#### PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-ninth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and lifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Botley, in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Botley is vested for an estate in fee simple

without encumbrances in Emily Mary Lee, of Highfield House, in the town and county of Southampton, Widow, Frederick Lee, of Frogmore, Leigham Court-road, Streatham, in the county of London, Esquire, and the Reverend James Palmer Nash, late of Bishops Waltham, in the county of Southampton, but now of Saint Swithun's Rectory, Winchester, in the same county, Clerk in Holy Orders, Honorary Canon of Winchester, as Trustees upon trust to sell the said advowson and to hold the net proceeds of such sale upon trust for Ellen Annie Lee, of Highfield House aforesaid, Spinster.

"And whereas the said Emily Mary Lee, Frederick Lee, James Palmer Nash, and Ellen Annie Lee are desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Botley should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Winchester.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Herbert Edward, now Bishop of Winchester, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Botley which is herein-before mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Botley.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Emily Mary Lee, Frederick Lee, James Palmer Nash, and Ellen Annie Lee (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this scheme)

and with the consent of the said Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Botley, shall be transferred from the said Emily Mary Lee, Frederick Lee, James Palmer Nash, and Ellen Annie Lee to the said Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester, said Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester, and by his successors in the same bishoprick, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifth day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the parish of Great Canford and partly out of the district parish of Saint Mary, Longfleet, both in the county of Dorset and in the diocese of Salisbury.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said parish of Great Canford and the said district parish of Saint Mary, Longfleet, are cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants, thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Great Canford and of the said district parish of Saint Mary, Longfleet, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship but there is an unconsecrated building known as the Church of Saint John the Baptist-situate at Broadstone within the limits of the said proposed district.

"And whereas Edith Sophia Harriet Dawson Damer deceased (who died on the twenty-fourth day of January in the year one thousand nine hundred and five) the widow of the late Reverend Lionel Dawson Damer, Clerk in Holy Orders, formerly vicar of the said parish of Great Canford, did by her will dated the fourteenth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine and proved on the twentyseventh day of February in the year one thousand nine hundred and five bequeath to the Right Honourable Philip Henry Wodehouse, Baron Currie, Laurence Currie, Esquire, and Denis Marshall, Esquire, the executors and trustees named in her said will, a sum of ten thousand pounds to be applied by them as they shall in their absolute and uncontrolled discretion think fit for or towards the endowment of the said building known as the church of Saint John the Baptist situate as aforesaid when a separate ecclesiastical district shall have been assigned thereto.

"And whereas the said building known as the church of Saint John the Baptist, situate as aforesaid, has been duly conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it is our intention that such building when duly consecrated shall become the church of the separate district which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we are satisfied that by virtue of the said bequest an adequate and permanent maintenance will be available for the support of the minister of the said proposed district and when the said district shall have become a new parish then for the support of the incumbent thereof.

"And whereas the said maintenance for the support of the minister of the said proposed district will be provided as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district, and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said new parish, and the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the parish of person to whom they desire that the whole

right of patronage of the said proposed separate district shall be assigned.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John, now Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Com-'missioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Great Canford and of the said district parish of Saint Mary, Longfleet, which are more particularly described in the schedule hereunder written, and are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint John the Baptist, Broadstone.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted, and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish, and the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said John, Bishop of Salisbury, and by his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing scheme has reference.

"The district of Saint John the Baptist, Broadstone, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the parish of Great Canford, in the county of Dorset and in the diocese of Salisbury, which is bounded upon the south by the district parish of Saint Mary, Longfleet, upon the west by the parish of Corfe Mullen, both in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Corfe Mullen from the said parish of Great Canford at the point at Rushcombe Bottom where the ancient Romanroad leading towards Upton House is crossed by the road leading from Blandford to Poole, and extending thence in a straight line due east (thereby crossing the Corfe Hills and passing to the north of the Gravel Hill Brick Works) for a distance of one mile and thirty chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the road leading from Wimborne to Poole, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of one mile and sixty chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Great Canford from the said district parish of Saint Mary, Longfleet.

"II. And also all that portion of the said district parish of Saint Mary, Longfleet, which is bounded upon the south-west by the parish of Hamworthy, in the said county and diocese,

upon the west partly by the last-named parish and partly by the said parish of Corfe Mullen, upon the north by the above described portion of the parish of Great Canford, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said parish of Great Canford from the said district parish of Saint Mary, Longfleet, crosses the middle of the road leading from Wimborne to Poole, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary of the municipal borough of Poole, and extending thence first westward and then generally southward along the said borough boundary (thereby following in part the middle of the channel called Creekmoor Lake) for a distance of two miles or thereabouts to the junction of the channel called Creekmoor Lake with the channel called Upton Lake where the said borough boundary meets the boundary which divides the said district parish of Saint Mary, Longfleet, from the said parish of Hamworthy."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbents of the vicarage of the said parish of Great Canford and the vicarage of the said district parish of Saint Mary, Longfleet, out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken.

And whereas the incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Great Canford has signified his assent to such scheme.

And whereas the patron of the said two vicarages, and the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Saint Mary, Longfleet, have offered certain objections to the same scheme.

And whereas, notwithstanding these objections, the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the fifth day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of the Annunciation, Chislehurst, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-sixth day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and published in the London Gazette upon the twenty-ninth day of the same month, a part of the parish of Chislehurst, in the said county of Kent, and at that time in the diocese of Canterbury, but now in the said diocese of Rochester, was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of the Annunciation, situate in the said parish, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of the Annunciation, Chislehurst.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of the Annunciation, Chislehurst, has, under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of the Annunciation, Chislehurst, shall be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend John Reginald, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of the Annunciation, Chislehurst, shall be altered so that all those portions of the said parish of Chislehurst, and of the parish of Bromley, in the said county of Kent, and in the said diocese of Rochester, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of the Annunciation, Chislehurst.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned

Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

- "The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.
- "The territory to be annexed to the new parish of the Annunciation, Chislehurst, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Rochester, comprising:—
- "I. All that portion of the parish of Chislehurst, in the said county and diocese, which is bounded upon the north-west and upon the north-cast by the said new parish of the Annunciation, Chislehurst, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east and upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Annunciation, Chislehurst, from the said parish of Chislehurst, at the junction of Kemnal-road with Ashfield-lane, and extending thence south-westward in a straight line across Chislehurst Common for a distance of thirty-eight chains or thereabouts to the point a little to the west of the Prince Imperial's Monument where the road leading from Chislehurst Station to Chislehurst West is joined by the southern end of the road leading through the 'Wilderness,' and extending thence north-west-ward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of twenty-one chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where such road bends south-eastward, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line across the north-western portion of the 'Wilderness' and across a portion of the Camden Park Golf Course for a distance of twelve chains and a half or thereabouts to the south-eastern end of the hedge forming the south-western boundary of the house and premises known as 'Golf View,' and extending thence north-westward along the said boundary hedge for a distance of three chains and a quarter for thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading along the north-western side of the Camden Park Golf Course into Camden Park-road, and extending thence south-westward to and along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with Camden Park-road, and extending thence first westward and then south-westward along the middle of Camden Park-road for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts to its junction with Yester-road upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Chislehurst from the said new parish of the Annunciation, Chislehurst.

And also all that portion of the parish of Bromley, in the said county and diocese, which is bounded upon the north-east by the new parish of Saint Andrew, Mottingham, in the said county of Kent, and in the diocese of Southwark, upon the east and upon the south-east by the said new parish of the Annunciation, Chislehurst, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the north-west by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Annunciation, Chislehurst, from the said parish of Bromley, crosses the middle of the line of the South Eastern and Chatham Railway, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway across Elmstead-lane, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Elmstead-lane for a distance of forty chains and a half or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the

said parish of Bromley from the said new parish by his having signed and sealed this representaof Saint Andrew, Mottingham." by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively either signified their assent or offered no objection thereto.

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since a draft of the said scheme or representation was transmitted to the said Patrons and Incumbents.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Anselm, situate at Hatch End, in the parish of Pinner, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Anselm, situate at Hatch End as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said diocese of London (testified lane, and extending thence north-eastward along

by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Pinner, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Anselm, situate at Hatch End as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Anselm, Hatch End.'

"And with the like consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said diocese of London (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Anselm, situate at Hatch End as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that, so long as the Reverend Charles Edward Grenside, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Pinner, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance, at the said church of Saint Anselm, situate at Hatch End as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Charles Edward Grenside; and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"And with the like consent of the said John, Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Paul, situate at Landore as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the

registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Paul, Landore, being :-

"All that part of the parish of Llangyfelach, in the county of Glamorgan and in the diocese of Saint David's, which is bounded upon the south by the parish of Saint John juxta Swansea, upon the east by the parish of Llansamlet, both in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Llansamlet from the said parish of Llangyfelach at a point in the middle of the River Tawe. opposite to the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the south-western boundary of the premises of the Morriston Spelter Works, and England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty- lextending thence north-westward to and along

Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the fourth year of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred (local), which Local Act is named the Liverpool and Wigan Churches Act, 1904, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the fifth day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the fourth year of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred (local), which Local Act is named the Liverpool and Wigan Churches Act, 1904, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes, to be taken out of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Bridget, Wavertree, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Liverpool.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said new parish of Saint Bridget, Wavertree, is a new parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said new parish of Saint Bridget, Wavertree, which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship, but there is a site therein which has been duly conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of the Church Building Acts, 1818 to 1884, and upon which the trustees of the said Liverpool and Wigan Churches Act, 1904, propose to build a permanent church out of the proceeds of the sale of the old church of Saint Thomas mentioned in that Act.

"And whereas the said trustees of the Liverpool and Wigan Churches Act, 1904, have applied to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to take steps for the constitution of the said proposed separate district in conformity with the provisions of the seventeenth section of that Act.

"And whereas the said proposed separate district will under the provisions of the said seventeenth section of the said Liverpool and Wigan Churches Act, 1904, be endowed with endowments of or connected with the old church of Saint Thomas mentioned in that Act producing an income exceeding two hundred pounds per annum.

"And whereas the said seventeenth section of the Liverpool and Wigan Churches Act, 1904, provides that the patronage of the said proposed separate district shall belong to the patrons of the said old church of Saint Thomas mentioned in that Act.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Francis James, Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Bridget, Wavertree, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan

hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Thomas, Wavertree.'

" And we further recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto, shall be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the patrons of the said old church of Saint Thomas as contemplated by the said seventeenth section of the Liverpool and Wigan Churches Act, 1904.

· "And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Thomas, Wavertree, being :-

No. 2. Saint Bartholomew Ward.

No. 3. Saint John Ward.

#### No. 1. Saint Maurice Ward.

I do hereby determine that Saint Maurice Ward shall comprise so much of the said city of Winchester as is contained within a line commencing at a point in the centre of North Walls :

Thomas Wards to the point where the said railway meets the Romsey-road as hereinbefore described, thence along the Romsey-road and Old Sarum-road following the northern boundary of Saint Thomas Ward as hereinbefore described to a point in the Old Sarum-road to the east of Tegdown Farm where the municipal boundary of the said city leaves the Old Sarum-road thence in a northerly direction following the said municipal boundary across Teg Down and across the Weekeroad and continuing thence in a straight line to the Andover-road opposite Winton House thence along the centre of the said road to the first Whitchurch milestone thence in a north-easterly direction along a fence to the point of commencement on the said railway aforesaid.

#### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

YORKSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER. OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Restriction on Movement.

1.—(1.) Swine shall not be moved from the administrative county of the East Riding of York or the county borough of Kingston-upon-Hull into the administrative county of the West Riding of York or the county boroughs of Bradford, Halifax, Huddersfield, Leeds, Rotherham, Sheffield, or York, except in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(2.) For the purposes of this Order any detached part of an administrative county or county borough surrounded by another administrative county or county borough shall be deemed to be part of the county or borough

which so surrounds it.

#### General Provision for Movement with Licence.

2.—(1.) The restriction on movement imposed by this Order shall not apply to swine if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

, (2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration, countersigned as hereinafter provided, to the effect:

(i.) That he is the owner of [or the agent authorised in writing for this purpose by the owner of] the swine;

(ii.) That the swine have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the date of the declaration;

- (iii.) That to the best of his knowledge and belief the swine are not affected with swinefever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swinefever; and
- (iv.) That the swine are not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and that the movement of the swine is not prohibited by notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.
- (3.) The declaration as to swine to be moved shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the District where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(4.) The declaration shall be retained by the

Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(5.) The licence shall be in force for six days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the licence is granted, the number of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place from which, and the place and premises to which, the swine are to be moved.

#### Detention and Isolation after Arrival at Destination.

3.—(1.) Swine moved with a licence under the preceding Article shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination, except as hereinafter provided. The swine, while detained under this Article, shall be kept separate from all other swine. This provision does not restrict

the removal of any carcase of a pig.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a licence under the preceding Article to a market, fair, saleyard, or exhibition specified in the licence, the swine shall only be moved from such premises if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fair, saleyard, or exhibition is situate and only to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence, where the swine after their arrival shall be detained until they are slaughtered.

(3.) A copy of a licence for movement from a market, fair, saleyard, or exhibition, shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the bacon factory or slaughterhouse

specified in the licence.

#### Movement for Immediate Slaughter.

4. The restriction on movement imposed by this Order shall not apply to swine moved to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or to any lairs, market, or saleyard specially authorised by the Local Authority of the District under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 or any other Swine-Fever Order in force in the District, if the swine are accompanied by a licence authorising such move-ment granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the bacon factory, slaughterhouse, lairs, market, or saleyard shall be situate, and subject to the following conditions, namely:

(i.) The swine shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine

inches long;

(ii.) The swine shall, so far as is practicable, be moved by railway, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked under this Article;

(iii.) Swine moved under this Article to any lairs, market, or saleyard shall only be moved therefrom if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the lairs, market, or saleyard shall be situate and only to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence, and such movement shall be subject to the conditions of this Article as to marking and movement; and

(iv.) Swine moved under this Article to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they

are slaughtered.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

5.—(1.) Where swine are moved with licence under this Order to any market, fair, saleyard, exhibition, or lairs, the licence shall be delivered up in exchange for the licence for movement of the swine from such premises.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to any premises other than a market, fair, saleyard, exhibition, or lairs, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

General Provisions as to Movement.

6. Swine, while being moved under this Order, shall so far as is practicable be kept separate from all other swine, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.

Provision for Movement through a District.

7. For the purposes of this Order, swine shall not be deemed to be moved into any District in any case where they are moved through the District by railway from a place outside the District to another place outside the District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked within the District.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

8.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other

officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

9. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

10.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the

occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence

against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person fail to deliver up or send a licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of

(4.) If a pig is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the pig is detained, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

5.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against

the Act of 1894.

(6.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

11. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires-

"District" means a District of a Local

Authority under the Act of 1894:

"Bacon factory" means premises in which the business of a curer of bacon is carried on:
