FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under section 66 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, extending to the classes of workshops mentioned below the prohibition in the said Act of the employment of young persons under the ages of 16 years and children without a certificate of fitness of the young person or child for employment:—File-cutting; carriage building; rope and twine making; brick and tile making; making of iron and steel cables and chains; making of nails, screws, and rivets; baking

bread, biscuits, or confectionery; fruit preserving; making, altering, ornamenting, finishing, or repairing of wearing apparel by the aid of treadle sewing machines.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 23rd instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £1,500,000, in part replacement of Bills falling due on the 29th instant.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 28th July, 1906, and will be payable at six months after date, viz.:—on the 28th January, 1907.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 24th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve o'clock, on Saturday, the 28th instant.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
