WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Acts 1860 and 1898, namely, the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and forty-two, and the Act of the sixty-first and sixty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter twenty-three, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the fifteenth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, in the words and figures following, that is to

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Acts, 1860 and 1898, namely, the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Herlate Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and forty-two, and the Act of the sixty-first and sixty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter twenty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an union of two contiguous benefices within the Metropolis and within the city and diocese of London, namely, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Bride, Fleet-street, with Bridewell and the benefice (being a vicarage) of the Holy Trinity, Goughsquare, and for effecting certain other measures incidental to or arising out of such union.

"Whereas the patronage of the said benefice of Saint Bride, Fleet-street, with Bridewell is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the collegiate church of Saint Peter in Westminster.

giate church of Saint Peter in Westminster.

"And whereas the patronage of the said benefice of the Holy Trinity, Gough-square, is vested in the Bishop of London.

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, now Bishop of London, has caused proposals for a scheme for effecting an union of the said two benefices to be laid before us, which proposals are prepared under the seventh and eighth sections of the firstly hereinbefore-mentioned Act, and are approved by the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, as such Bishop, and also as patron of the said benefice of the Holy Trinity, Gough-square, and are assented to by the patrons of the said benefice of Saint Bride, Fleet-street, with Bridewell and the same proposals are also assented to, subject to certain modifications, by the vestry of the parish of Saint Bride, Fleet-street, with Bridewell and by the vestry of the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Gough-square.

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, to be expedient that the said proposed union of the said two benefices should be effected, and that such arrangements relating thereto and to the other matters hereinafter referred to should be made as are hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, as such Bishop, and as such patron

of the said benefice of the Holy Trinity, Goughsquare, and the pations of the said benefice of Saint Bride, Fleet-street, with Bridewell, and the vestries of the said parishes respectively, are willing that the scheme for effecting the said union should embody certain modifications of the said proposals, and this present scheme does embody the same modifications accordingly, but otherwise is based upon the said proposals.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has to this scheme set his hand and his episcopal seal), and with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of the collegiate church of Saint Peter in Westminster (in testimony whereof they have to this scheme set their common or capitular seal) and with the consents of the vestries of the said parishes of Saint Bride, Fleet-street, with Bridewell and of the Holy Trinity, Goughsquare (in testimony of which consent this scheme is signed, in the case of each of the said vestries, by the chairman of a meeting of the same vestry duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council all that is in this scheme contained under the several parts or headings hereinafter mentioned as follows:-

"PART I.

"As to the proposed union itself and certain immediate incidents thereof, we recommend and

1. That the said benefice of Saint Bride, Fleet-street, with Bridewell and the said benefice of the Holy Trinity, Gough-square, be united into one benefice under the style of 'The United Benefice of Saint Bride, Fleet-street with Holy 'Trinity, Gough-square, and the Precincts of Bridewell and Whitefriars,' which said united benefice is hereinafter called the United Benefice. "2. That if upon the day when any Order

of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, both of the said present benefices shall be vacant, the union shall forthwith take effect, and if one only shall be then vacant, the said union shall also forthwith take effect if the Incumbent of the other of the said present benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the united benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of his benefice, and the then Incumbent of the other of the said two benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the united benefice, and if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, both of the , said present benefices shall be full then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of them if the Incumbent for the time being of the other of the said present benefices shall with the consent of the Bishop of the said diocese of London be willing to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if either such Bishop or such Incumbent shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his benefice, and the then Incumbent of the other of the said two benefices shall be the first Lucumbent of the United Benefice, and, in any case, it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the said diocesé of London to admit to the United Benefice such first Incumbent (if an Incumbent for the time being of either of the said present benefices) without any form or fee of or for presentation, and he shall thereupon become the Incumbent of the United Benefice. Until the time of the union taking effect the said two benefices shall

remain separate, and the rights and liabilities in respect thereof and of the Incumbeuts of each of them shall remain unaffected.

"PART II.

"As to the parish church of the United Benefice and certain matters connected therewith or with the church of the Holy Trinity, Goughsquare; we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:-

"1. That upon the union taking effect the church of Saint Bride, Fleet-street, shall become, and thereafter continue to be the parish church

of the United Benefice.

2. That upon the union taking effect the Font, Communion Table, Sacramental Plate and other furniture now in the church of the Holy Trinity, Gough-square, shall, if not needed for the church of the United Benefice, and if the Bishop of London shall approve, be offered to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the church of the new benefice hereinafter mentioned, if such new benefice shall be within the diocese of London, and if accepted by the said Incumbent and Churchwardens, shall be transferred to the church of such new benefice, but if not so accepted, or if such new benefice shall not be within the diocese of London, they shall be transferred to any other church or chapel, or churches or chapels within the diocese of London which the Bishop may select.

"3. That upon the union taking effect if the tables of fees used in the two churches be alike in all particulars, the table of fees used in the church which will become the parish church of the United Benefice shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the table of fees for the united parishes, but if such tables of fees be not alike in all particulars, the same shall be of no authority, and a new table of fees shall be made by the proper authority for the use of the united parishes as if the same were one parish.

"4. That upon the final closing of the church of the Holy Trinity, Gough-square, the register books of baptisms, marriages, and burials of the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Gough-square, shall be transferred to the parish church of the

United Benefice.

"5. That upon the union taking effect the sum of two hundred and eleven pounds one shilling at present invested in the name of the Reverend William Cartlidge Heaton and applicable to the maintenance of the church of the Holy Trinity, Gough-square, shall be transferred to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be added by us to the aggregate fund, the formation of which is contemplated by clause three of Part V of this scheme.

"6. That if upon the union taking effect any of the present church servants of the church of the Holy Trinity, Gough-square, shall hold their respective offices and their services in consequence of the union shall no longer be required, they shall receive such gratuities (if any) in respect of their loss of employment as we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall assign to them out of the proceeds of the sale or sales hereinafter recommended and proposed;

"PART III. . .

. . . "As to the endowments and parsonage house of the United Benefice, we, the said Ecclesias tical Commissioners, further recommend and

propose:—
"1. That upon the union taking effect all the properties, revenues and income constituting the endowments of the vicarage of Saint Bride, Fleet-street with Bridewell and of the vicarage of the Holy Trinity, Gough-square, shall the

transferred to and annexed to the United Benefice. and the Incumbent of the said United Benefice and his successors shall be entitled to retain an annual sum of three hundred and sixty-seven pounds six shillings and eightpence out of the income arising from or constituting such endowments, and that the residue of such income shall form the endowment or part of the endowment of the new district which is hereinafter proposed to be constituted or created and such residue of the income of the United Benefice shall from time to time be paid by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice by half-yearly payments to the Minister or Incumbent of such new district or until such new district shall have been constituted or created to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to be accumulated by us towards the endowment of such new district

"2. That upon the union taking effect the parsonage house of the vicarage of Saint Bride, Fleet-street, with Bridewell shall become the parsonage house of the United Benefice.

" PART IV.

"As to a certain new district, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend

and propose --

"1. That an ecclesiastical district within the limits of the metropolis or within the vicinity of the metropolis as defined by the herembeforementioned Act of the sixty-first and sixty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter twenty-three (such district having then been, or being then, about to be formed, or legally constituted under some or one of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, authorizing the formation or constitution of such district) shall be selected by the Bishop of Eondon as the district for which a church shall be built out of the proceeds of the sale or sales hereinafter recommended.

"2. That the whole patronage of such new district and benefice shall be vested in the

Bishop of London for the time being.

"3. That the sum of one thousand five hundred pounds now held by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners towards the provision of a parsonage house for the said benefice of the Holy Trinity, Gough-square, together with any accumulations of interest thereon which may accrue after the date of the union taking effect shall be applied by us to the provision of a parsonage house for such new district and benefice in the manuer contemplated by clause three of Part V of this scheme.

"PART V.

"As to the church of the Holy Trinity, Goughsquare, and the site and appurtenances thereof, and as to the proceeds of any sale or sales of the materials, site, furniture, or fittings of the same church, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, recommend and propose:—

"1. That upon the union taking effect, the church of the Holy Trinity, Gough-square, be

taken down.

"2. That the materials and site of the said church, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use or enjoyment thereof, shall, together with any such furniture or fittings which shall not have been appropriated in the manner contemplated by clause two of Part II of this scheme, be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, such sale or disposal being made in all respects subject to the provisions contained in the seventeenth section of the said Act of the twenty-

third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and forty-two.

"3. That the net proceeds to arise from the sale or sales to be made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as aforesaid, of the site and materials and furniture or fittings of the said church shall form one aggregate fund, and shall after the transfer from it to the fund created under the twenty-second section of the said Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and forty-two, of a sum of one thousand pounds, and after the payment of the gratuities (if any) to be granted by us under clause six of Part II of this scheme, be applied for or towards the acquisition of a suitable site for, and the erection of a new church within the limits of the said new district, constituted or to be constituted as aforesaid, and as the church of such new district; and if the amount of such fund shall be sufficient, for or towards the acquisition of a suitable site for, and the erection of a parsonage house (or the purchase, enlargement, or alteration of any existing house suitable, with or without enlargement or alteration for a parsonage house) within the limits of the said new district constituted or to be constituted as aforesaid, and as the parsonage house of such new district, and the remainder (if any) of such aggregate fund shall be added to the said fund created under the twenty-second section of the said Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and forty-two.

" PART VI.

"Upon the subject of the patronage of the United Benefice we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, recommend and propose:—

"That the whole patronage of the United Benefice shall be vested in the Dean and Chapter of the collegiate church of Saint Peter, in

Westminster.

"Provided always that this scheme shall not take effect until the consents and approvals which by the seventeenth section of the said Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and forty-two, are made requisite to the sale of letting or appropriation under the powers conferred by that Act of the site of any church shall be obtained to the sale and appropriation hereby proposed of the church of the Holy Trinity, Gough-square, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof and to the mode of dealing with such site which is hereby proposed.

proposed.

"And provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space

of two calendar months.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the thirty-first day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for assigning the right of patronage of the district and new parish of East Crompton, in the county of Lancaster,

and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas by an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the thirteenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and published in the London Gazette on the fourteenth day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, the said district of East Crompton was constituted under the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act.

"And whereas the said district of East Crompton has, under the provisions of the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, now become a new parish of the character con-

templated by that Act.

"And whereas no assignment of the patronage of the said district and new parish of East Crompton was made by the said Order and no

such assignment had since been made.

"And whereas a capital sum of two thousand pounds sterling has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England by Abram Crompton, of High Crompton, Shaw, in the said county of Lancaster, Esquire, one of Your Majesty's Justices of the Peace, and by Mary Crompton, of New Bank, Shaw aforesaid, Spinster, towards the augmentation of the endowment of the said district and new parish of East Crompton and for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent thereof, and we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have in respect of the said sum agreed with the said Abram Crompton and Mary Crompton, and have undertaken to provide and pay by equal quarterly payments on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each and every year to the Vicar or Incumbent of the said district and new parish of East Crompton (being duly licensed thereto) the yearly sum of sixty pounds so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our

"And whereas the said capital sum of two thousand pounds sterling was so contributed and paid by the said Abrain Crompton and Mary Crompton as aforesaid upon the understanding (such arrangement appearing expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said district and new parish of East Crompton, and of the nomination of the Vicar or Incumbent thereto should be assigned to the Bishop of Manchester for the time being in the manner which is bereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the assignment of the patronage and right of nomination and presentation of and to ton which has been proposed to us by the said Abram Crompton and Mary Crompton as afore-

said may properly be effected.
"Now therefore we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district and new parish of East Cromp-ton and of the nomination of the Vicar or Incumbent thereto shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott, now Bishop of Manchester, and by his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, in the words and figures following, that is to say :-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Wilfrid, Lidget Green, Bradford, situate

within the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Great Horton, in the county of York, and in

the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Great Horton and of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint Andrew, Bradford, in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Great Horton and of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Bradford, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Wilfrid, Lidget Green, Bradford, situate as afore-

said.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Boyd, Bishop of Ripou, as such Bishop, with the consent of the Reverend John Robertson, Doctor in Divinity, Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Bradford, in the said county and diocese, and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Ripon, as the patron (in right of his vicarage) of the vicarage of the said new parish of Great Horton, and with the consents of the Reverend Robert Baker Girdlestone, an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Oxford, of Warleigh Lodge, Wimbledon, in the county of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders, of the Reverend Ernest Augustus Eardley-Wilmot, a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Wells, of Saint Jude's Vicarage, South Kensington, Clerk in Holy Orders, of the Reverend Joseph Edmund Rogers, of Walcot Rectory, Bath, Clerk in Holy Orders, of the Reverend John Charles Wright, a Canon of the Cathedral Church of Manchester, and of the Reverend Arthur Evelyn Barnes-Lawrence, an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Southwark, as the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Bradford (in testimony whereof they, the said consenting parties, have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Great Horton and of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Bradford, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Wilfrid, Lidget Green, Bradford, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Wilfrid, Lidget Green, Bradford.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Wilfrid, Lidget Green, Bradford, comprising:—

"(I.) All that portion of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Great Horton, in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon, which is bounded upon the west by the new

parish of Saint John, Clayton, upon the north partly by the new parish of Saint Peter, Allerton, and partly by the new parish of Saint Philip, Girlington, upon the east partly by the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint Andrew, Bradford, and partly by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Columba, Horton, Bradford, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Columba, Horton, Bradford, from the said new parish of Great Horton at the centre of the bridge which carries the Bradford and Thornton line of the Great Northern Railway across Tobylane, and extending thence first south-westward, then north-westward, and then westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of one mile and four chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Great Horton from the said new parish of Saint John, Clayton.

"(II.) And also all that contiguous portion of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Bradford, which is bounded upon the north by the said new parish of Saint Philip, Girlington, upon the west by the above described portion of the said new parish of Great Horton, upon the south-east partly by the said portion of the last-named new parish and partly by the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Columba, Horton, Bradford, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Columba, Horton, Bradford, from the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Bradford, at the junction of Legram's lane with Ingleby-road, and extending thence north-west-ward along the middle of Ingleby-road for a distance of twenty-six chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Bradford, from the said new parish of Saint Philip, Girlington.

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said diocese of Kipon.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fortyfifth and forty-sixth years of Her late
Majesty Queen Victoria's reign, intituled "The
Militia Act, 1882," it is, amongst other things,
enacted that, save as therein otherwise provided,
the Militia shall be trained and exercised for not
less than twenty-one days, and not more than
twenty-eight days, in every year, at such times

Whereas in Statute III, clause 8, of the Statutes of the said College it is enacted:— Every person elected to an Ordinary Fellowship shall before being admitted an actual Fellow undergo probation for one year from the day of his election inclusive and no longer and at the end of such year shall be admitted to an actual Fellowship if found fit to be a Fellow of the College in the judgment of the President and Fellows. From the sub-stations distributing mains will be laid for a continuous current direct supply at low pressure between the adjacent conductors of a three-wire system, and a continuous current supply between the outer conductors at medium pressure for special purposes, and a supply for traction at medium pressure.

The high pressure mains will be concentric. The external conductor will be connected with earth at the generating station, and insulated at all other parts.

The distributing mains will be insulated. The mains will be laid in troughing filled in solid with composition, or will be drawn into ducts or pipes, or will be armoured and laid in the ground.

A high pressure alternating current twophase supply to transformers, placed in some cases on consumers premises or in street boxes, but mainly in sub-stations.

From the transformers, where placed in street boxes or sub-stations, distributing mains will be laid for a single-phase alternating current supply at low pressure between either phase and the neutral conductor, and for supply for special purposes at medium pressure between phases.

The high pressure mains and the distributing mains will consist of two insulated conductors enclosed in an external conductor, or will consist of a pair of concentric cables. The mains will be laid in troughing filled in solid with composition, or will be drawn into ducts or pipes, or will be armoured and laid in the ground. The neutral conductors will be connected with earth at one point only. In the case of the high pressure mains they will be connected with earth at the generating station, and in the case of the distributing mains they will be connected with earth at the transformers or sub-stations.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES. (DATED 30TH JUNE 1906.)

.CARNARYONSHIRE (SHEEP-DIPPING); ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Déclaration of Skeep-Scab Compulsory Dipping
Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this

Order is hereby declared to be a Compulsory Dipping Area for the purposes of the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1906, hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order."

Period for Compulsory Dipping.

2. The dates between which all sheep in the Compulsory Dipping Area hereby declared are to be treated by the owner for sheep-scab by effective dipping under Article 2 of the principal Order are hereby fixed to be the first day of September and the fifteenth day of October in every year.

Modification of the Principal Order.

3. Article 2 (Compulsory Dipping of all Sheep in Compulsory Dipping Area) of the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1906, shall not as regards the Area described in the Schedule hereto apply to sheep for which an exemption has been obtained from the Local Authority of the District, which exemption shall only be granted for sheep which for the purposes of sale, exhibition or movement shall have been dipped under and in accordance with the provisions of the principal Order on! or since the fourth day of August in the current year, and have since such dipping been kept's separate from sheep not dipped in the manner prescribed by the principal Order. The sheep thus exempted shall until the expiration of the prescribed dipping period be kept separate from sheep which have not been dipped in the manner prescribed by the principal Order. Every exemption shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority and shall be subject to any conditions specified in the exemption. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries. This modification does not alter the effect of Part II of the principal Order (Regulation of Exposure and Movement of Sheep in Compulsory Dipping Areas).

Modification of Sheep-Dipping (Wales) Order of 1906.

4. From and after the commencement of this Order, the Sheep-Dipping (Wales) Order of 1906 shall cease to apply to the Area hereby declared to be a Compulsory Dipping Area.
