Ministère de l'intérieur.

Le Président de la République française,

Sur le rapport du ministre de l'intérieur et du ministre des finances,

Vu l'article 1er de la loi du 3 mars 1822 sur la police sanitaire, les décrets des 4 janvier 1896, 15 avril 1897, 15 juin 1899, 28 septembre 1900 et 21 septembre 1903,

Décrète:

ART. 1er.—La destruction des rats ou "dératisation," exclusivement pratiquée au moyen d'appareils dont l'efficacité a été reconnue par le conseil supérieur d'hygiène publique de France, est obligatoire pour l'admission dans les ports français:

- 1° De tout navire provenant d'un port considéré comme contaminé de peste ou y ayant fait escale;
- 2º De tout navire ayant pris en transbordement, c'est-à-dire de bord à bord, plus de 50 tonnes de marchandises provenant directement d'un pays considéré comme contaminé de peste.

Ces dispositions sont applicables aux navires ayant déjà déchargé partie de leur cargaison dans un ou plusieurs ports étrangers.

- Ant. 2.—Peuvent être dispensés de la dératisation:
- 1º Les navires qui se bornent à déposer des passagers dans le port français sans accoster et n'y font qu'un séjour de quelques heures;
- 2º Les navires y faisant une escale de moins de douze heures et laissant moins de 500 tonnes de marchandises, sous condition que la surveillance du déchargement sera opérée exclusivement de jour, le navire étant maintenu en éloignement des quais et ses amarres garnies;
- 3° Les navires à vapeur qui n'auraient touche aucun port considéré comme contaminé de peste pendant soixante jours depuis leur départ du dernier port contaminé et à bord desquels n'aurait été observé aucun fait sanitaire de nature suspecte;
- 4° Les navires qui ayant fait escale dans un port considéré comme contaminé justifieraient qu'ils n'y ont ni accosté à quai ou aux appontements, ni embarqué de marchandises;
- 5° Les navires qui auraient subi la dératisation dans un port étranger depuis leur départ du dernier port considéré comme contaminé. Il devra être justifié, dans ce cas, qu'aucun fait sanitaire suspect ne s'est produit à bord pendant la traversée et que la dératisation a été effectuée avec les mêmes appareils et les mêmes garanties qu'en France. Le capitaine du navire remet, à cet effet, à l'autorité sanitaire, un certificat mentionnant l'appareil employé, les conditions de l'opération, les constatations faites, etc., certificat visé par l'autorité consulaire française;
- 6° Les navires se trouvant dans les conditions indiquées au paragraphe 2 de l'article 1er, si les marchandises ont été transbordées d'un navire qui aurait été dératisé dans les conditions prescrites au paragraphe précédent et si elles sont accompagnées du certificat de dératisation prévu audit paragraphe.
- ART. 3.—Sont réputées marchandises pour l'application du présent décret, tous produits embarqués, figurant ou non au manifeste, à la seule exception du charbon embarqué pour les besoins du service sans accostage à quai.
- ART. 4.—La dératisation peut être effectuée en cours de route pour tout navire français ayant un médecin sanitaire maritime et pourvu de l'un des appareils prévus à l'article 1er.

L'autorité sanitaire du port d'arrivée apprécie d'après les justifications présentées les conditions dans lesquelles l'opération a été effectuée et les garanties fournies; elle peut en exiger le renouvellement partiel ou total.

Les mêmes dispositions sont applicables aux navires étrangers, à titre de réciprocité et sous la double condition que, d'une part, les médecins sanitaires offriront les mêmes titres que les médecins sanitaires français et que, d'autre part, les appareils utilisés seront les mêmes que ceux visés à l'article 1er.

ART. 5.—Dans les ports la dératisation est effectuée avant le déchargement du navire.

L'opération porte sur les cales, les soutes, les cambuses, les postes d'équipage, les postes d'émigrants ou des passagers de 3e et de 4e classes, et en général tous les compartiments intérieurs du navire. Les cabines des officiers et des passagers de 1re et de 2e classes, ainsi que les salles à manger, les salons qui leur sont affectés ne sont soumis à la dératisation que dans la mesure où l'autorité sanitaire le juge utile, notamment lorsque le navire est suspect ou infecté de peste ou que l'on a constaté chez les rats du bord l'existence de cette maladie ou une mortalité insolite.

ART. 6.—Les appareils destinés à la dératisation en vertu de l'article 1er sont mis à la disposition de l'armement suivant les conditions agréees par l'autorité sanitaire.

Les ports munis d'un de ces appareils sont seuls ouverts aux provenances des pays considérés comme contaminés de peste.

Les opérations sont effectuées sous le contrôle permanent de l'autorité sanitaire et dans le moindre délai.

ART. 7.—Les frais résultant de la dératisation sont à la charge de l'armement, conformément aux dispositions de l'article 94 (dernier afinéa) du décret du 4 janvier 1896. Aucune taxe sanitaire n'est due, en conséquence, du fait de cette opération.

ART. 8.—Les frais visés à l'article 7 sont calculés sur la jauge brute du navire, si la dératisation s'applique à son ensemble, sur la capacité cubique des locaux dératisés si l'opération n'est que partielle. La capacité cubique est établie d'après les plans de chargement du navire sans défalcation du volume occupé par la marchandise.

ART. 9.—Un certificat relatant les conditions dans lesquelles a été pratiquée l'opération est délivré au capitaine ou aux armateurs par les soins du service sanitaire.

ART. 10.—Les navires qui ne se trouveraient pas dans les conditions prescrites pour être soumis à la dératisation peuvent être admis sur leur demande à subir cette opération au départ comme à l'arrivée; soit en cales pleines, soit en cales vides et obtenir en conséquence la délivrance du certificat prévu à l'article 9. Toutes facilités devront leur être données à cet effet.

ART 11.—Les infractions aux dispositions du présent décret sont passibles des pénalités édictées par l'article 14 de la loi du 3 mars 1822, sans prejudice des mesures d'isolement ou autres auxquelles les navires peuvent être assujettis en raison de leur provenance ou de l'état sanitaire du bord à l'arrivée.

ART. 12.—Sont abrogés le décret du 21 septembre 1903 et les dispositions du décret du 23 septembre 1900 qui seraient en opposition avec le deuxième paragraphe de l'article 6 ci-dessus.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894

to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Restrictions in Scheduled Area.

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall in their application to the Infected Area described in the Schedule hereto be modified in manner declared by this Order.

Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

- 2.—(1.) The Local Authority may grant a Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition of swine in the Infected Area if they are satisfied that the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held in a market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition which is capable of being thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, and thereupon the market fair sale or exhibition may be held accordingly.
- (2.) A Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market fair sale or exhibition (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets fairs sales or exhibitions on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding three months, but the Licence may be renewed from time to time or revoked at any time by the Local Authority.
- (3.) A Licence shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to ensure publicity for the same, and a copy of the Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition where such market fair sale or exhibition is held.
- (4.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article.
- (5.) A fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local Authority and named in the Licence for the purpose of receiving Licences authorising movement of swine to the market fair sale or exhibition, and for granting Licences for movement of swine therefrom in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
- (6.) No swine shall be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare into a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Article unless accompanied by a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order.

Licences for Movement out of Licensed Markets, &c.

3.—(1.) Swine exposed at a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order may be moved from the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition along over or across a high-

- way or thoroughfare in an Infected Area if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement—in the Form set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect—granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the market fair sale or exhibition is held.
- (2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (3.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where the place of destination specified in the Licence is in an Infected Area, the swine shall be moved to such place and not elsewhere.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

- 4.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to a market fair sale or exhibition in an Infected Area, the Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition by the person in charge of the swine to the person appointed under this Order to receive the same.
- (2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to any other premises in an Infected Area, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

Attendance at Markets, &c.

5. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order.

Revocation by Board of Licences.

6. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

9.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the

pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

- (2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

In this Order—

- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "Infected Area" means an area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area:
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of June, nineteen hundred and

- 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or of any Order by which such provisions are applied to any scheduled area, swine may be moved to the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and from such exhibition to any place of destination in Great Britain situate in any scheduled area, if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement.
- 2. In the case of movement to the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by some person authorised in that behalf by the Leicester Borough Council, and in the case of movement from the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.
- 3. The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the exhibition or place of destination specified in the Licence and not elsewhere, and while being so moved shall not be subject to Regulations made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board relating to Swine-Fever.
