ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 25TH MAY 1906.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The East Suffolk (Swine-Fever) Order of

1906 shall not be deemed to prohibit the holding of the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of any Order or Regulation relating to swine-fever and made under the said Acts, swine may (subject as hereinafter provided) be moved to the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and from such exhibition to any place of destination in Great Britain if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement granted under this Order; Provided that this Article shall not extend to swine in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, or to swine of which the movement is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries given under any Order of that Board; Provided also that in the case of a pig in a Swine-Fever Infected Area the licence authorising its movement to the exhibition shall only be granted on a Declaration signed by the owner of the pig or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose in the Form C set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or to the like effect.

3. In the case of movement to the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by some person authorised in that behalf by the Ipswich Borough Council, and in the case of movement from the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.
