TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY
BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 25th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £1,800,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 1st proximo.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 30th June, 1906, and will be payable at six months after date, viz.:—on the 30th December, 1906.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 26th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve o'clock, on Saturday, the 30th June.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

INSTRUMENT assigning a Particular District to the Church of Saint Michael and All Angels, South Barnet, situate within the limits of the parish of East Barnet, in the county of Hertford, and in the diocese of Saint Albans.

To all to whom these presents shall come the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England and the Right Reverend Edgar, Bishop of the Diocese of Saint Albans, send Greeting.

WHEREAS a church has lately been built within the limits of the parish of East Barnet, in the county of Hertford, and in the diocese of

Saint Albans, by and at the expense of certain well-disposed persons who have with the approbation of the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England and of the said Edgar, Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Albans, secured to the said new church an endowment and a repair fund in accordance with the provisions of the several Acts of Parliament called "The Church Building Acts," or of some of them, and particularly of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-seven.

And whereas under the powers or authorities contained in the said Acts or of some of them and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have with the consent of the said Edgar, Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Albans, by an Instrument bearing date on or about the twenty-sixth day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, declared that the perpetual right of patronage of and of nominating a minister to serve the said new church from time to time and at all times whenever it should be requisite to nominate a minister to serve the same should from and after the consecration of such church be vested in and be exercised by and belong to the Very Reverend Walter John Lawrance, Dean of the Cathedral Church of Saint Albans and Archdeacon of Saint Albans, as such Archdeacon, and his successors Archdeacons of the same Archdeaconry for ever.

And whereas the said church has since been consecrated and is called "The Church of Saint Michael and All Angels, South Barnet."

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England deem it expedient that a particular district to comprise a part of the said parish of East Barnet should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Michael and All Angels, South Barnet, and also that banns of matrimony should be published and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at such church.

Now know ye that the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in exercise and execution of the powers or authorities for this purpose contained in the several Acts of Parliament called "The Church Buildings Acts" as aforesaid or in some of them and particularly in the Act of the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter thirty-eight, in the said Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and in the said Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling them in this behalf, do hereby, with the consent of the said Edgar, Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Albans (testified by his being a party to and executing these presents), assign to the said church of Saint Michael and All Angels, South Barnet, as a particular district, all that part of the said parish of East Barnet which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and do direct that the same shall be called "The Particular District of Saint Michael and All Angels, South Barnet."

And the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England with the like consent of the said Edgar, Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Albans (testified as aforesaid) in further exercise and execution of the powers or authorities contained in the said Acts of Parliament called "The Church Building Acts," or in some of them, and particularly in the said Act of the first and second years of His said late Majesty King William the
