Whereas the University of Oxford Commissioners, under and by virtue of all and every the powers in that behalf enabling them contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, did by an Instrument under their seal dated the sixteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, make certain Statutes thereunto annexed for your Petitioners, who are therein described as "the College of All Souls of the Faithful Departed, commonly called All Souls College, in the University of Oxford."

And whereas such Statutes were approved by Her late Majesty in Council on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

And whereas Statute III, Clause 7, is in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"7. Seven other Fellowships shall be awarded by a Board of Electors consisting of the Warden, four Fellows of the College appointed for a term of five years by the Warden and Fellows, Bodley's Librarian for the time being, and three Members of Convocation appointed for a term of five years by the Hebdomadal Council of the University. Elections to these Fellowships may be held after examination or without examination as the electors shall from time to time determine, but subject to the following conditions of

eligibility (that is to say):—any person may be elected who having passed all the examinations required by the University for the degree of Bachelor of Arts, and being in the judgment of the electors qualified by character and attainments to be a Fellow of the College, undertakes to prosecute in the College or the University, or under the direction of the College or the University elsewhere, some definite literary or scientific work which shall be specified in the Resolution by which he is elected. The right to elect shall be vested in the electors present at the election, and that person shall be elected for whom the greatest number of those present shall have voted. In case of equality of votes, the Warden, if present, shall have a casting vote.

"Not more than one of these Fellowships shall be filled up in any year. If in any year there be no person whom the electors shall judge qualified for election, the Fellowship shall be suspended, and the emoluments of it shall fall into the Corporate Revenues of the College. A Fellow elected under this Clause may be re-elected in like manner and under like conditions from time to time."

And whereas at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of our said College, specially summoned for that purpose and held on the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and six, it was unanimously Resolved that after the words "any person may be elected who," contained in Statute III, Clause 7, of the College Statutes, the words "having passed all the examinations required by the University for the degree of Bachelor of Arts and," shall be omitted.

Now we the said Warden and College, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do

hereby submit the aforesaid alteration so made by us in the Statutes governing our said College to the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, and humbly pray that the same may be approved and confirmed.

By substituting in Chapter II Degrees, Section 19, Affiliated Colleges, for paragraph 2 of such Section the following paragraph to form an amended paragraph 2 of Section 19 of the same Chapter:—

"Students of the institution who shall have continued Members of it for such length of time, not less than two years, and shall have attended such lectures and passed such examinations as may be required from time to time by Grace of the Senate, shall if admitted as Members of the University, be deemed, for such purposes and under such conditions as the Senate may from time to time by Grace determine to have already kept by residence one or more terms (not exceeding three in number)."

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes of the College of Saint John the Evangelist in the University of Cambridge which amending Statute was duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose and held on the ninth day of February 1906 and having been passed at such meeting by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting is now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We the Master and Fellows of the College of Saint John the Evangelist in the University of Cambridge (being the Governing Body thereof) in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 do hereby alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College in the manner following:

By repealing Statute XXXIV intituled "Naden Divinity Studentships" (made on the 21st day of March 1881 and approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the 3rd day of May 1882) and by substituting therefor the following Statute to form an amended Statute XXXIV.

Statute XXXIV. Naden Divinity Studentships.

In lieu of the provisions contained in the Will of the Reverend Thomas Naden the following regulations shall be observed:—

There shall be in the College one or more Divinity Studentships to be called the Naden Divinity Studentships. The object of the Studentships shall be to promote the study of Divinity.

The number of Studentships and the emoluments of each Student shall be determined from time to time by the Council.

A Student at the time of his election shall have entered on his ninth term at least having previously kept by residence eight terms or shall have been admitted to the title of the degree of Bachelor of Arts or of Law not being of sufficient standing to be admitted to the degree of Master of Arts or Master of Law.

A Student shall in the first instance be elected for one year. The tenure of a Studentship may be extended for a second year and in special cases for a third year.

A Studentship shall be tenable with a Scholarship or Exhibition in the College.

Admission to a Fellowship at any College shall vacate a Studentship.

The unexpended income (if any) accruing from the endowment of the said Thomas Naden shall be invested to form part of a fund for the augmentation of the endowment of the Naden Divinity Studentships.

Subject to these provisions the Council shall have power to make regulations as to the time and mode of election to the Studentships the qualifications of the candidates, the residence of the Students and the course of study to be pursued by them and to vary such regulations from time to time.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 3RD MAY 1906.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or of any Order by which such provisions are applied to any scheduled area, swine may be moved to the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and from such exhibition to any place of destination in Great Britain situate in any scheduled area, if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement.

2. In the case of movement to the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by some person authorised in that behalf by the Nottinghamshire County Council, and in the case of movement from the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

3. The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the exhibition or place of destination specified in the Licence and not elsewhere, and while being so moved shall not be subject to Regulations made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board relating to Swine-Fever.

NORFOLK (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them

in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, with modifications, to certain Scheduled Districts.

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall apply to the Districts specified in the Schedule hereto, (in this Order referred to as Scheduled Districts,) as if they had been declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area, but subject to the modifications hereinafter contained.

Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

2.—(1.) The Local Authority may grant a Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition of swine in a Scheduled District, if they are satisfied that the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held in a market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition which is capable of being thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, and thereupon the market fair sale or exhibition may be held accordingly.

(2.) A Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market fair sale or exhibition (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets fairs sales or exhibitions on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding three months, but the Licence may be renewed from time to time or revoked at any time by the Local Authority.

(3.) A Licence shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to ensure publicity for the same, and a copy of the Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition where such market fair sale or exhibition is held.

(4.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article.

(5.) A fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local Authority and named in the Licence for the purpose of receiving Licences authorising movement of swine to the market fair sale or exhibition, and for granting Licences for movement of swine therefrom in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(6.) No swine shall be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare into a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Article unless accompanied by a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order.

Licences for Movement out of Licensed Markets, &c.

3.—(1.) Swine exposed at a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order may be moved from the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition along over or across a highway or thoroughfare in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement—in the Form

set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect—granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the market fair sale or exhibition is held.

(2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.

(3.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where the place of destination specified in the Licence is in a Swine-Fever Infected Area, or a Scheduled District, the swine shall be moved to such place and not elsewhere.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

4.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to a market fair sale or exhibition in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District, the Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition by the person in charge of the swine to the person appointed under this Order to receive the same.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to any other premises in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

Attendance at Markets, &c.

5. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order.

Revocation by Board of Licences.

6. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Forms.

9. For the purposes of any Movement Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order, the Scheduled Districts shall be deemed to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area.

Offences.

10.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the

pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person fail to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

11. In this Order—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“Swine-Fever Infected Area” means an area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the sixteenth day of May, nineteen hundred and six.

Short Title.

13. This Order may be cited as the NORFOLK (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.
