Whereas by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual bearing date the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and one, We were pleased to issue a Commission to inquire into the condition of the higher general and technical education available in Ireland outside Trinity College, Dublin, and to report as to what reforms, if any, were desirable in order to render that education adequate to the needs of the Irish People:

And whereas We have deemed it expedient that a further Commission should issue inquire into and report upon the present state of Trinity College, Dublin, and of the University of Dublin, including the revenues of the College and of any of its officers and their application the method of government of the University and of the College; the system of instruction in the College and the teachers by whom it is conducted; the system of University examinations, and the provision made for post-graduate study and the encouragement of research; and also to inquire and report upon the place which Trinity College, Dublin, and the University of Dublin now hold as organs of the higher education in Ireland, and the steps proper to be taken to increase their usefulness to the country:

Now know ye that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have nominated, constituted and appointed, and do by these Presents nominate, constitute and appoint you the said Sir Edward Fry (Chairman); Christopher Palles; Sir Thomas Raleigh; Sir Arthur William Rücker; Henry Jackson; Samuel Henry Butcher; Douglas Hyde; Denis Joseph Coffey; and Stephen Barnabas Kelleher to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said inquiry.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to, and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject; and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid, and to employ such persons as you may think fit to assist you in conducting any inquiry which you may hold.

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this, Our Commission, shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time, proceed in the execution thereof and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And We do further ordain that you shall be at liberty so far as proper for the purposes of your said inquiry, to consider the reports of the before mentioned Commission of the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and one, and the notes appended thereto, and also the evidence taken before the said Commission, but shall not take evidence upon matters inquired into by the said Commission.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you

WILD BIRD PROTECTION.

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Buckingham) Order, 1906.

Dated 1st June, 1906.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Buckingham, I hereby make the following Order:-

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Buckingham) Order, 1906."

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County of Buckingham to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:

Blackheaded Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Common (or Corn) Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Stock Dove, Turtle Dove, Flycatcher, Hedge Sparrow (Accentor, Dunnock), Hobby, Kestrel (Red Hawk or Wind Hover), Landrail (Corncrake), Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us | Merlin, Nuthatch (Nutjobber), Ring Ouzel, Quail, Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Red-backed Shrike (Butcher Bird), Siskin, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Thrush, Bearded Tit (Reedling), Cole Tit, Longtailed Tit, Marsh Tit (Blarkcap), Tree Creeper, Wagtail (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Water Rail, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Common Wren, Goldencrested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Buckingham:—

Brambling, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Goldfinch, Hedge Sparrow (Accentor, Dunnock), Hobby, Kestrel (Red Hawk or Wind Hover), Kingfisher, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch (Nutjobber), Owl (all species), Robin, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling), Cole Tit, Longtailed Tit, Marsh Tit (Blackcap), Tree Creeper, Wagtail (all species), Woodpecker (all species), Common Wren, Golden-crested Wren.

All Birds protected on Sundays in certain Parishes.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited in all parishes within the County of Buckingham in the Amersham, Berkhampstead, Bicester, Brackley, Buckingham, Eton, Henley, Leighton Buzzard, Newport Pagnell, Potterspury, Thame, Winslow, and Wycombe Unions; and in all parishes in the Aylesbury Union except Creslow.

Repeal of former Order.

V. The Order of the 28th August, 1903, is hereby repealed.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 1ST JUNE 1906.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any Order or Regulation relating to swine-fever and made under the said Acts, swine may (subject as hereinafter provided) be moved to the exhibition mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, and from such

exhibition to any place of destination in Great Britain if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement granted under this Order; Provided that this Article shall not extend to swine in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, or to swine of which the movement is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries given under any Order of that Board; Provided also that in the case of a pig in the Area described in the Second Schedule hereto or in a Swine-Fever Infected Area the licence authorising its movement to the exhibition shall only be granted on a Declaration signed by the owner of the pig or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose in the Form C set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or to the like effect.

2. In the case of movement to the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by some person authorised in that behalf by the Northamptonshire County Council, and in the case of movement from the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

SKIPTON (MARKETS AND SALES) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Regulation of Sales of Animals within the Urban District of Skipton.

- 1. From and after the commencement of this Order—
 - (i.) No animal shall be exposed for sale in or upon any road or street in the Urban District

of Skipton, in the administrative county of the West Riding of the county of York; and (ii.) No market or sale of animals shall be held in or upon any saleyard or other premises in the said Urban District unless the premises, or a part thereof sufficient to accommodate the number of animals usually exposed at such market or sale, are so paved with cement, concrete, asphalt, or other hard material impervious to water, as to permit of the same being effectually cleansed by washing.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3. If any animal is exposed for sale, or any market or sale of animals is held, in contravention of this Order, the person exposing the animal or holding the market or sale, and the owner or consignee of each animal exposed at the market or sale and the person exposing the same thereat and the purchaser thereat of any animal knowing the market or sale to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

4. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—
"Animals" means cattle, sheep, and goats

"Animals" means cattle, sheep, and goats, and all other ruminating animals, and swine: "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and six.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the Skipton (Markets and Sales) Order of 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894
