in the month of September in each year, and the Horse Fair on the following day

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following translation of a Decree which appeared in the Guatemalan Official Gazette of the 26th March last, imposing quarantine against arrivals from British Honduras, and Puerto Cortés, Republic of Honduras:—

Decree.

Executive Palace, Guatemala, March 20th, 1906.

The Constitutional President of the Republic decrees:—

That a rigorous quarantine be established against vessels arriving from British Honduras and Puerto Cortés to Ports of this Republic; and also that quarantine be established against Zacapa and Gualan in respect of the other Departments of the Republic. In order that the Political Heads of Departments and the Commandants of the said Ports may be able to dictate measures to ensure obedience to the Decree, they are empowered not only to impose the penalty of imprisonment on persons guilty of its infringement, but also to detain vessels whose masters have attempted to do so, for an indefinite period.

The Board of Trade are further informed that in consequence of the outbreak of Yellow Fever at Puerto Cortés, all passenger traffic with the Interior, Ports of British Honduras, Guatemala, and Mexico has been suspended until further notice.

ISLE OF WIGHT (SWINE-FEVER) PRO-HIBITION OF MOVEMENT (AMEND-MENT) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement with Licence direct to Bacon Factory or Slaughterhouse.

1. The Isle of Wight (Swine-Fever) Prohibition of Movement Order of 1906 shall not, after the commencement of this Order, apply to, or be deemed to prohibit, the movement of swine direct to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the bicon factory or slaughterhouse is situate, and subject to the following conditions, namely:—

- (i.) The swine shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long;
- (ii.) The swine shall, so far as is practicable, be moved by railway, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact
 with swine not marked under this Article;
- (iii.) The swine shall, while being moved along, over, or across any highway or thoroughfare, be confined in a van or float;
- (iv.) The swine shall after their arrival at the bacon factory or slaughterhouse be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Licences after the Completion of Movement.

2. Where swine are moved with a Licence under this Order to any bacon factory or slaughter-house the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

General Provisions as to Movement.

- 3.—(1.) Swine being moved under this Order shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the Licence, and not elsewhere.
- (2.) This Order does not authorise movement of swine in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, or of swine the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Production of Licences: Names and Addresses.

- 4.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, shall on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, anthorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

- 5.—(1.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig, as required by this Order, the person doing the

same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acrs and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person fail to deliver up or send a Licence as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

- 6. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires:
 - "Bacon factory" means premises in which the business of a curer of bacon is carried on:
 - "Slaughterhouse" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered:

 - "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
