This College, I am desired to inform Your Majesty, was founded five-and-thirty years ago to bring the advantages of university education better within the reach of the people of the Tyneside and its neighbourhood. It owes its origin in part to the University of Durham, with which it is still associated, and in part to the North of England Institute of Mining and Mechanical Engineers, in whose premises it found a home during its early years. The buildings, whose completion is celebrated to-day, were commenced in the year 1887, and have been carried out at a cost of £150,000, including the original value of the land. The whole of

this sum has been the outcome of private liberality, among the chief donors being Mr. T. G. Gibson, by whom the foundation stone of the portion just completed was laid, the late Sir Isaac Lowthian Bell, to whom we owe the completion of the tower, and another benefactor who has desired that his name shall not be made known.

Your Majesty will not be surprised to learn that the character of the studies pursued in the College has been largely influenced by the particular genius of its locality; that they have always leaned less to the literary than to the scientific side; and even that much of our scientific studies has had for its especial object the application of science to Mining, Engineering, Agriculture and other practical pursuits. Our Engineering laboratories have been our especial pride; we are making every effort to bring the Electrical Engineering Department to as high a level as the rest, and the liberality of the shipbuilders and shipowners of the district is now being exercised in the establishment of a School of Naval Architecture befitting the importance of the North-East Coast as one of the chief seats in the world of the shipbuilding industry. Taking all departments together, the teaching staff of the College now numbers sixty-seven, and its day-students are five hundred and fifteen, exclusive of nearly a thousand more who are attending evening classes alone.

The building up of such an institution cannot be accomplished without the earnest thought of many minds and the devoted labour of many men. It would take me long, Your Majesty, to render justice to the distinguished teachers who have lectured within our walls, or to the public-minded citizens who have spent their time in its councils. Difficult as it would even be to select from among them, there is yet one man whom none will think it invidious in me to mention; whom all would regret my passing over in silence. From the earliest days of the institution everyone connected with it has been conscious of the devoted care and the far-sighted judgment given to its interests by Dr. Robert Spence Watson, a member of its original Council and happily present with us to-day.

The Governors view with satisfaction their College housed at last in its completed dwelling, served, as it always has been, by an able and zealous staff, and holding an assured place in the esteem and confidence of the people of the North country. Strengthened and encouraged, as they now are, by the gracious countenance Your Majesty has been pleased to bestow upon their work, they will go on with increased assurance, and trust that this auspicious day may be but the starting point of renewed endeavours on their part to render the College ever more and more of service to the welfare of Your Majesty's dominions.

That both Your Majesty and Your gracious and well-beloved Consort may enjoy long life, prosperity and happiness will always be our earnest prayer.

We the Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Members of the Governing Body of the Royal Infirmary for the Sick and Lame Poor of the city and county of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and the counties of Northumberland and Durham, desire humbly to approach Your Majesties with respectful and loyal attachment, and with grateful acknowledgment of Your so graciously honouring us with Your presence to-day, on this auspicious occasion, Your first visit to this ancient city since Your accession to the Throne, to open the new Infirmary, which has been erected to commemorate the Diamond Jubilee of the illustrious reign of our late revered Sovereign, Queen Victoria, of which Your Majesty laid the foundation stone on June 20th, 1900, in the name of Her Most Gracious Majesty, and which is to be known as the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

The Royal Infirmary, of which Your Majesty is the Patron and Benefactor, was founded in the year 1751, and after more than a century and a half of beneficent work, in future is to transfer its duty to this appropriate site, which has been conveyed to the Trustees of the Institution by the Corporation of the city, with the consent and approval of the Stewards and Wardens of the Companies of the borough as representing the Freemen. The record of humane services to the community having so developed concurrently with the increase in the population of the district, the old Infirmary was found inadequate for its present requirements.

The Royal Victoria Infirmary with the Nurses Home will be one of the most perfectly arranged hospitals in the Kingdom.

The amount expended on the new Infirmary, £300,000, has been provided in the following manner. The "Queen's Commemoration Fund," founded by Sir Riley Lord, when Mayor in 1896, £109,000 (of which amount £20,000 was contributed by the working men of the district), the late Mr. John Hall, £100,000, and Lord and Lady Armstrong, £100,000.

We venture to express the hope that the memorial will be regarded as a tribute and an indication of the love and sympathy which our late Sovereign evinced for the suffering poor, which was so distinctive a feature of Queen Victoria's beneficent reign.

We trust that Your Majesties will be graciously pleased to give permission for one of the wards to be called "King Edward VII. Ward" and another "Queen Alexandra Ward."

In acknowledging Your Majesties' gracious presence here to-day, and in expressing our gratitude for this Royal recognition, we desire to assure Your Majesties of our unceasing fidelity to the Throne, to bear testimony to Your

warm sympathy for the poor and Your solicitude for the benevolent care of those who are in suffering and distress, and to give expression to our feelings of thankfulness to Almighty God for His mercies and for the blessings He has bestowed on this nation, and we pray that the Divine Blessing may attend Your Majesties in all Your undertakings, and that the years to come may bring every happiness to Your Majesties and the Members of Your Royal House.

"It gives The Queen and Myself great pleasure to be here to-day to open this fine building, which bears the name of Queen Victoria, My beloved Mother.

"We well remember our previous visit to this ancient city to lay the foundation-stone of the Royal Victoria Infirmary, and it is a sincere gratification to Us to see the completion of this noble institution, which will be an abiding memorial of those munificent donors who have contributed so largely to its erection. It is a satisfaction to Us also to know that the workers have given so generously towards the endowment of the Infirmary, from which they will secure benefits which are of the greatest value in a city where there are many industries involving risk to life and health.

"It will ever be Our desire to do all that in Us lies to assist institutions of which this Infirmary is so fine an example, and to support every movement for the relief of the large class of persons suffering from disease who have not the means for securing proper medical attention. We trust that the springs of charity will always flow abundantly in the furtherance of the beneficent work of alleviating distress and allaying suffering, and it is our earnest hope that this splendidly equipped building, where the services of skilled doctors and efficient nurses will be at all times available, will for many years to come be the means of restoring to health those whose career of usefulness has been interrupted by accident or illness. The good work done by Dr. Thomas Oliver, Physician to this Infirmary, in connection with the diseases of occupations, is widely known and appreciated.

"The Queen and I most willingly agree to the proposal that two of the wards should be called the 'King Edward VII.' Ward, and the 'Queen Alexandra' Ward, respectively.

"I thank you heartily, on behalf of The Queen and Myself, for your good wishes for Our welfare, and I pray that the Divine Blessing may attend your efforts in the fight against suffering and disease."

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 3 (3) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that on the 24th July, 1906, he made Orders under section 36 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, (a) revoking the Orders of the 20th December, 1882; 15th April, 1884; and 27th April, 1887, and granting (subject to conditions) for a period of one year only, a special exception under that section for employment of women and young persons during the period from 9 A.M. to 9 P.M. in workrooms in which millinery work and dressmaking are carried on in connection with drapers' retail establishments within the city of Manchester and the borough of Salford, and in factories and workshops in which the manufacture of straw hats and bonnets is carried on, (b) repealing the Order of the 12th January, 1884, and re-enacting it with modifications for factories in the county of London in which letterpress bookbinding is carried on.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of the Isle of Ely) Order, 1906.

Dated 24th July, 1906.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of

the Administrative County of the Isle of Ely, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of the Isle of Ely) Order, 1906."

BIRDS.

Close Time varied.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be varied throughout the Administrative County of the Isle of Ely, so as to be between the 14th day of March and the 1st day of September in any year.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 15th day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of the Isle of Ely:—

Bullfinch, Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Owl (all species), Woodpecker (all species).

Duration of Order.

IV. This Order shall not remain in force after the expiration of three years from the date hereof.

Repeal of former Order.

V. The Order of the 8th December, 1882, is hereby repealed.

The Wild Birds Protection (North Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1906.

Dated 25th July, 1906.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the administrative County of the North Riding of Yorkshire, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (North Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1906.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of the North Riding of Yorkshire shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February in any year and the 1st day of September following, except with respect to the following birds:—

Mallard, Golden Plover, Snipe, Teal, Widgeon, Wild Duck, and Woodcock.

The time during which the killing or taking of the Birds so excepted is prohibited shall be

extended so as to be between the last day of February in any year and the 12th day of August following.

All Birds Protected during the whole of the Year within a certain Area.

III. During the period between the 11th day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following the killing or taking of all Wild Birds is prohibited on the sands and sea shore to the limit of low-water mark, within, and adjacent to, the Borough of Scarborough, from a point known as White Nab on the South to Scalby Beck on the North.

Repeal of former Order.

IV. The Order of the 3rd November, 1899, is hereby repealed.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 26TH JULY 1906.)

PETERSFIELD (MARKETS AND SALES) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them

in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Regulation of Exposure of Animals for sale within the Urban District of Petersfield.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order—

- (i.) No market or sale of animals shall be held in or upon any market-place, highway, sale-yard or other premises in the urban district of Petersfield, in the administrative county of Southampton, until after the expiration of fifteen days from the date on which the premises were previously so used unless the premises, or a part thereof sufficient to accommodate the number of animals usually exposed at such market or sale, are so paved with cement, concrete, asphalt, or other hard material impervious to water, as to permit of the same being effectually cleansed by washing; and
- (ii.) No animal shall be exposed for sale in or upon any part of a street or highway in the urban district of Petersfield unless such part of the street or highway is so paved with cement, concrete, asphalt, or other hard material impervious to water, as to permit of the same being effectually cleansed by washing.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3. If any animal is exposed for sale, or any market or sale of animals is held, in contravention of this Order, the person exposing the animal or holding the market or sale, and the owner or consignee of each animal exposed thereat, and the person exposing the same thereat, and the purchaser thereat of any animal, such last-mentioned person or such purchaser knowing the market or sale to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

4. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

- “Animals” means cattle, sheep, and goats, and all other ruminating animals, and swine;
- “Person” includes any body of persons corporate or unincorporate;
- “The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894;
- Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and seven.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the PETERSFIELD (MARKETS AND SALES) ORDER OF 1906.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF

KINGSTON - UPON - HULL (SWINE-
FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

PART I.

MOVEMENT INTO CITY OF KINGSTON-UPON-HULL.

Restriction on Movement into City of Kingston-upon-Hull.

1. Swine shall not be moved into the city of Kingston-upon-Hull except in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

Movement into City of Kingston-upon-Hull for Immediate Slaughter.

2. Swine may be moved to a bacon factory, slaughterhouse, market, or saleyard in the city of Kingston-upon-Hull, if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city, and subject to the following conditions, namely:

- (i.) The swine shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long;
- (ii.) The swine shall, so far as is practicable, be moved by railway, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked in manner prescribed by this Article;
- (iii.) Swine moved under this Article to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered;
- (iv.) The licence shall be in force for five days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the licence is granted, the number of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place from which, and the place and premises to which, the swine are to be moved.

Provision for Movement into City of Kingston-upon-Hull, and Subsequent Detention.

3.—(1.) Swine may be moved to premises in the city of Kingston-upon-Hull if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of that city.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his

agent, authorised in writing for this purpose; shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration, countersigned as hereinafter provided, to the effect:

- (i.) That he is the owner of [or the agent authorised in writing for this purpose by the owner of] the swine;
- (ii.) That the swine have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the date of the declaration;
- (iii.) That to the best of his knowledge and belief the swine are not affected with swine-fever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever; and
- (iv.) That the swine are not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and that the movement of the swine is not prohibited by notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(3.) The declaration as to swine to be moved shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the District where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(5.) The licence shall be in force for five days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the licence is granted, the number of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place from which, and the place and premises to which, the swine are to be moved.

(6.) Swine moved with a licence under this Article shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination, except as hereinafter provided in the case of markets, fairs, sales, and exhibitions. The swine, while detained under this Article, shall be kept separate from all other swine. This provision does not restrict the removal of any carcase of a pig.

PART II.

MOVEMENT OUT OF CITY OF KINGSTON-UPON-HULL.

Restriction on Movement out of City of Kingston-upon-Hull.

4.—(1.) Swine shall not be moved out of the city of Kingston-upon-Hull except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse and only if accompanied by a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of that city and on the following conditions (namely):

- (i.) The swine shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (ii.) The swine shall be moved, by railway so far as is practicable, to the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the Licence, and

during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked in manner prescribed by this Article.

- (iii.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than five days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted and the name or description of the bacon factory or slaughterhouse to which the swine are to be moved.
- (iv.) The Local Authority of the city of Kingston-upon-Hull shall cause a copy of the Licence to be sent forthwith to the Local Authority of the District into which the swine are to be moved.
- (v.) The swine shall after their arrival at the bacon factory or slaughterhouse be there detained until they are slaughtered.
- (vi.) The Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate shall take such steps as are necessary to insure that the swine are moved to the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the Licence and are duly slaughtered there.

(2.) Swine while being moved under this Article shall not, unless otherwise hereafter expressly provided by Order of the Board, be subject to any restriction on movement of swine imposed by any other Order of the Board or by regulations made by the Local Authority of any District.

(3.) The restrictions on movement imposed by this Article shall not apply to the movement of swine from an exhibition in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

PART III.

REGULATION OF MARKETS, FAIRS, SALES AND EXHIBITIONS.

Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine.

5. No market, fair, sale, or exhibition of swine, shall be held in the city of Kingston-upon-Hull except as expressly authorised by this Order, or under the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904.

Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

6.—(1.) An exhibition of swine may be held in the city of Kingston-upon-Hull with a Licence of the Local Authority, on such conditions, if any, as they think expedient.

(2.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, by such Licence authorise the sale at such exhibition of the swine exhibited thereat on such conditions, if any, as they think expedient.

(3.) The Local Authority shall not grant a Licence for an exhibition under this Article unless they are satisfied that the proposed exhibition is a bonâ fide agricultural show, and that the swine are to be exhibited thereat for competition.

(4.) Swine which have been moved into the city and been exhibited under this Article may be moved from the exhibition to any premises, whether within or outside the city, with a Licence of the Local Authority, on such conditions, if any, as are inserted in the Licence.

Sale of Swine with Licence of Local Authority in cases where the Swine have been on Premises for 28 days.

7.—(1.) A sale of swine may be held in the city of Kingston-upon-Hull with a Licence of the Local Authority in any case where the sale is held in accordance with the following conditions (namely)—

- (i.) that the sale is held on a farm or premises not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place ;
- (ii.) that no pig on the said farm or premises is affected with swine-fever ; and
- (iii.) that for a period of twenty-eight days immediately before the day on which the sale is held no pig has been brought on to the said farm or premises, and that no pig on the said farm or premises has during that period in any way been exposed to the infection of swine-fever.

(2.) A Licence of the Local Authority for a sale under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall give notice of the conditions contained in this Article by specifying the same as conditions on which the Licence is granted, and may impose such further conditions, if any, as the Local Authority think expedient, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the sale, and shall also specify the farm or premises where and the date when the sale is to be held, and the Local Authority may at any time revoke any such Licence.

(3.) The Licence for a sale under this Article or a copy of such Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such sale by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the farm or premises where such sale is held.

Markets Fairs and Sales of Fat Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

8.—(1.) A market, fair, or sale of swine may be held in the city of Kingston-upon-Hull with a Licence of the Local Authority ; Provided that the swine exposed at a market, fair, or sale authorised under this Article shall be moved from the market, fair, or sale only if accompanied by a Licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority authorising the movement and to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence, and subject to all the conditions of Article 2 of this Order as if the same were inserted in this Article.

(2.) A Licence of the Local Authority for a market, fair, or sale under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall give notice of the conditions contained in this Article by specifying the same as conditions on which the Licence is granted, and may impose such further conditions, if any, as the Local Authority think expedient, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market, fair, or sale (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market, fair, or sale is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets, fairs, or sales on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding three months, but the Licence may be renewed from time to time, and

shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to insure publicity for the same. The Local Authority may at any time revoke any such Licence.

(3.) The Licence for a market, fair, or sale under this Article or a copy of such Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market, fair, or sale by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market, fair-ground, or sale-yard where such market, fair, or sale is held.

(4.) The Local Authority shall grant a Licence for a market, fair, or sale under this Article only if they are satisfied that the market, fair, or sale is to be held in a market, fair-ground, or sale-yard which is capable of being thoroughly cleansed and disinfected.

Copies of Licences for Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions to be sent to Board.

9. The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market, fair, sale, or exhibition under this Order.

Revocation by Board of Licences.

10. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence of the Local Authority for a market, fair, sale, or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market, fair, sale, or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Attendance at Markets Fairs and Sales.

11. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market or fair licensed under this Order and at every sale licensed under Article 8 of this Order, and a fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local Authority to attend at every market, fair, or sale so licensed, for the purpose of granting thereat on behalf of the Local Authority such Movement Licences as are required under this Order.

PART IV.

GENERAL.

Provision for Movement through City of Kingston-upon-Hull.

12. For the purposes of this Order, swine shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of the city of Kingston-upon-Hull in any case where they are moved through that city by railway from a place outside that city to another place outside that city without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked within that city.

Limitation on Granting of Movement Licences.

13. A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the swine to be moved or by his agent, or by the owner or consignee or other person selling the swine, or exposing the swine for sale, or by the purchaser thereof or by his agent, or by the auctioneer or other person conducting or licensed to hold the market, fair, or sale at which the swine are exposed, or by the occupier of the premises from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of the Local Authority.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

14.—(1.) Every person in charge of a pig or thing being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Movement Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

15.—(1.) If a market, fair, sale, or exhibition is held in contravention of this Order or of the conditions of a Licence thereunder, the person licensed to hold or holding the same, and the occupier of the place or farm or premises where the market, fair, sale, or exhibition is held, and the owner or consignee of each pig exposed or exhibited thereat, and the person exposing or exhibiting the same thereat, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale or exhibition, and the person, if any, taking entrance-money or other payment for admission thereto, and the purchaser thereof of any pig, such last-mentioned person or such purchaser knowing the market, fair, sale, or exhibition to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person exposing or exhibiting the same, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the purchaser thereof, and the person licensed to hold or holding the market, fair, sale, or exhibition, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale or exhibition, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

16. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

- “Bacon factory” means premises in which the business of a curer of bacon is carried on :
- “Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered :
- “Swine-Fever Infected Place” means a place for the time being declared to be infected with swine-fever under any Order of the Board :
- “Farm” or “premises” includes two or more adjoining farms or premises in the same occupation :
- “Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector :
- “The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries :
- “The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Provision as to Existing Orders.

17.—(1.) From and after the commencement of this Order the Area to which the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 were applied by the Order

described in the Schedule hereto shall cease to comprise the city of Kingston-upon-Hull, and the restrictions on movement imposed by the Yorkshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906 shall cease to apply to the movement of swine from that city.

(2.) The powers of the Local Authority of the city of Kingston-upon-Hull to make regulations under the Swine-Fever Order of 1894, as to movement, exposure, or sale of swine, shall be suspended during the operation of this Order.

Commencement.

18. This Order shall come into operation on the eighth day of August, nineteen hundred and six.

Short Title.

19. This Order may be cited as the KINGSTON-UPON-HULL (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.
